The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) has been allocated \$2,253,877 in Federal Grant Funds for the 2023 Paul Coverdell Forensic Sciences improvement Program Grant to Improve the quality, timeliness, and credibility of forensic science and medical examiner services. The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department (Department) is requesting \$101,757 to supplement the Scientific Investigation Division's operational training budget. The grant will fund training in the following units: 1. General Criminalistics; 2. Firearms; 3. National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN); 4. Trace Evidence; 5. Blood Alcohol; 6. Controlled Substances/Drug Chemistry; 7. Crime Scene Investigations; and 8. Latent Prints (CAL ID).

The Board of Supervisors (Board) has approved and authorized submission of the grant application on 12/19/2023 (Item 94). The Chairman of the Board has designated the CEO, Luther Snoke, to execute the grant application documents and any subsequent non-substantive amendments necessary on behalf of the County.

The Department is submitting the Delegated Authority – Document Review Form for your review and approval. The CEO's signature is required on the Grant Award Face Sheet, the Certification of Assurances of Compliance and the Subrecipient Grant Management Assessment. Please note that wet signatures are not a requirement.

### 11. Requirement for Data on Performance and Effectiveness under the Grant Subaward

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) must collect and maintain data that measure the performance and effectiveness of work under this Grant Subaward. Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) must provide data (within the required timeframes) specified by OJP, Cal OES, and other applicable written guidance. Data collection supports compliance with the Government Performance and Results Act (GPRA) and the GPRA Modernization Act of 2010, and other applicable laws.

#### 12. Determination of Suitability to Interact with Participating Minors

This condition applies to the Grant Subaward (if it is indicated) when some or all of the activities to be carried out under the Grant Subaward (whether by Subrecipients, or Second-Tier Subrecipients) is to benefit a set of individuals under 18 years of age.

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) must make determinations of suitability before certain individuals may interact with participating minors. This requirement applies regardless of an individual's employment status.

### 14. Encouragement of Policies to Ban Text Messaging while Driving

Pursuant to Executive Order 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," 74 Fed. Reg. 51225 (October 1, 2009), the DOJ encourages Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) to adopt and enforce policies banning employees from text messaging while driving any vehicle during the course of performing work funded by this Grant Subaward, and to establish workplace safety policies and conduct education, awareness, and other outreach to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers.

# 15. Compliance with General Appropriations-law Restrictions on the use of Federal Funds

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) must comply with all applicable restrictions on the use of federal funds set out in federal appropriations statutes. #### 16. Potential Imposition of Additional Requirements

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) agree to comply with any additional requirements that may be imposed by the DOJ awarding agency (OJP or OVW, as appropriate) during the period of performance for this Grant Subaward, if Subrecipients are designated as "high-risk" for purposes of the DOJ high-risk grantee list.

#### 17. Employment Eligibility Verification for Hiring under the Grant Subaward

- a. Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) must:

#### b. Monitoring

Subrecipients' monitoring responsibilities include monitoring Second-Tier Subrecipients' compliance with this condition.

#### c. Allowable costs

To the extent that such costs are not reimbursed under any other federal program, Grant Subaward funds may be obligated for the reasonable, necessary, and allocable costs (if any) of actions designed to ensure compliance with this condition.

#### d. Rules of construction

1) Staff involved in the hiring process

For purposes of this condition, persons "who are or will be involved in activities under this Grant Subaward" specifically includes (without limitation) any and all Subrecipient officials or other staff who are or will be involved in the hiring process with respect to a position that is or will be funded (in whole or in part) with Grant Subaward funds.

2) Employment eligibility confirmation with E-Verity

For purposes of satisfying the requirement of this condition regarding verification of employment eligibility, Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) may choose to participate in, and use, E-Verify (www.e-verify.gov), provided an appropriate person authorized to act on behalf of the Subrecipient (and any Second-Tier Subrecipient) uses E-Verify (and follows the proper E-Verify procedures, including in the event of a "Tentative Nonconfirmation" or a "Final Nonconfirmation") to confirm employment eligibility for each hiring for a position in the United States that is or will be funded (in whole or in part) with Grant Subaward funds.

- 3) "United States" specifically includes the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the Virgin Islands of the United States, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.
- 4) Nothing in this condition shall be understood to authorize or require Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients), or any person or other entity, to violate any federal law, including any applicable civil rights or nondiscrimination law.
- 5) Nothing in this condition, including in paragraph 4.B., shall be understood to relieve Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) or any person or other entity, of any obligation otherwise imposed by law, including 8 U.S.C. 1324a(a)(1).

# 18. Restrictions and Certifications Regarding Non-disclosure Agreements and Related Matters

No Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) under this Grant Subaward, or entity that receives a procurement contract or subcontract with any funds under this Grant Subaward, may require any employee or contractor to sign an internal confidentiality agreement or statement that prohibits or otherwise restricts, or purports to prohibit or restrict, the reporting (in accordance with law) of waste, fraud, or abuse to an investigative or law enforcement representative of a federal department or agency authorized to receive such information.

The foregoing is not intended, and shall not be understood by the agency making this Grant Subaward, to contravene requirements applicable to Standard Form 312 (which relates to classified information), Form 4414 (which relates to sensitive compartmented information), or any other form issued by a federal department or agency governing the nondisclosure of classified information.

- a. In accepting this Grant Subaward, Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients):
  - Represent that they neither require, nor have required, internal confidentiality agreements or statements from employees or contractors that currently prohibit or otherwise currently restrict (or purport to prohibit or restrict) employees or contractors from reporting waste, fraud, or abuse as described above; and
  - Certify that, if they learn, or are notified, that they have, or have been, requiring their employees or contractors to execute agreements or statements that prohibit or otherwise restrict (or purport to prohibit or restrict), reporting of

waste, fraud, or abuse as described above, they will immediately stop any further obligations of Grant Subaward funds, will provide prompt written notification to Cal OES, and will resume (or permit resumption of) such obligations only if expressly authorized to do so by Cal OES.

- b. If Subrecipients are authorized under this award to make Second-Tier Subawards, procurement contracts, or both:
  - 1) Subrecipients represent that:

# 19. Reclassification of Various Statutory Provisions to a New Title 34 of the United States Code

On September 1, 2017, various statutory provisions previously codified elsewhere in the U.S. Code were editorially reclassified (that is, moved and renumbered) to a new Title 34, entitled "Crime Control and Law Enforcement." The reclassification encompassed a number of statutory provisions pertinent to OJP awards (that is, OJP grants and cooperative agreements), including many provisions previously codified in Title 42 of the U.S. Code.

#### 21. All Grant Subawards must have Specific Federal Authorization

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) must comply with all applicable requirements for authorization of any Grant Subaward. This condition applies to agreements that — for purposes of federal grants administrative requirements — OJP considers a "Grant Subaward" (and therefore does not consider a procurement "contract").

# 22. Requirements Related to System for Award Management and Universal Identifier Requirements

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) must promptly refer to Cal OES any credible evidence that a principal, employee, agent, Subrecipient, contractor, subcontractor, or other person has, in connection with funds under this Grant Subaward— (1) submitted a claim that violates the False Claims Act; or (2) committed a criminal or civil violation of laws pertaining to fraud, conflict of interest, bribery, gratuity, or similar misconduct.

#### 27. Limit on Use of Grant Funds for Grantees' Employees' Salaries

With respect to this Grant Subaward, federal funds may not be used to pay cash compensation (salary plus bonuses) to any employee of the Grant Subaward recipient at a rate that exceeds 110% of the maximum annual salary payable to a member of the federal government's Senior Executive Service (SES) at an agency with a Certified SES Performance Appraisal System for that year. (A Grant Subaward recipient may compensate an employee at a higher rate, provided the amount in excess of this compensation limitation is paid with non-federal funds.)

This limitation on compensation rates allowable under this Grant Subaward may be waived on an individual basis at the discretion of the OJP official indicated in the program announcement under which this Grant Subaward is made.

#### 28. Uploading DNA Profiles to Combined DNA Index System (CODIS)

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) agree to upload eligible DNA profiles to Combined DNA Index System ("CODIS," the DNA database operated by the FBI) by a government DNA laboratory with access to CODIS if award funds are used for DNA testing of evidentiary materials. With the exception of Forensic Genetic Genealogy, no profiles generated under this award may be entered or uploaded into any non-governmental DNA database without prior express written approval from BJA. Award funds may not be used for the purchase of DNA equipment and supplies unless the resulting DNA profiles may be accepted for entry into CODIS. Booking agencies should work with their state CODIS agency to ensure all requirements are met for participation in Rapid DNA (see National Rapid DNA Booking Operational Procedures Manual).

#### 29. Use of Funds for Forensic Genealogy Testing

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) agree to adhere to the United States Department of Justice Interim Policy Forensic Genealogical DNA Analysis and Searching (https://www.justice.gov/olp/page/file/1204386/download), and must collect and report the metrics identified in Section IX of that document to Cal OES when utilizing award funds for forensic genealogy testing must adhere to the United States Department of Justice Interim Policy Forensic Genealogical DNA Analysis and Searching (https://www.justice.gov/olp/page/file/1204386/download), and must collect and report the metrics identified in Section IX of that document to Cal OES.

#### 30. Information and/or Data Requests

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) agree to cooperate with any assessments, national evaluation efforts, or information or data collection requests, including, but not limited to, the provision of any information required for the assessment or evaluation of any activities within this project.

#### 31. Published Written and Web-based Materials

Subrecipients shall provide the Cal OES Program Specialist with a copy of any curricula, training materials, proposed publications, reports, or any other written materials that will be published, including web-based materials and website content, resulting from this Grant Subaward at least forty-five working days prior to the targeted dissemination date. Any written, visual, or audio publications, with the exception of press releases, whether published at the grantee's or government's expense, shall contain the following statements: "This project was supported by Grant No. CQ23 17 0360, awarded by the Bureau of Justice Assistance. The Bureau of Justice Assistance is a component of the Department of Justice's Office of Justice Programs, which also includes the Bureau of Justice Statistics, the National Institute of Justice, the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, the Office for Victims of Crime, and the SMART Office. Points of view or opinions in this document are those of the author and do not necessarily represent the official position or policies of the U.S. Department of Justice."

#### 32. Press Releases

TL

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) shall transmit to the Cal OES Program Specialist copies of all official award-related press releases at least fifteen working days prior to public release. Advance notice permits time for coordination of release of information by Cal OES where appropriate and to respond to press or public inquiries.

#### 33. Copyright; Data rights

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) acknowledge that OJP reserves a royalty-free, non-exclusive, and irrevocable license to reproduce, publish, or otherwise use, and authorize others to use (in whole or in part, including in connection with derivative works), for Federal purposes: (1) any work subject to copyright developed under a Grant Subaward; and (2) any rights of copyright to which a Subrecipient (at any Second-Tier Subrecipient) purchases ownership with Federal support.

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) acknowledge that OJP has the right to (1) obtain, reproduce, publish, or otherwise use the data first produced under a Grant Subaward; and (2) authorize others to receive, reproduce, publish, or otherwise use such data for Federal purposes. "Data" includes data as defined in Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) provision 52.227-14 (Rights in Data – General).

It is the responsibility of the Subrecipient (and any Second-Tier Subrecipient) to ensure that the provisions of this condition are included in any Grant Subawards (and any Second-Tier Subrecipient) under this award.

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) have the responsibility to obtain from Subrecipients, contractors, and subcontractors (if any) all rights and data necessary to fulfill the Subrecipient's obligations to the Government under this Grant Subaward. If a proposed Subrecipient, contractor, or subcontractor refuses to accept terms affording the Government such rights, the Subrecipient shall promptly bring such refusal to the attention of the Cal OES Program Specialist for the Grant Subaward and not proceed with the agreement in question without further authorization from Cal OES.

#### 34. Generally Accepted Laboratory Practices

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) shall ensure that any forensic laboratory, forensic laboratory system, medical examiner's office, or coroner's office that will receive any portion of the Grant Subaward uses generally accepted laboratory practices and procedures as established by accrediting organizations or appropriate certifying bodies.

#### a. External Investigations

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) shall ensure that requirements associated with 34 U.S.C. section 10562(4) (which relate to processes in place to conduct independent external investigations into allegations of serious negligence or misconduct by employees or contractors) are satisfied with respect to any forensic laboratory system, medical examiner's office, coroner's office, law enforcement storage facility, or medical facility in the State that will receive a

portion of the grant amount.

#### b. Accreditation

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) shall ensure that any forensic laboratory or forensic laboratory system (not including any medical examiner's office or coroner's office) that will receive any portion of the award either is accredited, or will use a portion of this award to prepare and apply for accreditation by not more than two years from the award date of this award.

Additionally, with respect to accreditation, the Subrecipient (and any Second-Tier Subrecipient) shall ensure that for any Grant Subaward it makes under this award, it will require in a legally-binding and enforceable writing, such as the Grant Subaward documentation (for example, Grant Subaward terms and conditions), that its Subrecipient: (1) if accredited, must continue to demonstrate such accreditation as a condition of receiving or using the Grant Subaward funds; or (2) if not accredited, must use the Grant Subaward funds to prepare and apply for accreditation.

The Coverdell statute (see 34 U.S.C. section 10562(2)) and the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program solicitation state certain requirements and guidance associated with proper accreditation and regarding what BJA will consider to be acceptable documentation of accreditation. The Subrecipient is to contact the Cal OES Program Specialist for clarification or guidance if it should have any question as to what constitutes proper accreditation for the purposes of the Coverdell program. Grant Subaward funds may not be used under this Grant Subaward by a forensic laboratory or forensic laboratory system with accreditation (or by such laboratory to obtain accreditation) that BJA determines not to be consistent with the Coverdell law and the solicitation or to be otherwise deficient.

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) agree to notify Cal OES promptly upon any change in the accreditation status of any forensic science laboratory or forensic laboratory system that receives funding under this Grant Subaward.

#### 35. Use of Funds: No Research

Funds provided under this Grant Subaward shall be used only for the purposes and types of expenses set forth in the Request for Application. Funds shall not be used for general law enforcement functions or non-forensic investigatory functions, and shall not be used for research or statistical projects or activities. Use of Grant Subaward funds for construction of new facilities is restricted by statute. Any questions concerning this provision should be directed to the Cal OES Program Specialist prior to incurring the expense or commencing the activity in question.

To ensure compliance with the Government Performance and Results Act (Pub. L. No. 103-62) and the GPRA Modernization Act of 2010 (Pub. L. No. 111-352), program performance under this Grant Subaward is measured by the following: (1) percent reduction in the average number of days from the submission of a sample to a forensic science laboratory to the delivery of test results to a requesting office or agency (calculated by reporting the average number of days to process a sample at the beginning of the grant period versus the average number of days to process a sample at the end of the grant period); (2) percent reduction in the number of backlogged forensic cases (calculated by reporting the number of backlogged forensic cases at the beginning of the grant period versus the number of backlogged forensic cases at the end of grant period), if applicable to the Grant Subaward; and (3) the number of forensic science or medical examiner/coroner's

office personnel who completed appropriate training or educational opportunities with these Coverdell funds, if applicable to the Grant Subaward. Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) are required to collect and report data relevant to these measures.

#### 36. Forensic Science or Medical Examiner Services Fees

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) understand and agree that, throughout the Grant Subaward Performance Period, it must promptly notify Cal OES if it either starts or stops charging fees for forensic science or medical examiner services, or if it revises its method of allocating fees received for such services to program income. Notice must be provided in writing to the Cal OES Program Specialist within fifteen business days of implementation of the change.

#### 37. External Investigations

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) acknowledge that, as stated in the solicitation for the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program, BJA assumes that Subrecipients (and Second-Tier Subrecipients) of Coverdell funds will make use of the process referenced in their certification as to external investigations and will refer allegations of serious negligence or misconduct substantially affecting the integrity of forensic results to government entities with an appropriate process in place to conduct independent external investigations, such as the government entity (or entities) identified in the grant application. The Subrecipient shall submit the following information as part of its final report: (1) the number and nature of any allegations of serious negligence or misconduct substantially affecting the integrity of forensic results received during the Grant Subaward; (2) information on the referrals of such allegations (e.g., the government entity or entities to which referred, the date of referral); (3) the outcome of such referrals (if known as of the date of the report); and (4) if any such allegations were not referred, the reason(s) for the non-referral. The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department-Scientific Investigations Division

(SBSD-SID) services over eighty local agencies and Sheriff's stations in San

Bernardino County, California. The County of San Bernardino is the largest county

in the continental United States. There are over 2.2 million residents in San

Bernardino County and the population continues to rise annually. It is the 5th most

populous county in California and the 14th most populous County in the United

States. In 2023 San Bernardino County was identified as one of the most

dangerous cities (ranked #24). Homicides and violent crimes continue to rise thus

providing increased workload from the more than 80 Agencies SBCSD-SID

provides service to.

The SBCSD-SID is a forensic science laboratory accredited through ANSI National

Accreditation Board (ANAB, certificate #FT-0315). The Crime Laboratory first

attained the accreditation status under the legacy program in 1995 and renewed

it every five years until 2016. In 2016, the Laboratory achieved accreditation

under the ISO 17025 International Program and renewed it in 2020. The Laboratory is on a 4-year cycle for renewal with the next full assessment set to occur in 2024. Among the many disciplines covered by the certificate are Firearms, Fire Debris, Materials (Trace), Forensic Biology, Controlled Substance, Toxicology (Blood Alcohol only), Crime Scene Investigations (CSI) and Bloodstain Pattern Analysis.

The Latent Print/Ten Print Unit at Cal ID is currently in the process of obtaining

accreditation through ANAB (ISO/IEC 17020/AR 3120 program).

The Scientific Investigations Division of the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department has a training budget as part of the overall operating costs of the laboratory operations. As the Laboratory's discretionary budget has decreased over the last five years, these funds are extremely limited and are applied primarily to a few in-state training opportunities. Information learned from these training classes will be disseminated at individual Unit meetings.

The release of the National Academy of Science Report, titled "Strengthening Forensic Science in the United States A Path Forward", calls for, amount other things, adequate funding for education Forensic Science. The report states that forensic science practitioners require continuing professional development and training and may need to complete additional training for certification purposes.

Continuing professional development is the "mechanism through which a

forensic scientist remains current or advances to a higher level of expertise,

Description of the Issue:

The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Office Scientific Investigations Division

provides forensic services for over 80 agencies in San Bernardino County in the

following areas: Forensic Biology, Firearm/NIBIN, Materials/Trace, Controlled

Substance (Seized Drugs), Blood Alcohol, Crime Scene Investigations and Ten

Prints/Latent Comparisons. The laboratory has experienced a significant amount

of turnover in staffing due to retirements and other factors and expects this trend

to continue as long-time employees reach retirement. This has resulted in many

staff members being in a training program. This new staff needs training

opportunities to develop their forensic expertise. Supplementing in-house training

opportunities with opportunities for training outside the laboratory has proven a

cost-effective measure.

It is the goal of the laboratory to expand the level and quality of testing services to client agencies. The goal includes adding technology and efficiencies in all areas. Training to develop expertise is critical to this goal.

### Plan:

The Crime Laboratory plans to utilize 2023 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant funding to improve the quality and timeliness of forensic services provide to client law enforcement agencies through education and training opportunities. Due to current budgetary conditions and the lack of currently available space for additional analysts, the only viable means of improving productivity and reducing case analysis backlogs is by enhancing the expertise of the current staff and developing processes for efficiency.

The laboratory intends to utilize funding from the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant to allow members of SBCSD-SID to attend a variety of training and continuing education opportunities. Grant funding will provide opportunities for new staff to receive specialized training and existing staff to be provided ongoing training and continuing education opportunities. An opportunity to attend national and international meetings and symposia in the various specialties of

Current Staffing and statistics:

The Firearms/Toolmarks Unit is staffed at five full-time Firearms Examiners and a

Supervisor. Two staff members are in training, and two vacancies are anticipated

in 2024. In 2022 the Firearms/Toolmarks Unit completed 103 firearms cases, and

433 National Integrated Ballistic Identification Network (NIBIN) entry cases. Only

cases with court dates, cases needing analysis for filing purposes, or high visibility

cases are currently being assigned for analysis as priority one. These cases are

handled as soon as possible. All other case requests are worked as time permits

as priority two. Currently the number of backlogged firearms cases is 316, and the number of backlogged NIBIN cases is 2554. The current average turnaround time for firearms cases is 38 days and for NIBIN cases is 40 days (note case priority are newer cases).

The Trace Unit is staffed as two part-time examiners (both also are members of the Controlled Substance Unit). Both staff members are proficient in gunshot residue analysis and fire debris analysis. The Trace Unit completed 208 cases in 2022. Currently the number of backlogged cases is 43 and the turnaround time is 57 days.

The Crime Scene Investigations Unit is staff at one Sheriff's Supervising Crime Scene Specialist, two Sheriff's Lead Crime Scene Specialists and eleven Sheriff's Crime Scene Specialists who respond to crime scenes. There is currently one vacancy, and five team members are in training. The Crime Scene Investigations (CSI) Unit processed 201 crime scenes in 2022. Currently the number of backlogged reports is 48 cases, and the turnaround time is 51 days. Once the crime scene is completed, personnel must complete latent print processing and swabbing for DNA evidence on collected items. Sheriff's Crime Scene Specialists complete crime scene, autopsy, vehicle processing, trajectory, bloodstain pattern analysis,

photography, and technical processing reports. To facilitate the investigation and prosecution of crimes related to these scenes, it is essential that the

turnaround time be kept to less than 30 days in all cases.

The Controlled Substances Unit is staffed at eight Criminalists (two of which also

staff the trace Unit). There is currently one vacancy and another anticipated in

2024. The Controlled Unit completed 8023 cases in 2022. The Controlled

Substances Unit classifies a case as "backlog" when it is not completed within ten

days of submission. Currently the number of backlogged cases is 2364 and the

turnaround time is 67 days. The goal is to maintain the turnaround time at less

than 10 days.

The Forensic Alcohol Unit is staffed with three full-time Criminalists. There is one

vacant position. These Criminalists are responsible for the calibration of the breath

alcohol instruments in San Bernardino County, training officers, testing for alcohol

levels in blood, and providing testimony. The Blood Alcohol Unit completed 2758

cases in 2022. The current backlog is 795 cases, and the turnaround time is 44

days. The goal is to maintain the turnaround time at less than 10 days.

The Forensic Biology Unit is staffed at eighteen Criminalists and a supervisor. This Unit is fully staffed however two vacancies are anticipated in 2024. The Forensic Biology Unit completed 1031 cases in 2022. The current backlog is 1468 cases, and the turnaround time is 455 days.

The CAL ID Unit is staffed with twenty-six examiners that conduct forensic examinations related to Ten Print Exams and Latent Print Comparison (two of which are supervisors), and one Manager. There are five vacancies. Currently there are 129 latent comparison cases backlogged. The Latent Unit completed 256 cases with an average turnaround time of 72 days.

### Project Design and Implementation:

The SBCSD-SID intends to utilize grant funding to provide training opportunities for staff members to attend a variety of training and continuing education opportunities as outlined in the budget narrative. This funding will allow the laboratory to train staff members to be able to provide timely, effective, and efficient testing services to client agencies throughout San Bernardino County.

### Capabilities and Competencies:




