THIS CONTRACT is entered into in the State of California by and between San Bernardino County, hereinafter called the County, and Valley Star Behavioral Health, Inc. referenced above, hereinafter called Contractor.

**IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:**

**WITNESSETH:**

IN THAT CERTAIN **Contract No. 20-366** by and between San Bernardino County, a political subdivision of the State of California, and Contractor for One Stop Transitional Age Youth (TAY) Centers Services, which Contract first became effective July 1, 2020, the following changes are hereby made and agreed to, effective December 1, 2023:

- I. ARTICLE IV FUNDING AND BUDGETARY RESTRICTIONS, paragraph I is hereby amended, and paragraphs J and K are hereby added to read as follows:
  - I. The contract amendment amount of \$3,196,749 shall increase the total contract amount from \$5,650,000 to \$8,846,749 for the contract term.
    - FY23/24 – Increase of \$1,065,583.00
    - FY24/25 – Increase of \$2,131,166.00

- J. The Schedules A and B will be submitted to, and approved by, Director or designee at a later date for Fiscal Years 2023-24 and 2024-25.
- K. Contractor will assume responsibility of One Stop TAY Center services being relinquished by MHS, INC. To accomplish a rapid start-up of services the following is agreed to:
  - 1. Contractor cannot exceed their current contract maximum amounts prior to approval and execution of the contract amendments by the County.
  - 2. It is agreed that Contractor may receive up to \$177,500 in additional funding in the December 2023 invoice, which will be submitted in January 2024 in order for Contractor to rapidly get this additional location operational and fully functional as of January 1, 2024.
  - 3. Invoices from January 2024 forward will only include actual costs.
  - 4. It is understood that one, One Stop TAY Center location will require new Medi-Cal certification and the creation of a new reporting unit within the DBH system.
  - 5. It is agreed that invoices shall be processed for payment prior to the creation of these new reporting units.
  - 6. Total invoices for the implementation and operation of this additional program through June 30, 2024, shall not exceed the maximum contract amount approved for FY23-24.

II. ARTICLE XVI PERSONNEL, paragraphs L and M, are hereby added to read as follows:

L. Executive Order N-6-22 Russia Sanctions

On March 4, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order N-6-22 (the EO) regarding Economic Sanctions against Russia and Russian entities and individuals. "Economic Sanctions" refers to sanctions imposed by the U.S. government in response to Russia's actions in Ukraine (<https://home.treasury.gov/policy-issues/financial-sanctions/sanctions-programs-and-country-information/ukraine-russia-related-sanctions>), as well as any sanctions imposed under state law (<https://www.dgs.ca.gov/OLS/Ukraine-Russia>). The EO directs state agencies and their contractors (including by agreement or receipt of a grant) to terminate contracts with, and to refrain from entering any new contracts with, individuals or entities that are determined to be a target of Economic Sanctions. Accordingly, should it be determined that Contractor is a target of Economic Sanctions or is conducting prohibited transactions with sanctioned individuals or entities, that shall be grounds for termination of this agreement. Contractor shall be provided advance written notice of such termination, allowing Contractor at least 30 calendar days to provide a written response. Termination shall be at the sole discretion of the County.

M. Campaign Contribution Disclosure (SB 1439)

Contractor has disclosed to the County using Attachment III - Campaign Contribution Disclosure Senate Bill 1439, whether it has made any campaign contributions of more than \$250 to any member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer [Sheriff, Assessor-Recorder-Clerk, Auditor-Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector and the District Attorney] within the earlier of: (1) the date of the submission of Contractor's proposal to the County, or (2) 12 months before the date this Contract was approved by the Board of Supervisors. Contractor acknowledges that under Government Code section 84308, Contractor is prohibited from making campaign contributions of more than \$250 to any member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer for 12 months after the County's consideration of the Contract.

In the event of a proposed amendment to this Contract, the Contractor will provide the County a written statement disclosing any campaign contribution(s) of more than \$250 to any member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer within the preceding 12 months of the date of the proposed amendment.

Campaign contributions include those made by any agent/person/entity on behalf of the Contractor or by a parent, subsidiary or otherwise related business entity of Contractor.

III. ADDENDUM I DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM SERVICES, ARTICLE II. PERSONS TO BE SERVED, paragraph A. PROGRAM OBJECTIVE, SECTION 1.a and 1.c, are hereby amended to read as follows:

1. The number of unduplicated TAY to be served through this contract is as follows per Fiscal Year:

a. Mode 15 Outpatient (Full Service Partnership)

- 1) Eastern Desert 79, contractor Valley Star Behavioral Health, Inc.
- 2) West Valley 191, contractor Valley Star Behavioral Health, Inc.

Mode 45 Outreach no minimum number of TAY served, contractor provides an estimate number of TAY served, see Schedule B.

Mode 60 Support no minimum number of TAY served, contractor provides an estimate number of TAY served, see Schedule B.

c. Region/area to be served:

1) Eastern Desert Region:

The Eastern Desert Region includes the communities of Yucca Valley, Twenty-nine Palms, Joshua Tree, Wonder Valley, Morongo Valley, and surrounding communities.

2) West Valley Region:

The West Valley Region includes the cities of Rancho Cucamonga, Upland, Montclair, Ontario, Etiwanda, Guasti and surrounding communities.

IV. ATTACHMENT III CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE (SB 1439) is hereby added.

V. All other terms, conditions and covenants in the basic agreement remain in full force and effect.

This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts shall together constitute one and the same Agreement. The parties shall be entitled to sign and transmit an electronic signature of this Agreement (whether by facsimile, PDF or other email transmission), which signature shall be binding on the party whose name is contained therein. Each party providing an electronic signature agrees to promptly execute and deliver to the other party an original signed Agreement upon request.

## Campaign Contribution Disclosure (SB 1439)

### **DEFINITIONS**

**Actively supporting the matter:** (a) Communicate directly with a member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer [Sheriff, Assessor-Recorder-Clerk, District Attorney, Auditor-Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector] for the purpose of influencing the decision on the matter; or (b) testifies or makes an oral statement before the County in a proceeding on the matter for the purpose of influencing the County's decision on the matter; or (c) communicates with County employees, for the purpose of influencing the County's decision on the matter; or (d) when the person/company's agent lobbies in person, testifies in person or otherwise communicates with the Board or County employees for purposes of influencing the County's decision in a matter.

**Agent:** A third-party individual or firm who, for compensation, is representing a party or a participant in the matter submitted to the Board of Supervisors. If an agent is an employee or member of a third-party law, architectural, engineering or consulting firm, or a similar entity, both the entity and the individual are considered agents.

**Otherwise related entity:** An otherwise related entity is any for-profit organization/company which does not have a parent-subsidary relationship but meets one of the following criteria:

- (1) One business entity has a controlling ownership interest in the other business entity;
- (2) there is shared management and control between the entities; or
- (3) a controlling owner (50% or greater interest as a shareholder or as a general partner) in one entity also is a controlling owner in the other entity.

For purposes of (2), "shared management and control" can be found when the same person or substantially the same persons own and manage the two entities; there are common or commingled funds or assets; the business entities share the use of the same offices or employees, or otherwise share activities, resources or personnel on a regular basis; or there is otherwise a regular and close working relationship between the entities.

**Parent-Subsidiary Relationship:** A parent-subsidiary relationship exists when one corporation has more than 50 percent of the voting power of another corporation.
