IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

AMENDMENT NO. 3

It is hereby agreed to amend Contract No. 22-11, as follows:

SECTION V. FISCAL PROVISIONS

Paragraph A is amended to read as follows:

The maximum amount of payment under this contract shall not exceed \$963,275 of which \$866,947.50 may be federally funded, and \$96,327.50 may be state funded, both shall be subject to the availability of funds to the County. The consideration to be paid to Contractor, as provided herein, shall be full payment for all Contractor's services and expenses incurred in the performance hereof, including travel and per diem.

SECTION VIII. TERM

Section VIII is amended to read as follows:

This Contract is effective as of January 1, 2021, and is extended from the original expiration date of June 30, 2024, to expire on December 31, 2025, but may be terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions of Section IX of this Contract.

ATTACHMENT D. COST

Attachment D. Cost FY 2023-2024 is hereby replaced in its entirety with Attachment D. Cost FY 2024-2025 as attached hereto and hereby incorporated herein.

The CA Teaching Pyramid Framework:
Supporting Social-Emotional Competence and
Preventing Challenging Behavior in Young Children
Continuing Professional Development on the CA Teaching Pyramid
July 1, 2024- June 30, 2025

The **National Center for Pyramid Model Innovations** formerly operating as the **Center on the Social and Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (CSEFEL)** is a national center focused on strengthening the capacity of child care, Head Start, and special education programs to improve the social and emotional outcomes of young children. The Center developed and disseminated the *Teaching Pyramid*, a systematic framework of evidence-based, user-friendly practices to help early childhood educators meet the needs of the growing number of children with challenging behaviors and mental health concerns. The *Teaching Pyramid* approach incorporates early childhood Positive Behavior Support to promote healthy social-emotional development, support children's appropriate behavior, prevent behavior that is challenging, and address behavior issues.

Under the California Collaborative on Social Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (CA CSEFEL), WestEd, San Marcos Office (WestEd) has adapted the materials specifically for use in California and provides training and technical assistance on this comprehensive, program-wide *CA Teaching Pyramid* approach to districts and organizations. Over the past five years, WestEd has supported comprehensive professional development on the CA Teaching Pyramid for the County of San Bernardino Preschool Services Department. Many of the activities focused on building internal capacity for training and coaching while supporting leadership activities. This proposal is intended to support sustainability for continued program implementation.

1. Continued Work with the Leadership Team

- Facilitate regular meetings for sustainability and scale-up of CA Teaching Pyramid work in the program.
- Infuse and align CA Teaching Pyramid practices into existing policies and procedures.
- Guide implementation of professional development related to the CA Teaching Pyramid for new cohorts as well as previously trained staff.
- Document implementation of the CA Teaching Pyramid across the agency.
- Train Leadership Team Facilitators.
- Training for managers, administrators, and site supervisors on Champion Check-in, Spotlight, and use of Inventory of Practice for sustainability and ongoing support to staff.

2. Training Activities

- Eight half-day Going Deeper (Follow-up) Training for previously trained cohorts.
 - The leadership team will select 4 topics for training based on the options available from WestEd.
 - Each topic will be offered twice to accommodate full staff participation.
 - Masters for duplicating the handout materials will be provided.
- Provide two professional development trainings for home-based program staff.
- Pilot the CA Teaching Pyramid for Families in one region or site by selecting staff to participate in a Training of Facilitators for CA Teaching Pyramid for Families.

3. Support for Authorized Coaches and Trainers

- Staff who have been authorized as coaches on the CA Teaching Pyramid will participate in one half-day reflective practice cadre each semester (fall 24, spring 25, and fall 25) facilitated by a WestEd Mentor Coach.
- Staff who have been authorized as trainers on the CA Teaching Pyramid will participate in one half-day reflective practice cadre each semester (fall 24, spring 25, and fall 25) facilitated by a WestEd Mentor Trainer.

Cost

The cost estimate for these activities is outlined below. This would be paid as a fixed fee in four installments: one installment per quarter. Materials, if needed, will be ordered separately. *Please note: Prices are subject to change if there are modifications in the scope of work or if the services are not completed during the 2024-2025 year.*
