

Ordinance No. SD 26-____

An ordinance of the Big Bear Valley Recreation and Park District to repeal Ordinance No. SD 25-01 and to establish various recreation and park activity fees for Fiscal Years 2026-27, 2027-28 and 2028-29.

The Board of Directors of the Big Bear Valley Recreation and Park District, San Bernardino County, State of California, ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Effective July 1, 2026, Ordinance No. SD 25-01 is repealed in its entirety.

In the event of a disaster, or other 15 good cause shown to serve a public purpose, the Director of Department 16 of Public Works may defer payment of, waive, or refund any fee set forth 17 in this chapter provided all of the following conditions are met:			
18 a) Exigent conditions exist whereby obtaining Board approval of the fee 19 waiver/refund/deferral would not be immediately feasible; and			
20 b) The Director of Department of Public Works receives concurrence from 21 the County Chief Executive Officer.
