

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-10

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF SAN BERNARDINO, CALIFORNIA, CONSIDERING ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT SCH#2012061058 FOR THE RANCHERO CORRIDOR WIDENING PROJECT; AND ADOPTING A MITIGATION MONITORING REPORTING PROGRAM AND FINDINGS OF FACT AND STATEMENT OF OVERRIDING CONSIDERATIONS.

On Tuesday, February 11, 2020, on motion of Supervisor Lovingood, duly seconded by Supervisor Gonzales and carried, the following resolution is adopted by the Board of Supervisors of San Bernardino County, State of California.

WHEREAS, the Rancho Corridor Widening Project consists of widening approximately five miles of Rancho Road between the Rancho Underpass and the Rancho Road/Interstate 15 Interchange; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Res. Code §21000 et seq.) and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 CCR § 15000 et seq.), the City Council of the City of Hesperia is the lead agency for the project as the public agency with general governmental powers and the County of San Bernardino is a responsible agency; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hesperia, acting as the Lead Agency, has prepared and certified EIR SCH#2012061058 for this project.

WHEREAS, a responsible agency is bound by the lead agency's determination regarding the adequacy of the EIR. Significant environmental effects of the project have been adequately evaluated and are sufficiently detailed in the Final EIR and Findings of Fact and Statement of Overriding Considerations (FFSOC); and

WHEREAS, environmental impacts which the County finds are less than significant and do not require mitigation are described in the Final EIR and FFSOC; and

WHEREAS, environmental impacts which are identified as significant, but the County finds can be mitigated to a level of less than significant through feasible mitigation measures are described in the Final EIR and FFSOC; and

WHEREAS, environmental impacts which are identified as significant, but the County finds cannot be fully mitigated to a level of less than significant despite the implementation of feasible mitigation measures, are described in the Final EIR and FFSOC; and

WHEREAS, the findings and conclusions made by the County pursuant to this Resolution are based upon the oral and written evidence presented as a whole and not based solely on the information provided in this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, all legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Resolution have occurred.
