

FIRST AMENDMENT
TO THE FUNDING AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
INLAND EMPIRE HEALTH PLAN
AND
SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH

WHEREAS, Inland Empire Health Plan (“IEHP”), a local public entity of the State of California and San Bernardino County Department of Public Health (“RECIPIENT”), agree to amend the Funding Agreement (the “Agreement”) between them dated June 10, 2025.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- A. Section 2 (PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE) is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following.

The term of this Agreement shall become effective as of the date of last signature (“Effective Date”), and shall continue in effect until November 1, 2026 unless terminated as specified in Section 7 (TERMINATION PROVISIONS).

- B. Addition of Section 22. The Agreement is hereby amended to add new Section 22, entitled “Public Statements, Publicity, Publications, Work Product, and Intellectual Property,” which shall read in full as follows:

22. PUBLIC STATEMENTS, PUBLICITY, PUBLICATIONS, WORK PRODUCT, AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY.

a. Without IEHP’s prior written consent, RECIPIENT shall not issue any press release, public announcement, marketing, promotional, or social media communication; publish, present, disseminate, or otherwise publicly disclose any information concerning this Agreement, the parties’ relationship, the Services, any data shared or compiled under this Agreement, analyses, results, or outcomes generated hereunder (including pilot, proof-of-concept, or evaluation results); or use or display IEHP’s name, trade name, trademarks, service marks, logos, or other identifiers, or refer to IEHP as a client, partner, or reference. Any permitted disclosure must be submitted to IEHP for review and written approval at least 30 days in advance, and IEHP may require edits, redactions, or disclaimers as a condition of approval. If RECIPIENT is legally required to make a public disclosure, it shall, to the extent lawful, provide IEHP with prompt prior written notice and cooperate to limit the disclosure and obtain confidential treatment; RECIPIENT may disclose on a need-to-know basis to its affiliates, professional

advisors, and potential investors, lenders, or acquirers under written confidentiality obligations no less protective than those herein. This Section supplements the parties' confidentiality obligations, creates no license or publicity rights, and survives expiration or termination; IEHP is entitled to injunctive relief for any actual or threatened breach.

b. All work product, including all reports, findings, data, and documents compiled, assembled, or shared by RECIPIENT under this Agreement on behalf of IEHP shall be IEHP's property and shall be transmitted to IEHP upon termination, if applicable. To the extent any RECIPIENT Information—meaning information to which RECIPIENT has or may obtain rights, including methods, methodologies, procedures, processes, know-how, techniques (including function, process, system, and data models), templates, data, documentation, and proprietary information and processes—is contained in any data or information shared or compiled under this Agreement, RECIPIENT grants IEHP a paid-up, royalty-free, nonexclusive, perpetual license to use and reproduce such RECIPIENT Information solely for IEHP's internal business operations. RECIPIENT shall not make any public statement, disclosure, or publication regarding any data, information, or work product shared or compiled under this Agreement without IEHP's prior written consent, and nothing herein grants RECIPIENT any license, right, or interest in IEHP's name, trademarks, or other intellectual property. The obligations in this Section survive expiration or termination.

- C. Attachment A (SCOPE OF SERVICES) is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with Attachment A (SCOPE OF SERVICES), dated 04/21/2026, added as attached hereto.
- D. Notwithstanding the date of execution, unless otherwise referenced, this First Amendment shall be effective date of last signature.
- E. Except as amended hereby, all of the other terms and conditions of the Agreement are to remain in full force and effect.
- F. RECIPIENT certifies that the individual signing below has the authority to execute this Amendment on behalf of RECIPIENT and may legally bind RECIPIENT to the terms and conditions of this Amendment, and any attachments hereto.

ATTACHMENT A

SCOPE OF SERVICES

SCOPE

RECIPIENT shall use IEHP funding and leverage funding from other managed care plans operating in San Bernardino County to complete the following activities for the PROJECT:

- A. Community Engagement
 - a. CHA/CHIP Meeting Support to provide CHIP progress updates regarding input obtained from the community during the CHA. Community engagement meetings will allow the Local Health Jurisdiction (LHJ) to collect feedback regarding the CHIP implementation. Childcare, gas cards, and food will help to remove barriers to community participation.
 - i. Identify priority population communities.
 - ii. Conduct meetings in each of the priority communities by June 30, 2026.
 - iii. Meetings shall include a Facilitator/Speaker Honorariums: Emcee/guest speakers for CHIP community engagement.
- B. Support Staff:
 - a. RECIPIENT will onboard the following staff to support CHIP activities:
 - i. 2.0 FTE Health Educator Specialist (HES) II will develop and coordinate ongoing stakeholder relationship management with organizational leads of CHIP strategies and activities. They will serve as leads of HES Is to conduct community engagement in support of CHIP strategies and activities.
 - ii. 3.0 FTE Health Educator Specialist I will serve as liaisons between the LHJ and organizational partners implementing CHIP strategies and activities. They will develop outreach materials, social media contents, and conduct community engagement in support of the CHIP.
 - iii. 1.0 FTE Office Specialist will support administrative/clerical needs for CHIP development and implementation.
- C. Communication
 - a. Promotion of CHIP community engagement meetings which includes managing Community Vital Signs (CVS) communication campaigns, Eventbrite registration, and social media event and meeting promotion.
- D. Consultant/Professional Services
 - a. Conduct training on the National Association of County and City Health Officials' Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) framework for communities to assess their most pressing population health issues and align resources and stakeholders across sectors to achieve collective impact on positive health outcomes through strategic action.
 - b. Complete a CHIP implementation evaluation and progress report, including recommendations for improvement and effectively implementing the MAPP framework to address the CHIPs priority areas and accomplish its goals and objectives.
 - c. Develop a population health data platform that will ingest and visualize data from multiple secondary and primary sources to inform CHIP implementation strategies, track progress of health indicators associated with the CHIP, inform future community health assessments, and link users to policies and evidence-based practices for specific issues to guide community health improvement efforts.

FUNDING

IEHP shall provide San Bernardino County Department of Public Health with \$300,000.00 to support the interventions identified during the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) process.

SUCCESS MEASURES

1. By June 30, 2026, RECIPIENT will have completed the following:
 - Identify priority populations;
 - Onboard support staff identified under Section B of Attachment A; and
 - Conduct first round of community engagement meetings in each of the priority communities
2. By December 31, 2025, RECIPIENT will have a fully executed agreement with consultant to support the development of a population health data platform.
3. By November 1, 2026, RECIPIENT will have completed the following:
 - Collective impact/MAPP training; and
 - Evaluation and recommendations report.
