SB County Sheriff will use FY23 HSGP funds to purchase a radio frequency detector to use throughout the County to increase radio, cellular, satellite, Wi-Fi, GPS and other communications and technologies from potential threats and disruption from terrorist or hostile threats. The detector will be used by the intelligence division to fill capability gaps and detect suspicious activity. This project can be claimed as LETPA as it addresses the core capability of interdiction and disruption within the National Prevention Framework. (SCIP Goal #4)

SB County Sheriff will use FY23 HSGP funds to provide training on the use of the radio frequency detector for use by the intelligence division to detect communication disruptions to strengthen communications capabilities through technology. This project can be claimed as LETPA as it addresses the core capability of interdiction and disruption within the National Prevention Framework. (SCIP Goal #4)

The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department will use FY23 HSGP funds to sustain system and enhance regional data collection project used for intelligence and incident response. This system allows the consolidation of data pertaining to terrorist investigations/activities throughout the region for terrorist prevention. Where communication sharing regarding potential terrorist activities is a weakness, the data collected in the system strengthens coordination and communication with other participating agencies, including the DOJ and participating agencies, to reduce risk within Western regions. Providing these services for such a system. Utilizing funds granted to the County for a shared project strengthens coordination with smaller agencies within the region and with remote agencies who would otherwise not have the financial ability to better guard themselves against possible terror threats. This is an ongoing project where years of data has been collected. At more information is collected, a broad picture of potential threats to the region is more identifiable, and the County is better positioned to enhance its intelligence and information sharing capability of intelligence and information sharing within the National Prevention Framework.

SB County Sheriff will use FY23 HSGP funds for a Terrorism Liaison Officer Coordinator to develop plans, perform community outreach, facilitate with trainings & development of TLO. This project can be claimed as LETPA as it addresses the core capability of interdiction and information sharing within the National Prevention Framework. Identifying such activities for other jurisdictions and large venue organizations for the County intelligence and information sharing within the National Prevention Framework.

SB County will use FY23 HSGP funds to administer the grant and purchase necessary supplies for the procurement of the project. This includes the purchase of the equipment and the enhancement multi-jurisdictional coordination.

SB County OES will work with the Registrar of Voters to use FY23 HSGP funds to purchase jersey barriers for election sites throughout the County. The portable barriers will protect citizens and poll workers from potential terrorist and extremist threats by separating pedestrian areas where voters stand in line to vote and the polling lot, keeping vehicles from ramming into citizens and buildings where elections take place. The barriers will allow the voting process to take place by minimizing interruption from potential threats, therefore maintaining the integrity of the voting process for a strong and resilient nation.
