

NOTICE OF VACANCY

BOARD OF DIRECTORS – INLAND EMPIRE RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT

There will be no election on November 5, 2024 for the Board of Directors of the Inland Empire Resource Conservation District. Instead, the Board of Supervisors of San Bernardino County will appoint three (3) members to the Board of Directors for a term of approximately four (4) years ending on the last Friday in November, 2028. Vacancies are for the positions held by Nancy Humenik Sappington, James Earsom, and Lorien Sanders.

The Board of Supervisors of San Bernardino County, following consultation with the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, will make appointments in lieu of election.

QUALIFICATIONS: A member of the Board of Directors of a resource conservation district must be a registered voter in the state, and (1) reside within the district comprised wholly or partially of the cities or communities of Banning, Beaumont, Big Bear, Cabazon, Calimesa, Cherry Valley, Chino, Fontana, Highland, Loma Linda, Mentone, Montclair, Oak Glen, Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, Redlands, Rialto, San Bernardino, Yucaipa, Riverside and surrounding areas extending northward into the San Bernardino National Forest in the Cajon Pass area, and either own real property in the district or have served for two years or more as an associate director providing advisory or other assistance to the district directors, or (2) be a designated agent of a resident landowner within the district. A member should have a demonstrated interest in soil and water conservation.
