*** b. Project Description:**

This Project will deploy infrastructure for low- and zero-emission fueling at 16 locations throughout San Bernardino County, which will achieve emissions reductions and support climate mitigation efforts. Additionally, as renewable energy becomes more accessible and affordable, this infrastructure will enhance the County's resilience to climate impacts. By locating half of the charging stations in Justice40 communities, the Project ensures that historically disadvantaged groups are meaningfully incorporated in the transition to renewable and green energy.

Moreover, reducing emissions and increasing access to cleaner fueling options will benefit environmental justice communities by curbing overall pollution levels, including harmful PM 2.5 particles. This initiative aims to mitigate health issues such as asthma, stress, and cardiovascular diseases, which disproportionately affect historically disadvantaged populations.

Abstract

The San Bernardino County Electric Vehicle Charging Initiative has strategically selected 16 charging sites across the County to enhance EV infrastructure. These sites feature a mix of Level 2 and DC Fast Charging Ports, chosen based on projected energy needs and existing infrastructure, and are situated in off-street parking lots to prioritize safety by minimizing interactions between pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists.

A key priority of the initiative is to ensure equitable access to EV charging infrastructure. The selection process employed various criteria including accessibility, proximity to multimodal transportation, and location within California-Designated Environmental Justice Communities. As a result, 8 of the 16 sites are within or near Justice40 census tracts, ensuring that 43% of the investment directly benefits these communities. Many sites are also located in High-Quality Transit Areas, facilitating convenient access to public transportation.

The initiative supports San Bernardino County's climate mitigation and adaptation goals by reducing greenhouse gas emissions from the transportation sector and enhancing resilience to climate impacts. Additionally, by increasing access to clean fueling options, the project aims to improve air quality and mitigate health issues in environmental justice communities, addressing longstanding disparities in pollution exposure and health outcomes.
