Under Section 638 of the Head Start Act, this grant action awards SAN BERNARDINO, COUNTY OF a project period of 07/01/2020-06/30/2025 for the operation of Head Start and Early Head Start programs in the designated service area(s). This action awards \$50,526,610 for Head Start and Early Head Start operations; \$535,958 for Head Start training and technical assistance; and \$115,598 for Early Head Start training and technical assistance for the initial budget period of 07/01/2020-06/30/2021.

The projected costs based on the application submitted for this period are \$45,027,369 for Head Start operations; \$5,499,241 for Early Head Start operations; \$535,958 for Head Start training and technical assistance; and \$115,598 for Early Head Start training and technical assistance.

Head Start population: 3,810 children.

Designated Head Start service area(s): San Bernardino County, California.

Approved program option(s) for the Head Start program: Center-based, Home-based.

Early Head Start population: 402 infants, toddlers, and pregnant women.

Designated Early Head Start service area(s): San Bernardino County, California.

Approved program option(s) for the Early Head Start program: Center-based, Home-based.

This grant is subject to the requirements for contribution of the non-federal match and approval of key staff, the limitations on development and administrative costs and employee compensation, and prior written approval for the purchase of equipment and other capital expenditures and the purchase, construction and major renovation of facilities as specified in Attachment 1. This grant action approves your request, dated April 1, 2020, to reduce your HS enrollment by 115 slots and to convert your HS and EHS funding levels in G094122, in PY01, in the amount \$535,091 for the conversion of 40 EHS HB slots to 40 EHS CB slots. The updated approved HS enrollment is 3,810 and EHS enrollment remains at 402. The annual funding levels given in this award are inclusive of this conversion. This conversion is effective as of July 1, 2020.

This action also approves \$283,902 in G094122 for the following equipment purchases:

-Two (2) shade structures for two (2) centers: \$50,000

-Six (6) vehicles: \$179,737 -One (1) cargo van: \$25,845 -One (1) lawn trailer: \$14,880

-Two (2) vision screeners: \$13,440

This grant is subject to Section 640(b) of the Head Start Act and 45 C.F.R. § 1303.4 requiring a non-federal match of 20 percent of the total cost of the program. This grant is also subject to the requirements in Section 644(b) of the Head Start Act and 45 C.F.R. § 1303.5 limiting development and administrative costs to a maximum of 15 percent of the total costs of the program, including the non-federal match contribution of such costs. The requirements for a non-federal match of 20 percent and the limitation of 15 percent for development and administrative costs apply to the 07/01/2020-06/30/2021 budget period unless a waiver is approved. Any waiver request submitted after the expiration of the project period will not be considered.

For the purposes of this grant, key staff is defined as the Head Start Director or person carrying out the duties of the Head Start Director if not under that title and the Chief Executive Officer, Executive Director and/or Chief Fiscal Officer if any of those positions is funded, either directly or through indirect cost recovery, more than 50 percent with Head Start funds.

Section 653 of the Head Start Act prohibits the use of any federal funds, including Head Start grant funds, to pay any portion of the compensation of an individual employed by a Head Start agency if that individual's compensation exceeds the rate payable for Level II of the Executive Schedule.

Prior written approval must be obtained for the purchase of equipment and other capital expenditures as described in 45 C.F.R. § 75.439(a). Prior written approval must also be obtained under 45 C.F.R. § 75.439(b)(3) and 45 C.F.R.
