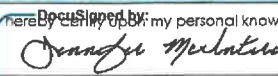
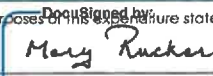

				The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department will use FY24 HSGP funds to sustain system software and configuration services for a countywide regional data exchange project used for conducting useful data in domestic violent extremist incident prevention (formerly the COPLINK system). This system allows the integration of data pertaining to domestic terrorist incidents across agencies throughout the region for terrorist prevention. Where communication sharing regarding potential domestic terrorist activities is a weakness, the data collected in the system strengthens coordination and communication with other participating agencies, including the DOJ and sources in bordering states, to reduce threats within Western regions. Providing these services to participating agencies reduces costs for those agencies who may otherwise not have funds for such a system. Utilizing funds granted to the County for a shared project strengthens coordination with smaller agencies within the region and with remote agencies who would otherwise not have the financial ability to better guard themselves against possible terror threats.
