IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, Civic Center Investors, LLC ("LANDLORD"), as landlord, and San Bernardino County ("COUNTY"), as tenant, entered into Lease Agreement, Contract No. 07-1079 dated December 18, 2007, as amended by the First Amendment dated February 12, 2008; the Second Amendment dated February 12, 2013; The Third Amendment dated May 20, 2014; The Fourth Amendment dated July 25, 2017; The Fifth Amendment dated July 27, 2021, and The Sixth Amendment dated December 19, 2023 (collectively, the "Lease"), wherein the Landlord leased certain premises, comprising approximately 9,719 square feet located on the second floor at 14344 Cajon Street in Victorville, California, as the Premises is more specifically set forth in the Lease, to the COUNTY for a term that expired on December 31, 2025; and has continued on a permitted month-to-month holdover, and,

WHEREAS, COUNTY and LANDLORD now desire to amend Lease to reflect the holdover period from January 1, 2026 through August 31, 2026 with LANDLORD's express consent, extend, following said holdover, the term of the Lease from September 1, 2026 through August 31, 2031 by mutually agreeing to a 5-year term, adding two (2) two-year options to extend the term, adjust the rental rate schedule, and amend certain other terms of the Lease as more specifically set forth in this amendment ("Seventh Amendment"); and,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions, the parties hereto agree that the Lease is amended as follows:

1. Pursuant to **Paragraph 8, HOLDING OVER**, COUNTY shall, with LANDLORD's express consent granted herein, occupy the Premises on a holdover tenancy for the period from January 1, 2026 through August 31, 2026 at a monthly rental amount of \$21,187.00 per month for a total amount of \$169,496.00.

2. Effective September 1, 2026, DELETE in its entirety the existing **Paragraph 3, TERM**, and SUBSTITUTE therefore the following as a new **Paragraph 3, TERM**:

3. **TERM:** The term of the Lease between COUNTY and LANDLORD for the Premises is extended for Five (5) years, commencing on September 1, 2026, and expiring on August 31, 2031 (the "Sixth Extended Term").

3. Effective September 1, 2026, DELETE in its entirety the existing **Paragraph 4, RENT**, and SUBSTITUTE therefore the following as a new **Paragraph 4, RENT**:

4. **RENT:**

A. COUNTY shall pay to LANDLORD the following monthly rental payments for the Premises in arrears no later than the last day of each month, commencing on September 1, 2026 and continuing for the duration of the Sixth Extended Term, as more specifically set forth below:

B. Rent for any partial month shall be prorated based on the actual number of days of the month. LANDLORD shall accept all rent and other payments from COUNTY under this Lease via electronic funds transfer (EFT) directly deposited into the LANDLORD's designated checking or other bank account. LANDLORD shall promptly comply with directions and accurately complete forms provided by COUNTY required to process EFT payments.

4. Effective September 1, 2026 DELETE in its entirety the existing **Paragraph 6, OPTION TO EXTEND TERM**, and SUBSTITUTE therefore the following as a new **Paragraph 6, OPTION TO EXTEND TERM**:

"6. **OPTION TO EXTEND TERM:**

A. LANDLORD gives COUNTY the option to extend the term of the Lease on the same provisions and conditions, except for the monthly rent, for two (2) two-year periods ("extended term") following the expiration of the current term, by COUNTY giving notice of its intention to exercise the option to LANDLORD prior to the expiration of the preceding term or during any holding over pursuant to **Paragraph 8, HOLDING OVER**. The rent for the extended term shall be adjusted by good faith negotiation of the parties to the fair market rental rate then prevailing based upon the rental rates of comparable leased property in the Victorville/High Desert market area.

B. If the Parties have been unable to agree on the fair market rental rate for the Premises within five (5) months of COUNTY's exercise of its option, said fair market rental rate shall be determined through arbitration conducted in accordance with the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association. During the period between the expiration of the then current term of the Lease and the determination of the monthly rent for the Premises by arbitration, COUNTY shall continue to pay the monthly rent for the Premises in the amount due for the month

immediately preceding expiration of the then current term of the Lease. If the fair market rental rate for the Premises is determined by arbitration and COUNTY does not, for any reason, agree with such determination, COUNTY shall have the right to terminate the Lease by providing LANDLORD with written notice not later than thirty (30) days after COUNTY's receipt of the arbitration-determined fair market rental rate. In the event COUNTY does not so terminate the Lease, COUNTY shall commence paying the arbitration-determined fair market rental rate for the month immediately following COUNTY's receipt of said rate determination and for the duration of the then current term."

5. Effective August 4, 2026, DELETE in its entirety the existing **Paragraph 57. CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE (SB 1439)** and SUBSTITUTE therefore the following as a new **Paragraph 57, LEVINE ACT CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE** and SUBSTITUTE a new **EXHIBIT "G", LEVINE ACT CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE** incorporated and attached herein, which shall read as follows:

"57. LEVINE ACT CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE: LANDLORD has disclosed to the County using "Exhibit G" – LEVINE ACT CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE, whether it has made any campaign contributions of more than \$500 to any member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer [Sheriff, Assessor-Recorder-Clerk, Auditor-Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector and the District Attorney] within the earlier of: (1) the date of the submission of Landlord's proposal to the County, or (2) 12 months before the date this Lease was approved by the Board of Supervisors. LANDLORD acknowledges that under Government Code section 84308, LANDLORD is prohibited from making campaign contributions of more than \$500 to any member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer for 12 months after the County's consideration of the Lease.

In the event of a proposed amendment to this Lease, the LANDLORD will provide the County a written statement disclosing any campaign contribution(s) of more than \$500 to any member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer within the preceding 12 months of the date of the proposed amendment.

Campaign contributions include those made by any agent/person/entity on behalf of the LANDLORD or by a parent, subsidiary, or otherwise related business entity of LANDLORD."

6. All other provisions and terms of the Lease shall remain the same and are hereby incorporated by reference. In the event of any conflict between the Lease and this Seventh Amendment, the terms and conditions of this Seventh Amendment shall control.

7. This Seventh Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts shall together constitute one and the same Seventh Amendment. The parties shall be entitled to sign and transmit an electronic signature of this Seventh Amendment (whether by facsimile, PDF or other email transmission), which signature shall be binding on the party whose name is contained therein. Each party providing an electronic signature agrees to promptly execute and deliver to the other party an original signed Seventh Amendment upon request.

Exhibit "G"
Levine Act –
Campaign Contribution Disclosure
(formerly referred to as Senate Bill 1439)

The following is a list of items that are not covered by the Levine Act. A Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form will not be required for the following:

- Contracts that are competitively bid and awarded as required by law or County policy
- Contracts with labor unions regarding employee salaries and benefits
- Personal employment contracts
- Contracts under \$50,000
- Contracts where no party receives financial compensation
- Contracts between two or more public agencies
- The review or renewal of development agreements unless there is a material modification or amendment to the agreement
- The review or renewal of competitively bid contracts unless there is a material modification or amendment to the agreement that is worth more than 10% of the value of the contract or \$50,000, whichever is less
- Any modification or amendment to a matter listed above, except for competitively bid contracts.

DEFINITIONS

Actively supporting or opposing the matter: (a) Communicate directly with a member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer [Sheriff, Assessor-Recorder-Clerk, District Attorney, Auditor-Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector] for the purpose of influencing the decision on the matter; or (b) testifies or makes an oral statement before the County in a proceeding on the matter for the purpose of influencing the County's decision on the matter; or (c) communicates with County employees, for the purpose of influencing the County's decision on the matter; or (d) when the person/company's agent lobbies in person, testifies in person or otherwise communicates with the Board or County employees for purposes of influencing the County's decision in a matter.

Agent: A third-party individual or firm who, for compensation, is representing a party or a participant in the matter submitted to the Board of Supervisors. If an agent is an employee or member of a third-party law, architectural, engineering or consulting firm, or a similar entity, both the entity and the individual are considered agents.

Otherwise related entity: An otherwise related entity is any for-profit organization/company which does not have a parent-subsidary relationship but meets one of the following criteria:

- (1) One business entity has a controlling ownership interest in the other business entity;
- (2) there is shared management and control between the entities; or
- (3) a controlling owner (50% or greater interest as a shareholder or as a general partner) in one entity also is a controlling owner in the other entity.

For purposes of (2), "shared management and control" can be found when the same person or substantially the same persons own and manage the two entities; there are common or commingled funds or assets; the business entities share the use of the same offices or employees, or otherwise share activities, resources or personnel on a regular basis; or there is otherwise a regular and close working relationship between the entities.

Parent-Subsidiary Relationship: A parent-subsidiary relationship exists when one corporation has more than 50 percent of the voting power of another corporation.
