- 11. Contractor Means any person, sole proprietorship, partnership, association, corporation, joint venture, institution or other entity which is a party to a contract.
- 12. Minority Means the same as defined in Public Contract Code section 2051(c).
- 13. Small Business Concern Means a small business as defined by Section 3 of the Small Business Act and relevant regulations found in Title 13 Part 121 of the CFR.

- 14. Procurement Includes the acquisition of material, supplies, goods equipment, systems, construction and services through both formal (including competitive bids) and informal transactions which result in purchase orders and/or contracts.
- 15. Public Works Contract Is an agreement to perform the work described in Public Contract Code section 22002.
- 16. Purchase Means a method of procurement which results in an order for materials, supplies, goods, equipment, systems or services.

LABOR CODE REQUIREMENTS REGARDING REGISTRATION AS CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR REQUIRED PRIOR TO BID PROPOSAL SUBMISSION: Contractor shall comply with Labor Code section 1771.1, including, but not limited to, the following requirements: (1) no contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a bid proposal for a public works project unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 (with limited exceptions from this requirement for bid purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)); (2) no contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract for public work or perform work on a public works project unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5; (3) this Project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations; (4) Contractor shall post job site notices regarding compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations; and (5) Contractor must submit certified payroll at least monthly to the Labor Commissioner in a format prescribed by the Labor Commissioner.

As provided in Labor Code section 1771.1:

- (a) A contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bit e listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section Public Contract bolic work, as defined in Code, or engage in the performance of any contract to this chapter, unless currently registered and qualitied b perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5. It is not a violation of this section for an unregistered Section 7029.1 of the Business contractor to submit a bid that is authorized by or 20103.5 of the Public Contract and Professions Code or by Section Code, provided the contractor is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 at the time the contract s awarded.
- (b) Notice of the requirement de cribed in subdivision (a) shall be included in all bid invitations and public works contracts, and a bid shall not be accepted nor any contract or subcontract entered into without proof of the contractor or subcontractor's current registration to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5.
- (c) An inadvertent error in listing a subcontractor who is not registered pursuant to Section 1725.5 is a bid proposal shall not be grounds for filing a bid protest or grounds for considering the bid nonresponsive, provided that any of the following apply:
- (1) The subcontractor is registered prior to the bid opening.
- (2) Within 24 hours after the bid opening, the subcontractor is registered and has paid the penalty registration fee specified in subparagraph (E) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 1725.5.
- (3) The subcontractor is replaced by another registered subcontractor pursuant to Section 4107 of the Public Contract Code.
- (d) Failure by a subcontractor to be registered to perform public work as required by subdivision (a) shall be grounds under Section 4107 of the Public Contract Code for the contractor, with the consent of the awarding authority, to substitute a subcontractor who is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 in place of the unregistered subcontractor.
- (e) The department shall maintain on its Internet Web site a list of contractors who are currently registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5.

- (f) A contract entered into with any contractor or subcontractor in violation of subdivision (a) shall be subject to cancellation, provided that a contract for public work shall not be unlawful, void, or voidable solely due to the failure of the awarding body, contractor, or any subcontractor to comply with the requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section.
- (g) If the Labor Commissioner or his or her designee determines that a contractor or subcontractor engaged in the performance of any public work contract without having been registered in accordance with this section, the contractor or subcontractor shall forfeit, as a civil penalty to the state, one hundred dollars (\$100) for each day of work performed in violation of the registration requirement, not to exceed an aggregate penalty of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) in addition to any penalty registration fee assessed pursuant to clause (ii) of subparagraph (E) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 1725.5.
- (h) (1) In addition to, or in lieu of, any other penalty or sanction authorized pursuant to this chapter, a higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor who is found to have entered into a subcontract with an unregistered lower tier subcontractor to perform any public work in violation of the requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section shall be subject to forfeit re, as a civil penalty to the state, of one hundred dollars (\$100) for each dry he caregistered lower tier subcontractor performs work in violation of the registration requirement, not to exceed an aggregate penalty of ten thousand dollars (\$13,000).
- (2) The Labor Commissioner shall use the same standards specified in subparagraph (A) of paragraph (2) of subtivision (a) of Section 1775 when determining the severity of the violation and what penalty to assess, and may waive the penalty for a first time violation that was unintentional and did not hinder the Labor Commissioner's ability to monitor and enforce compliance with the requirements of this chapter.
- (3) A higher tiered public yarks contractor or subcontractor shall not be liable for penalties assessed pursuant to paragraph (1) if the lower tier subcontractor's performance is in violation of the requirements of Section 1725.5 due to the revocation of a previously approved registration.
- (4) A subcontractor shall not be liable for any penalties assessed against a higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor pursuant to paragraph (1). A higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor may not require a lower tiered subcontractor to indemnify or otherwise be liable for any penalties pursuant to paragraph (1).
- (i) The Labor Commissioner or his or her designee shall issue a civil wage and penalty assessment, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1741, upon determination of penalties pursuant to subdivision (g) and subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (h). Review of a civil wage and penalty assessment issued under this subdivision may be requested in accordance with the provisions of Section 1742. The regulations of the Director of Industrial Relations, which govern proceedings for review of civil wage and penalty assessments and the withholding of contract payments under Article 1 (commencing with Section 1720) and Article 2 (commencing with Section 1770), shall apply.
- (j) (1) Where a contractor or subcontractor engages in the performance of any public work contract without having been registered in violation of the

requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section, the Labor Commissioner shall issue and serve a stop order prohibiting the use of the unregistered contractor or the unregistered subcontractor on all public works until the unregistered contractor or unregistered subcontractor is registered. The stop order shall not apply to work by registered contractors or subcontractors on the public work.

- (2) A stop order may be personally served upon the contractor or subcontractor by either of the following methods:
- (A) Manual delivery of the order to the contractor or subcontractor personally.
- (B) Leaving signed copies of the order with the person who is apparently in charge at the site of the public work and by thereafter mailing copies of the order by first class mail, postage prepaid to the contractor or subcontractor at one of with either of the following:
- (i) The address of the contractor or subcontractor on file with either the Secretary of State or the Contractors' State License Board.
- (ii) If the contractor or subcontractor has no address on file with the Secretary of State or the Contractors' State License Board, the address of the public work.
- (3) The stop order shall be effective immediately uson service and shall be subject to appeal by the party contracting with the unregistered contractor or subcontractor, by the unregistered contractor or subcontractor, or both. The appeal, hearing, and any further review of the bearing decision shall be governed by the procedures, time limits, and other result ements specified in subdivision (a) of Section 238.1.
- (4) Any employee of an unregisted contractor or subcontractor who is affected by a work stoppage ordered by be commissioner pursuant to this subdivision shall be paid at his or her regular hourly prevailing wage rate by that employer for any hours the employee would have worked but for the work stoppage, not to exceed 10 days.
- (k) Failure of a contractor or subcontractor, owner, director, officer, or managing agent of the contractor of subcontractor to observe a stop order issued and served upon kins or her pursuant to subdivision (j) is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by in prisonment in county jail not exceeding 60 days or by a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or both.
- (I) This section shall apply to any bid proposal submitted on or after March 1, 2015, and any contract for public work entered into on or after April 1, 2015. This section shall also apply to the performance of any public work, as defined in this chapter, on or after January 1, 2018, regardless of when the contract for public work was entered.
- (m) Penalties received pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the State Public Works Enforcement Fund established by Section 1771.3 and shall be used only for the purposes specified in that section.
- (n) This section shall not apply to work performed on a public works project of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) or less when the project is for construction, alteration, demolition, installation, or repair work or to work performed on a public works project of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) or less when the project is for maintenance work.

The award of the contract, if it be awarded, will be to the lowest responsible bidder whose proposal complies with all the requirements prescribed. The award, if made, will be made within 60 days after the opening of the proposals. This period will be subject to extension for such further period as may be agreed upon in writing between the Department and the bidder concerned.

Bid Protest: Any bidder submitting a bid to the County for this Project may file a protest of the County's proposed award of the contract for this Project, provided that each and all of the following are complied with:

Falure to timely submit a written protest shall constitute grounds for the County Lenial of the bid protest without consideration of the grounds stated in the bid protest and a waiver of the right to protest. Untimely protests will not be accepted or considered.
- 3. The written bid protest shall set forth, in detail, all grounds for the bid protest (including without limitation all facts, supporting documentation, legal authorities and argument in support of the grounds for the bid protest), the form of relief required and the legal basis for such relief. Any grounds not set forth in the bid protest shall be deemed waived. All factual sontentions must be supported by competent, admissible and credible evidence. The bid protests shall include the name of the project manager and the name and Work Order number of the bid Project. Any bid protest not conforming to the foregoing shall be rejected as invalid.

If a valid protest is timely filed and complies with the above requirements, the Department shall review and evaluate the bid protes. All bidders, including the protesting bidder, shall have three business days to respond to the Department and to provide any information requested by the Department. The Department shall respond to the protesting bidder and state the Department's findings regarding the hid protest. The Department Director's decision shall be final, unless overturned by the Board of Supervisors.

Replace section 3-1.18, "CONTRACT EXECUTION," with:

3-1.18 CONTRACT EXECUTION

The contract, along with the performance and payment bonds, copies of insurance policies, certificates of insurance, documents to verify any self-insurance coverage, and any other requested documents, shall be filled out appropriately and signed by the successful bidder and returned within <u>10 days</u> (excluding Saturday, Sunday and holidays) after receiving those documents for execution.

Failure of the lowest responsible bidder, the second lowest responsible bidder, or the third lowest responsible bidder to execute the contract and file acceptable bonds as provided herein shall be just cause for the forfeiture of the proposal guaranty. The successful bidder may file with the County a written notice, signed by the bidder or the bidder's authorized representative, specifying that the bidder will refuse to execute the contract if it is presented. The lling of this notice shall have the same force and effect as the failure of the bidder to execute the contract and furnish acceptable bonds within the time hereinbefore prescribed.

Contractor shall make all reasonable efforts to excure that no County officer or employee, whose position in the County enables him/har to officence any award of this contract or any competing offer, shall have any direct or indirect financial interest resulting from the award of this contract or shall have any relationship to the Contractor or officer or employee of the Contractor.

Add section 3-1.21, "ORMER COUNTY OFFICIALS," which reads:

3-1.21 FORMER COUNTY OFFICIALS

Contractor must provide information on former San Bernardino County Administrative officials (as defined below) who are explyed by or represent their business. The information provided must include a list of former County Administrative Officials who terminated County employment within the last five years and who are now officers, principals, partners, associates or members of the business.

This information should also include the employment and/or representative capacity and the dates these individuals began employment with or representation of their business. For purposes of this section, "County Administrative Official" is defined as a member of the Board of Supervisors or such officer's staff, group head, assistant department or group head, or any employee in the Exempt Group, Management Unit or Safety Management Unit.

Failure to provide this information may result in the proposal being deemed non-responsive.

Add section 3-1.22, "SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM," which reads:

3-1.22 SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM

During the term of the Contract, Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, age, or military and veteran status. Contractor shall comply with Executive Orders 11246, 11375, 11625, 12138, 12432, 12250, 13672, Title VI & VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the California Fair Housing and Employment Act and other applicable Federal, State of California and County laws and regulations and policies relating to equal employment and contracting opportunities, including laws and regulations hereafter enacted.

Add section 3-1.23, "REFERENCE CHECKS," which reads

3-1.23 REFERENCE CHECKS

Reference checks may be performed on the apparent low bidder, and if performed, the apparent low bidder shall be required to submit a list of references upon request.

Add section 3-1.23, "IRAN CONTRACTING ACT OF 2010, which reads:

3-1.23 IRAN CONTRACTING ACT OF 2010 (Public Contract Code section 2200 et seq.) (Applicable only to Contracts of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) or More):

In accordance with Public Contract Code section 2204(a), ne Contractor certifies that at the time the Contract is signed, the Contractor signing the Contract is not identified on a list created pursuant to subdivision (b) of Public Contract Code section 2203 as a person (as defined in Public Contract Code section 2202(e)) engaging in investment activities in Iran described in subdivision (a) of Public Contract Code section 2202.5, or as a person described in subdivision (b) of Public Contract Code section 2202.5, as applicable.

Add section 3-1.24, "RUSSIAN ANCTION/EXECUTIVE ORDER N-6-22," which reads:

3-1.24 RUSSIAN SANCTION/EXECUTIVE ORDER N-6-22 (Applicable for all Contracts of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) or more utilizing State funding.)

On March 4, 2022, Governor Davin Newsom issued Executive Order N-6-22 (the EO) regarding Economic Saction against Russia and Russian entities and individuals. "Economic Sanctions to sanctions imposed by the U.S. government in response to Russia's actions Ukraine (https://home.treasury.gov/policy-issues/financialsanctions/sanctions-programs-and-country-information/ukraine-russia-related-sanctions), well as any sanctions imposed under state law (https://www.dgs.ca.gov/OLS/Ukraine-Russia). The EO directs state agencies and their contractors (including by agreement or receipt of a grant) to terminate contracts with, and to refrain from entering any new contracts with, individuals or entities that are determined to be a target of Economic Sanctions. Accordingly, should it be determined that Contractor is a target of Economic Sanctions or is conducting prohibited transactions with sanctioned individuals or entities, that shall be grounds for termination of this agreement. Contractor shall be provided advance written notice of such termination, allowing Contractor at least 30 calendar days to provide a written response. Termination shall be at the sole discretion of the County.

Contractors are cautioned that making a false certification may subject the Contractor to civil penalties, termination of existing contract, and ineligibility to bid on a contract for a period of three (3) years in accordance with Public Contract Code section 2205.

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4 SCOPE OF WORK

Add the following paragraph to Section 4-1.03, "WORK DESCRIPTION":

The work, in general, consists of chip, slurry, crack seal, mill and overlay, paint traffic stripes, and pavement markings and doing other work appurtenant thereto.

Replace section 4-1.06A, "General," with:

4-1.06A General

a. Differing Site Conditions

- 1. During the progress of the work, if subsurface or latent physical conditions are encountered at the site differing materially floor those indicated in the contract or if unknown physical conditions of an unusual pature, differing materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in the work provided for in the contract, are encountered at the site, the party discovering such conditions shall promptly notice the other party in writing of the specific differing conditions before the site is disturbed and before the affected work is performed.
- 2. Upon written notification, the engineer will investigate the conditions, and if it is determined that the conditions materially differ and cause an increase or decrease in the cost or time required for the performance of any work under the contract, an adjustment excluding anticipated profits, will be made and the contract modified in writing accordingly. The engineer will notify the contractor of the determination whether or not an adjustment of the contract is warranted.
- 3. No contract as stment which results in a benefit to the contractor will be allowed unless the contractor has provided the required written notice.
- 4. No contract adjustment will be allowed under this clause for any effects caused on unchanged work.

b. Suspensions of Work Ordered by the Engineer

- 1. If the performance of all or any portion of the work is suspended or delayed by the Engineer in writing for an unreasonable period of time (not originally anticipated, customary, or inherent to the construction industry) and the contractor believes that additional compensation and/or contract time is due as a result of such suspension or delay, the contractor shall submit to the Engineer in writing a request for adjustment within 7 calendar days of receipt of the notice to resume work. The request shall set forth the reasons and support for such adjustment.
- 2. Upon receipt, the Engineer will evaluate the contractor's request. If the Engineer agrees that the cost and/or time required for the performance of the contract has increased as a result of such suspension and the suspension was caused by

conditions beyond the control of and not the fault of the contractor, its suppliers, or subcontractors at any approved tier, and not caused by weather, the Engineer will make an adjustment (excluding profit) and modify the contract in writing accordingly. The contractor will be notified of the Engineer's determination whether or not an adjustment of the contract is warranted.

- 3. No contract adjustment will be allowed unless the contractor has submitted the request for adjustment within the time prescribed.
- 4. No contract adjustment will be allowed under this clause to the extent that performance would have been suspended or delayed by any other cause, or for which an adjustment is provided or excluded under any other term or condition of this contract.

c. Significant Changes in the Character of Work

- 1. The Engineer reserves the right to make, in writing, at any time during the work, such changes in quantities and such alterations in the work as are necessary to satisfactorily complete the project. Such changes in quantities and alterations shall not invalidate the contract nor release the surely, and the contractor agrees to perform the work as altered.
- 2. If the alterations or changes in quantities significantly change the character of the work under the contract, whether such alterations or changes are in themselves significant changes to the character of the work or by affecting other work cause such other work to become significantly different in character, an adjustment, excluding anticipated profit, will be made to the contract. The basis for the adjustment shall be agreed upon prior to the performance of the work. If a basis cannot be agreed upon, the canadjustment will be made either for or against the contractor in such amount as the Engineer may determine to be fair and equitable.
- 3. If the alterations of changes in quantities do not significantly change the character of the work to be performed under the contract, the altered work will be paid for as provides elsewhere in the contract.
- 4. The term "significan change" shall be construed to apply only to the following circumstance:
 - a. When the character of the work as altered differs materially in kind or nature from that involved or included in the original proposed construction; or
 - b. When a major item of work, as defined elsewhere in the contract, is increased in excess of 125 percent or decreased below 75 percent of the original contract quantity. Any allowance for an increase in quantity shall apply only to that portion in excess of 125 percent of original contract item quantity, or in case of a decrease below 75 percent, to the actual amount of work performed.

Replace "Change Order" at each occurrence in section 4-1.05, "CHANGES AND EXTRA WORK," with "Change Order or Contract Amendments."

Delete section 4-1.07, "VALUE ENGINEERING."

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5 CONTROL OF WORK

Delete the phrase "including VECPs" at the end of item 1.1 in the 7th paragraph of section 5-1.09A, "General."

Add to section 5-1.09A, "General," the following paragraphs:

The San Bernardino County will promote the formation of a "Partnering" relationship with the Contractor in order to effectively complete the contract to the benefit of both parties. The purpose of this relationship will be to maintain cooperative communication and mutually resolve conflicts at the lowest possible management level.

The County's share of such costs will be reimbursed to the Contractor in a change order written by the Engineer. The establishment of a "Partnering" relationship will not change or modify the terms and conditions of the contract and will not reveve either party of the legal requirements of the contract.

Further, nothing contained in this provision shall be construed as creating a joint venture, partnership, or employment arrangement between the parties hereto, nor shall either party have the rights, power or authority to create an obligation or duty, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other party hereto.

Replace section 5.1. 2, "A SIGNMENT," with:

5-1.12 ASSIGNMENT

The performance of the Contract or any Contract part may be assigned only with prior written consent from the County. To request consent, submit your request in writing to the Department Engineer. The County does not consent to any requested assignment that would relieve you or your surety of the responsibility to complete the work or any part of the work.

If you assign the right to receive Contract payments, the County accepts the assignment upon the Engineer's receipt of a written request. Assigned payments remain subject to deductions and withholds described in the Contract. The Department may use withheld payments for work completion whether the payments are assigned or not.

Add to section 5-1.13A, "General," the following paragraphs:

Contractor must comply with section 5-1.13, "Subcontracting," of the Standard Specifications, Section 2, "Bidding" of these Special Provisions and Section 3, "Contract Award And Execution, Equal Employment Opportunity Program, Conflict Of Interest, And Former County Officials" of these Special Provisions.

Each subcontract must comply with the Contract and any lower tier subcontract that may in turn be made must comply with the Contract, including but not limited to Section 7, "Legal Relations and Responsibility to the Public," of these Special Provisions. Noncompliance shall be corrected. Payment for subcontracted work involved will be withheld from progress payments due, or to become due, until correction is made. Failure to comply may result in termination of the contract.

Pursuant to the provisions in Section 1777.1 of the Labor Code, the Labor Commissioner publishes and distributes a list of contractors ineligible to perform work as a subcontractor on a public works project. This list of debarred contractors is available from the Department of Industrial Relations web site at:

Delete section 5-1.13B, "Disadvantaged Business Enterprises." Delete section 5-1.13C, "Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises."

Delete section 5-1.13D, "Non-Small Businesses."

Add the following paragraphs to section 5-1.20B(1), "General":

A copy of the PLACs are included in these Special Provisions.

The contractor shall make the Agreement, any extensions and amondments to the Agreement, and all related notification materials and California Errironmental Quality Act (CEQA) documents, readily available at the project site at all times and shall be presented to CDFW personnel, or personnel from another state, federal, or local agency upon request.

CDFW personnel may enter the project site at any time to verify compliance with the Agreement.

Replace the phrase "3. Structure came and number, if any" in section 5-1.23A, "General," with "Project Name, structure or road number."

Delete all of the paragraphs in section 5-1.27E, "Change Order Bills," with the exception of the 1st paragraph.

Add the fone-wing paragraphs to section 5-1.36A, "General":

High Risk Facility Notification:

Certain underground facilities exist that may require special precautions be taken by the Contractor to protect the health, safety and welfare of workmen and of the public. Facilities requiring special precautions include, but are not limited to: conductors of petroleum products, oxygen, chlorine, and toxic or flammable gases; natural gas in pipelines greater than 6 inches in diameter or pipelines operating at pressures greater than 60 psi (gage); underground electric supply system conductors or cables, with potential to ground of more than 300 volts, either directly buried or in duct or conduit which do not have concentric grounded conductors or other effectively grounded metal shields or sheaths.

Replace 2nd paragraph of section 5-1.36A, "General," with:

Contractor must notify the Engineer and the appropriate regional notification center for operators of subsurface installations at least 2 working days, but not more than 14 days, prior to performing any excavation or other work close to any underground pipeline, conduit, duct, wire or other structure. Regional notification centers include but are not limited to the following:

Underground Service Alert of Southern California (USA) at 811 or 1-800-422-4133

Add the following paragraphs to section 5-1.36C(1), "General":

Attention is directed to other obstructions as follows:

Special precaution shall be taken by the Contractor to protect existing utilities that may not be noticeably visible while working in the road shoulder areas.

Throughout the project, <u>utility poles fire hydrants</u>, <u>water meters</u>, <u>gas meters</u>, <u>water valves and gas valves</u> will be located in the construction area. If applicable, the Contractor shall perform his grading operations around those and construct embankment using pneumatic tampers to achieve the required compaction.

The Contractor shall considered as included in the price paid for pulverization, milling, removal of existing pavement, etc. No prior arrangements have been made with utility owners to lower, raise, or otherwise adjust existing manholes. It is the Contractor's responsibility to make such arrangements and adjustments, at no additional cost to the Department. Where utility owners do not participate in such arrangements, and finished grade of proposed pavement is above existing manholes, said manholes shall be marked and paved over.

The Contractor shall protect existing valve cans in place and adjust those that are adjustable to finished grade during paving operations. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for coordinating valve can adjustments with utility owners, at no additional cost to the Department. Where valve cans cannot be adjusted, and utility owners do not participate in coordinating adjustments, and finished grade is above existing valve cans, said valve cans shall be marked and paved over.

During construction operations, all County-owned signs shall be relocated to clear the way for the Contractor's operations. When construction is complete, the County-owned signs shall be installed in final position as designated by the Engineer.

Existing guideposts (paddles) that interfere with construction shall be removed and disposed of.

All existing sprinklers in conflict with construction shall be relocated, removed and/or capped to clear construction.

If required during construction operations, existing mailboxes shall be moved as necessary to clear the way for the Contractor's operations, but at all times shall be accessible for delivery. When construction is complete the mailboxes shall be installed in final position and posts shall be in a buried concrete anchor of mixor concrete or commercially available posthole concrete not less than 6 inches in width from the outside of post and 1.5 feet in depth from the finished ground surface.

Contractor shall replace in ind existing mailboxes. Existing newspaper boxes, posts and mounts shall be salvage and reused.

New mailboxes shall be fastened to the existing posts and mounts.

Replaced existing mailboxes shall become the property of the Contractor and shall be disposed of.

When construction is complete the mailboxes shall be installed in final position and posts shall be in a buried concrete anchor of minor concrete or commercially available posthole concrete not less than 6 inches in width from the outside of post and 1.5 feet in depth from the finished ground surface.

Contractor shall replace in kind existing mailboxes, newspaper boxes, posts and mounts.

Replaced existing mailboxes, newspaper boxes, posts and mounts shall become the property of the Contractor and shall be disposed of.

When construction is complete the mailboxes shall be installed in final position and posts shall be in a buried concrete anchor of minor concrete or commercially available posthole concrete not less than 6 inches in width from the outside of post and 1.5 feet in depth from the finished ground surface.

The contract unit price paid to remove and cap sprinklers shall be included in the **various contract items of work** and shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals, and for doing all the work necessary in relocating the sprinklers, complete in place, and disposing of surplus material and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of this section, not otherwise provided for, including furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals, including utility adjustments to grade, providing utility windows and coordination, and for doing all work involved shall be considered as included in the contract prices paid for the various items of work and no additional compensation will be allowed therefore.

Replace the 3rd paragraph of section 5-1.36C(3), "Nonhighway Rearrangement," with:

Supplemental Work – The rearrangement of utilities is anticipated work within the scope of the project.

Supplemental Work - Utilities consists of rearranging the <u>Currently none</u>). If other necessary underground infrastructure rearrangement is not described in the Contract, the Engineer may order you to perform the work. This other rearrangement is change order work.

The exact location and depth of the (currently toke) is not known. It is anticipated that (currently none) may be damaged by Contractor's operations.

Additional work falling within the scrope and enaracter of the existing contract items is considered as normal to the progress of construction and is addressed under section 4-1.05, "Changes and Extra Work," of the standard Specifications.

If the Contractor is delayed in the completion of the contract work as a direct result of the work described under Supplementar Work - Utilities, Contractor must submit a request for information (RFI) to request a delay-related time adjustment. The County may make a time adjustment under Section 8-1078, "Time Adjustments," of the Standard Specifications. The County does not make a parent adjustment for delays in the completion of the contract work as a direct result of the work described under Supplemental Work – Utilities.

Payment for Supplemental Work – Utilities is calculated under section 9-1.04, "Force Account," of the Standard Specifications and is cumulative over the duration of the contract.

Delete section 5-1.39C (2), "Plant Establishment Period of 3 Years or More."

Revise the phrase "2. Bar to arbitration (Pub Cont Code § 10240.2)" in the fourth paragraph of section 5-1.43A, "General," with:

Bar to pursue the claim in a court of law.

Replace section 5-1.43E, "Alternative Dispute Resolution," with the following:

5-1.43E Dispute Resolution for Claims subject to Public Contract Code sections 9204, 20104, 20104.2, 20104.4 and/or 20104.6.

Claims between the County and the Contractor shall be resolved in accordance with Public Contract Code section 9204 (which is a new law and applies to all public works contracts entered on or after January 1, 2017), as well as Public Contract Code sections 20104, 20104.2, 20104.4 and 20104.6 (if applicable), provided, however, that Public Contract Code section 20104.2(a) shall not supersede the requirements of the Contract Documents with respect to the Contractor's notification to the County of such claim or extend the time for giving of such notice as provided in the Contract Documents. The entire text of Public Contract Code sections 9204, 20104, 20104.2, 20104.4 and 20104.6 is incorporated herein and found at the end of these Special Provisions.

Please note that pursuant to Public Contract Code section 9204(c)(1), a "claim" means the following:

a separate demand by a contractor sent by registered mail or certified mail with return receipt requested, for one or more of the following: (1) A time extension, including, without limitation, for relief from damages or pen ties for delay assessed by a public entity under a contract for a public works project. (F) Payment by the public entity of money or damages arising from work a new, or on behalf of, the contractor pursuant to the contract for a public works project and payment for which is not otherwise expressly provided or to which the claim art is not otherwise entitled. (C) Payment of an amount that is disputed by the public entity.

Add section 5-1.43G, 'Civil Action," which reads:

5-1.43G Civil Action

Any dispute which cannot be resolved between the Parties by first following the applicable and required potential claims and dispute resolution provisions stated in this section 5-1.43, may then be resolved through literate in accourt of competent jurisdiction of the State of California. Each Party hereby waives any law or rule of court that would allow them to request or demand a change of venue. If any third party brings an action or claim concerning this Contract, the Parties hereto agree to use their best efforts to obtain a change of venue to the Superior Court of California, San Bernardino County, San Bernardino District.

7 LEGAL RELATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITY TO THE PUBLIC

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Add the following paragraphs to section 7-1.02I(2), "Nondiscrimination":

Contractor must comply with section 7-1.02l (2), "Nondiscrimination" of the Standard Specifications, and to the "Standard California Nondiscrimination Construction Contract Specifications" set forth therein.

During the term of the Contract, Contractor and its subcontractors shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, age, or military and veteran status. Contractor shall comply with Executive Orders 11246, 11375, 11625, 12138, 12432, 12250, 13672, Title VI & VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the California Fair Housing and Employment Act and other applicable Federal, State of California and County laws and regulations and policies relating to equal employment and contracting opportunities, including laws and regulations hereafter enacted. Contractor shall include the nondiscrimination and compliance provisions of this paragraph in all subcontracts to perform work under the contract.

Replace the 2nd and 3rd paragraph of section 7-1.00 (12), "Wages," with:

Pursuant to section 1773 of the Labor Code, the general ng rates of wages in the San Bernardino County have been determined and are listed in the State of California Department Prevailing Director's General . Wage Industrial Relations (https://www.dir.ca.gov/OPRL/DPreWageDeterminal n.htm). In addition, these wages are set forth in the General Prevailing Wage Rates included in these Special Provisions. Contractor and subcontractors shall not payless than the prevailing wage. Copies of the prevailing wage rates are also on file at the San Bernardino County Department of Public Works Contracts Division office (address identified above) and shall be made available to any interested party on request. A copy of the determination of the Director of prevailing rate of per diem wages shall be posted at each job site. More specifically, the Contractor shall post the general prevailing wage rates at a prominent pla the b site (Labor Code section 1773.2).

Future effective general prevailing wage rates, which have been predetermined and are on file with the California Department of Industrial Relations are referenced but not printed in the general prevailing was a rate.

The Contractor shall positive general prevailing wage rates at a prominent place at the job site (Labor Code section 1773.2).

LABOR CODE REQUIREMENTS REGARDING REGISTRATION AS CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR REQUIRED PRIOR TO BID PROPOSAL SUBMISSION: Contractor shall comply with Labor Code section 1771.1, including, but not limited to, the following requirements: (1) no contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a bid proposal for a public works project unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 (with limited exceptions from this requirement for bid purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)); (2) no contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract for public work or perform work on a public works project unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5; (3) this Project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations; (4) Contractor shall post job site notices regarding compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations; and (5) Contractor must submit certified payroll at least monthly to the Labor Commissioner in a format prescribed by the Labor Commissioner.

As provided in Labor Code section 1771.1:

- (a) A contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid to be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of any contract for public work, as defined in this chapter, unless currently registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5. It is not a violation of this section for an unregistered contractor to submit a bid that is authorized by Section 7029.1 of the Business and Professions Code or by Section 10167 of 20103.5 of the Public Contract Code, provided the contractor is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 at the time the contract is a valided.
- (b) Notice of the requirement described in subdivision (a) shall be included in all bid invitations and public works contracts and a bid shall not be accepted nor any contract or subcontract entered into without proof of the contractor or subcontractor's current registration to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5.
- (c) An inadvertent error in listing a subcontractor who is not registered pursuant to Section 1725.5 in a bid proposal shall not be grounds for filing a bid protest or grounds for considering the bid nonresponsive, provided that any of the following apply:
- (1) The subcollector's registered prior to the bid opening.
- (2) Within 24 hour after the bid opening, the subcontractor is registered and has paid the penalty registration fee specified in subparagraph (E) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 1725.5.
- (3) The subcontractor is replaced by another registered subcontractor pursuant to Section 4107 of the Public Contract Code.
- (d) Failure by a subcontractor to be registered to perform public work as required by subdivision (a) shall be grounds under Section 4107 of the Public Contract Code for the contractor, with the consent of the awarding authority, to substitute a subcontractor who is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 in place of the unregistered subcontractor.
- (e) The department shall maintain on its Internet Web site a list of contractors who are currently registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5.

- (f) A contract entered into with any contractor or subcontractor in violation of subdivision (a) shall be subject to cancellation, provided that a contract for public work shall not be unlawful, void, or voidable solely due to the failure of the awarding body, contractor, or any subcontractor to comply with the requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section.
- (g) If the Labor Commissioner or his or her designee determines that a contractor or subcontractor engaged in the performance of any public work contract without having been registered in accordance with this section, the contractor or subcontractor shall forfeit, as a civil penalty to the state, one hundred dollars (\$100) for each day of work performed in violation of the registration requirement, not to exceed an aggregate penalty of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) in addition to any penalty registration fee assessed pursuant to clause (ii) of subparagraph (E) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 1725.5.
- (h) (1) In addition to, or in lieu of, any other penalty or sanction authorized pursuant to this chapter, a higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor who is found to have entered into a subcontract with an unregistered lower tier subcontractor to perform any public work in violation of the requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section shall be subject to forfeit re, as a civil penalty to the state, of one hundred dollars (\$100) for each dry he thregistered lower tier subcontractor performs work in violation of the registration requirement, not to exceed an aggregate penalty of ten thousand dollars (\$13,000).
- (2) The Labor Commissioner shall use the same standards specified in subparagraph (A) of paragraph (2) of subtivision (a) of Section 1775 when determining the severity of the violation and what penalty to assess, and may waive the penalty for a first time violation that was unintentional and did not hinder the Labor Commissioner's ability to monitor and enforce compliance with the requirements of this chapter.
- (3) A higher tiered public yarks contractor or subcontractor shall not be liable for penalties assessed pursuant to paragraph (1) if the lower tier subcontractor's performance is in violation of the requirements of Section 1725.5 due to the revocation of a previously approved registration.
- (4) A subcontractor shall not be liable for any penalties assessed against a higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor pursuant to paragraph (1). A higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor may not require a lower tiered subcontractor to indemnify or otherwise be liable for any penalties pursuant to paragraph (1).
- (i) The Labor Commissioner or his or her designee shall issue a civil wage and penalty assessment, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1741, upon determination of penalties pursuant to subdivision (g) and subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (h). Review of a civil wage and penalty assessment issued under this subdivision may be requested in accordance with the provisions of Section 1742. The regulations of the Director of Industrial Relations, which govern proceedings for review of civil wage and penalty assessments and the withholding of contract payments under Article 1 (commencing with Section 1720) and Article 2 (commencing with Section 1770), shall apply.
- (j) (1) Where a contractor or subcontractor engages in the performance of any public work contract without having been registered in violation of the

requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section, the Labor Commissioner shall issue and serve a stop order prohibiting the use of the unregistered contractor or the unregistered subcontractor on all public works until the unregistered contractor or unregistered subcontractor is registered. The stop order shall not apply to work by registered contractors or subcontractors on the public work.

- (2) A stop order may be personally served upon the contractor or subcontractor by either of the following methods:
- (A) Manual delivery of the order to the contractor or subcontractor personally.
- (B) Leaving signed copies of the order with the person who is apparently in charge at the site of the public work and by thereafter mailing copies of the order by first class mail, postage prepaid to the contractor or subcontractor at one of the following:
- (i) The address of the contractor or subcontractor on file with either the Secretary of State or the Contractors' State License Board.
- (ii) If the contractor or subcontractor has no address on file with the Secretary of State or the Contractors' State License Board, the address of the public work.
- (3) The stop order shall be effective immediately uson service and shall be subject to appeal by the party contracting with the unregistered contractor or subcontractor, by the unregistered contractor or subcontractor, or both. The appeal, hearing, and any further review of the bearing decision shall be governed by the procedures, time limits, and other result ements specified in subdivision (a) of Section 238.1.
- (4) Any employee of an unregisted contractor or subcontractor who is affected by a work stoppage ordered by be commissioner pursuant to this subdivision shall be paid at his or her regular hously prevailing wage rate by that employer for any hours the employee would have worked but for the work stoppage, not to exceed 10 days.
- (k) Failure of a contractor or subcontractor, owner, director, officer, or managing agent of the contractor of subcontractor to observe a stop order issued and served upon kins or her pursuant to subdivision (j) is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by in prisonment in county jail not exceeding 60 days or by a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or both.
- (I) This section shall apply to any bid proposal submitted on or after March 1, 2015, and any contract for public work entered into on or after April 1, 2015. This section shall also apply to the performance of any public work, as defined in this chapter, on or after January 1, 2018, regardless of when the contract for public work was entered.
- (m) Penalties received pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the State Public Works Enforcement Fund established by Section 1771.3 and shall be used only for the purposes specified in that section.
- (n) This section shall not apply to work performed on a public works project of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) or less when the project is for construction, alteration, demolition, installation, or repair work or to work performed on a public works project of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) or less when the project is for maintenance work.

- 3. Wage rates paid are at least those required by the Contract

The Department allows the use of a form with identical wording as the Statement of Compliance form provided by the Department.

Submitted certified payrolls for hauling and delivering ready-mixed concrete must be accompanied by a written time record. The time record must include:

- 1. Truck driver's full name and address
- 2. Name and address of the factory or batching plant
- 3. Time the concrete was loaded at the factory or batching plant
- Time the truck returned to the factory or batching plant 4.

5. Truck driver's signature certifying under penalty of perjury that the information contained in this written time record is true and correct

Make certified payroll records available for inspection at all reasonable hours at your main office on the following basis:

Furnish the Department the location of the records. Include the street address, city, and county. Furnish the Department a notification of a location and address change within 5 business days of the change.

Comply with a request for the records within 10 days after you receive a written request. If you do not comply within this period, the Department wants as from progress payments a \$100 penalty for each day or part of a day for each worker until you comply. You are not assessed this penalty for a subcontractor's failure to comply with Labor Code § 1776.

The Department withholds from progress payments for delinquent or inadequate records (Labor Code § 1771.5). If you have not submitted an adequate record by the month's 15th day for the period ending on or before the 1st of that month, the Department withholds up to 10 percent of the monthly progress estimate, exclusive of mobilization. The Department does not withhold more than \$10,000 or less than \$1,000.

Certified payroll records are required to be submitted weekly to the Engineer during the term of construction.

Contractor and subcontractors must furnish electronic certified payroll records directly to the Labor Commissioner (aka Division of Labor Standards Enforcement) pursuant to Labor Code section 1771.1 identified herein.

Failure to meet the requirements above will subject the contractor to sanctions/withholding of contract payments as allowed by law for any delinquent or inadequate certified payroll records. Payroll violations are required to be reported to the State of California and/or federal government.

Add the following paragraph to section 7-1.02K (5), "Working Hours":

The normal construction working hours are 7:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. The Contractor must request and receive prior written approval (at least 24 hours in advance) from the Engineer to work beyond or outside of these normal working

hours. If the Contractor works beyond or outside of these normal working hours without requesting and receiving prior written approval from the Engineer, then any overtime or other costs incurred by the County (for example, County inspector costs) resulting from the Contractor's working beyond or outside of these normal working hours may be deducted from the progress payments that are due the Contractor. The County's decision to approve or disapprove the Contractor working beyond or outside of the normal working hours is at the sole discretion of the Engineer.

Replace items 1, 3 and 4 in the list in the 22nd paragraph of section 7-1.04, "PUBLIC SAFETY," with:

- 1. Excavations: Where the near edge of the excavation is within 15 feet from the edge of an open traffic lane except:
 - a. Trenches less than 1-foot wide for irrigation pipe or electrical conduit, or excavations less than 1-foot in diameter;
 - b. Excavations parallel to the lane for the purpose or pavement widening or reconstruction; and/or
 - c. Excavations within temporary traffic control zones that do not extend beyond a single daylight period, for these zones alternative parrier systems should be considered.
- 3. Storage areas: When material or equipment is stored within 12 feet of the edge of an open traffic lane and the storage is not otherwise prohibited by the Contract
- 4. Height differentials: When construction operations create a height differential greater than 1 foot within 15 feet of the edge of traffic lane

Add the following sentences to be 17th paragraph of section 7-1.04, "PUBLIC AFETY":

Do not move or temporarily surpend anything over pedestrians unless the pedestrians are protected. The Contractor must furnish, erect and maintain those fences, Type K temporary railing, barricades, lights, signs and other devices and take such other protective measures that are necessary to provent accidents or damage or injury to the public, especially pedestrians who travel through the work zone area. Where no other means of pedestrian passage through construction area is available, the Contractor must provide detours for pedestrian travel. A drawing of the proposed pedestrian detour with all signage, barricades, fencing, delineators, etc. as necessary for safe pedestrian travel through or around the work zone area must be submitted to the Engineer as part of the Traffic Control Plan as specified in the Traffic Control System section of these Special Provisions.

Replace the 23rd paragraph of section 7-1.04, "PUBLIC SAFETY," with:

Where lanes are adjacent to the area where the work is being performed or equipment is operated, including shoulders, the adjacent lane must be closed under any of the following conditions unless otherwise provided in the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions:

- 1. Work is off the traveled way but within 6 feet of the edge of the traveled way, and the approach speed is greater than 45 miles per hour
- 2. Work is off the traveled way but within 3 feet of the edge of the traveled way, and the approach speed is less than 45 miles per hour

Add the following sentences to the 25th paragraph of section 7-1.04, "PUBLIC SAFETY":

Type K temporary railing must conform to the provisions in Section 12-3.08, "Type K Temporary Railing," of the Standard Specifications. Type K temporary railing, conforming to the details shown on Standard Plans T3A and T3B or approved equal by the Engineer may be used.

The locations of Type K temporary railing shall be shown on Traffic Control Plans for review and approval by the Engineer. The Contractor must comply with the Traffic Control System section elsewhere in these Special Provisions.

Contractor may propose to the Engineer an alternative to the use of Type K temporary railing and/or crash cushions in areas where the use of these devices is anticipated to be for a relatively short period of time but no more than five working days. Approval of the Engineer for the use of the proposed alternatives shall not relieve the contractor from being solely responsible for any damages resulting from the use of these alternatives in accordance with section 7-1.05A "General" of these Special Provisions.

Reflectors on Type K temporary railing must conform to the rowsigns in "Prequalified and Tested Materials for Traffic Control Devices" of these Special Provisions. Temporary crash cushion modules must conform to the specifications by sec ion 12-3.15, "TEMPORARY CRASH CUSHION MODULE" of the Standard Specifications.

Add the following paragraph between the 26th and 27th paragraphs of section 7-1.04, "PUBLIC SAPATY":

Open trenches left open overnight must be potected by Type K temporary railing or other approved temporary traffic barrier as determined by the Engineer.

Replace section 7-1.05A, "General," with:

7-1.05A General

Indemnification - To the remest extent possible permitted by law, Contractor assumes liability for and agrees, at the contractor's sole cost and expense, to promptly and fully indemnify, defend (with counsel reasonably approved by County) (even if the allegations are false, fraudulent, or groundless), and hold harmless the County and its authorized officers, employees, agents and volunteers (Indemnitees) from and against any and all claims (including claims against the County seeking compensation for labor performed or materials used or furnished to be used in the work or alleged to have been furnished on the project, including all incidental or consequential damages resulting to the County from such claims). allegations, actions, suits, arbitrations, administrative proceedings, regulatory proceedings, or other legal proceedings, demands, losses, costs, damages, judgments, liens, stop notices, penalties, anticipated losses of revenue and/or liability, and expenses (including, but not limited to, any fees of accountants, attorneys, experts or other professionals, or investigation expenses) arising out of, resulting from, or in any way (either directly or indirectly) related to the contract, the work, the project or any breach of the Contract by Contractor (or any of its officers, agents, employees, subcontractors, or any person performing any of the work, or from any cause whatsoever, including the acts, errors or omissions of any person and for any

costs or expenses incurred by the Indemnitees on account of any claim except where such indemnification is prohibited by law. This indemnification provision shall apply regardless of the existence or degree of fault of indemnitees. The Contractor's indemnification obligation applies to the Indemnitee's "passive" negligence but does not apply to the Indemnitee's "sole" or "active" negligence or "willful misconduct" within the meaning of Civil Code section 2782 provided such "active" negligence or "willful misconduct" is determined by agreement of the parties or by findings of a court. In instances where an Indemnitee's "active" negligence accounts for only a percentage of the liability for the claim involved, the obligation of the Contractor will be for that entire percentage of liability for the claim not attributable to the "active" negligence or "willful misconduct" of the Indemnitees. The County shall be consulted with regard to any proposed settlement.

The duty of the Contractor to indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees includes the separate and independent duty to defend the Indemnitees, which duty arises immediately upon receipt by Contractor of the tender of any claim from the County. The Contractor's obligation to defend the County shall be at Contractor's sole expense, and not be excused because of the Contractor's inability to evaluate liability or because the Contractor evaluates liability and determines that the Contractor is not liable. The duty to defend shall apply whether or not a claim has merit or is meritless, or which involves claims or allegations that any or all of the Indemnitees were actively, passively, or concurrently negligent, or which otherwise asserts that the Indemnitees are responsible, in whole or in part, for my claim. The Contractor shall respond within thirty (30) calendar days to the tender or any claim for defense and/or indemnity by the County, unless the County agrees in writing to an extension of this time. The defense provided to the Indemnitees by Contractor shall be by well qualified, adequately insured, and experienced legal counsel acceptable to the County Counsel.

It is the intent of the parties to the Contract that the Contractor and its subcontractors of all tiers shall provide the Indemnites with the broadest defense and indemnity permitted by law. In the event that any of the defense indemnity, or hold harmless provisions are found to be ambiguous, or in conflict with one another, it is the parties' intent that the broadest and most expansive interpretation in layor of providing defense and/or indemnity to the Indemnitees be given effect.

Contractor shall ensure, by written subcontract agreement, that each of Contractor's subcontractors of every tier shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees with respect to all claims arising out, in connection with, or in any way related to each such subcontractor's work in the same manner in which Contractor is required to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold the Indemnitees harmless. In the event Contractor fails to obtain such defense and indemnity obligations from its subcontractors as required herein, Contractor agrees to be fully responsible to the Indemnitees according to the terms of this Section.

Contractor's indemnification and defense obligations set for in this Section are separate and independent from the insurance requirements and do not limit, in any way, the applicability, scope, or obligations set forth in such insurance requirements. The purchase of insurance by the Contractor with respect to the obligations required herein shall in no event be construed as fulfillment or discharge of such obligations.

Contractor's obligations under this Section are binding on Contractor's and its subcontractors' successors, heirs and assigns and shall survive the completion of the work or termination of the Contractor's performance of the work.

Replace section 7-1.06 with:

7-1.06 INSURANCE

<u>Additional Insured</u> – All policies, except for the Workers' Compensation, Errors and Omissions and Professional Liability policies, shall contain endorsements naming the <u>San Bernardino County</u> (a separate, legal public entity), and the <u>San Bernardino County Flood Control District</u> (a separate, legal public entity), collectively referred to in this section as the County, and all of their officers, employees, agents and volunteers as additional insureds with respect to liabilities arising out of the performance of services hereunder.

The additional insured endorsements shall not limit the scope of coverage for the County as well as any other entities named herein to vicarious liability but shall allow coverage for the County as well as any other entities named herein to the full extent provided by the policy. Such additional insured coverage shall be at least as bload at Additional Insured (Form B) endorsement form ISO, CG 201011 85.

<u>Waiver of Subrogation Rights</u> – The Contractor shall require the carriers of required coverages to waive all rights of subrogation against the County, its officers, employees, agents, volunteers, contractors and subcontractors as well as any other entities named herein. All general or auto liability insurance coverage provided shall not prohibit the Contractor and Contractor's employees or agents from vaiving the right of subrogation prior to a loss or claim. The Contractor hereby waives all rights of subrogation against the County as well as any other entities named herein.

<u>Policies Primary and Non-Contributory</u> – All policies required herein are to be primary and non-contributory with any incura ce of self-insurance programs carried or administered by the County or any other entities name, herein.

Severability of Interests The Contractor agrees to ensure that coverage provided to meet these requirements is applied ble separately to each insured and there will be no cross liability exclusions that preclude soverage for suits between the Contractor and the County or between the County and any other insured or additional insured under the policy.

<u>Proof of Coverage</u> – The Contractor shall furnish Certificates of Insurance to the County Department administering the contract evidencing the insurance coverage at the time the contract is executed, additional endorsements, as required shall be provided prior to the commencement of performance of services hereunder, which certificates shall provide that such insurance shall not be terminated or expire without thirty (30) days written notice to the Department, and Contractor shall maintain such insurance from the time Contractor commences performance of services hereunder until the completion of such services. Within fifteen (15) days of the commencement of this contract, the Contractor shall furnish a copy of the Declarations page for all applicable policies and will provide complete certified copies of the policies and endorsements immediately upon request.

<u>Acceptability of Insurance Carrier</u> – Unless otherwise approved by Risk Management, insurance shall be written by insurers authorized to do business in the State of California and

must have a minimum Best's Insurance Guide rating of "A-" and minimum Financial Size Category of "VII" according to A. M. Best Company, Inc., website http://www.ambest.com/.

<u>Deductibles and Self-Insured Retention</u> – Any and all deductibles or self-insured retentions in excess of \$10,000 shall be declared to and approved by Risk Management.

<u>Failure to Procure Coverage</u> – In the event that any policy of insurance required under this contract does not comply with the requirements, is not procured or is canceled and not replaced, the County has the right but not the obligation or duty to cancel the contract or obtain insurance if it deems necessary and any premiums paid by the County will be promptly reimbursed by the Contractor or County payments to the Contractor will be reduced to pay for County purchased insurance.

Insurance Review – Insurance requirements are subject to periodic review by the County. The Director of Risk Management or designee is authorized, but not required, to reduce, waive or suspend any insurance requirements, whenever Risk Management determines that any of the required insurance is not available, is unreasonably priced, or is not needed to protect the interests of the County. In addition, if the Department of Risk Management determines that heretofore unreasonably priced or unavailable types of insurance coverage or coverage limits become reasonably priced or available, the Director of Risk Management or designee is authorized, but not required, to change the above insurance requirements to require additional types of insurance coverage or higher coverage limits provides that any such change is reasonable in light of past claims against the County, inflation or any other item reasonably related to the County's risk.

Any change requiring additional types of insurance coverage or higher coverage limits must be made by amendment to this contract. Contract agrees to execute any such amendment within thirty (30) days of receipt.

Any failure, actual or alleged, on the part of the County to monitor or enforce compliance with any of the insurance and indemnification equirements will not be deemed as a waiver of any rights on the part of the County.

The Contractor agrees to provide assurance set forth in accordance with the requirements herein. If the Contractor uses existing coverage to comply with these requirements and that coverage does not meet the specified requirements, the Contractor agrees to amend, supplement or endorse the existing coverage to do so.

Without in anyway a fecune the indemnity herein provided and in addition thereto, the Contractor shall secure and maintain throughout the contract term the following types of insurance with limits as shown:

<u>Workers' Compensation/Employers Liability</u> – A program of Workers' Compensation insurance or a state-approved self-insurance program in an amount and form to meet all applicable requirements of the Labor Code of the State of California, including Employer's Liability with \$250,000 limits covering all persons including volunteers providing services on behalf of the Contractor and all risks to such persons under this contract.

If Contractor has no employees, it may certify or warrant to the County that it does not currently have any employees or individuals who are defined as "employees" under the Labor Code and the requirement for Workers' Compensation coverage will be waived by the County's Director of Risk Management.

With respect to Contractors that are non-profit corporations organized under California or Federal Law, volunteers for such entities are required to be covered by Workers' Compensation insurance.

<u>Commercial/General Liability Insurance</u> – The Contractor shall carry General Liability Insurance covering all operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor providing coverage for bodily injury and property damage with minimum combined single limits, per occurrence, as follows:

- (g) Two million dollars (\$2,000,000) general aggregate liteit.

<u>Automobile Liability Insurance</u> — Primary insurance coverage shall be written on ISO Business Auto coverage form for all owned, hired and hir owned automobiles or symbol 1 (any auto). The policy shall have minimum combined single writ for bodily injury and property damage, per occurrence, as follows:

If the Contractor is transporting one or more non-employee passengers in performance of contract services, the automobile liability policy shall have a combined single limit of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for bod by injury and property damage per occurrence.

If the Contractor owns no autos in non-owned auto endorsement to the General Liability policy described above is a contacle.

<u>Umbrella Liability Insurance</u> – An umbrella (over primary) or excess policy may be used to comply with limits or other primary coverage requirements. When used, the umbrella policy shall apply to bodily injury/property damage, personal injury/advertising injury and shall include a 'dropdown" provision providing primary coverage for any liability not covered by the primary policy. The coverage shall also apply to automobile liability.

<u>Course of Construction/Installation Property Insurance</u> – A policy providing all risk, including theft coverage for all properties and materials to be used on the project. The insurance policy shall not have any coinsurance penalty.

<u>Continuing Products/Completed Operations Liability Insurance</u> – A policy with a limit of not less than five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for each occurrence for at least three years following substantial completion of the work on projects over one million dollars (\$1,000,000).


<u>Subcontractor Insurance Requirements</u> – The Contractor agrees to require all parties or subcontractors, including architects or others it hires or contracts with related to the performance of this contract to provide insurance covering the contracted operations with the

basic requirements and the insurance specifications for all contracts as delineated herein, (including waiver of subrogation rights) and naming the County as well as any other entities named herein as additional insureds. The Contractor agrees to monitor and review all such coverage and assumes all responsibility ensuring that such coverage is provided as required herein.

Delete section 7-1.07B, "Seal Coat Claims."

Delete section 7-1.11, "FEDERAL LAWS FOR FEDERAL-AID CONTRACTS."

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Replace section 8-1.02, "SCHEDULE" with:

8-1.02 PROGRESS SCHEDULE

After contract award, and prior to construction, the Contractor shall submit to the Engineer a baseline progress schedule as part of the pre-construction submittals. The Contractor shall furnish the schedule in both printed and electronic (Microsoft Excel or equivalent) format. If the Contractor cannot furnish the schedule in Microsoft Excel format, then another format approved by the Engineer shall be used. The schedule shall show the construction activities (including the controlling activity(ies)), order in which the Contractor proposes to carry out the work, the dates on which the Contractor will start the several salient features of the work (including procurement of materials, plant, and equipment), and the contemplated dates for completing those salient features. The progress schedules submitted shall be consistent in all respects with the time and order of work requirements of the contract.

Progress schedule updates are also required to be submitted during construction, within 10 working days of the Engineer's written request. Failure of the Contractor to submit progress schedule updates within the required time frame may result in the vithholding of progress payments.

Replace 1st paragraph of section 8-1.03, "PRECONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE," with:

After contract award, and prior to construction, a pre-construction conference / meeting will be held at a time and location determined by the Engineer, for the purpose of discussing with the Contractor the scope of work, contract drawings, specifications, existing conditions, materials to be ordered, equipment to be used, utilities, submitters and all essential matters pertaining to the prosecution of and the satisfactory completion of the project as required. The Contractor's representative at this conference shall include all major superintendents for the work and may include subcontractors.

Revice 8-1.04A, "General," with:

8-1.04A General

After contract award, and prior to the pre-construction conference, the Engineer will issue a Notice to Proceed with Substitutes to the Contractor, and the Contractor shall then begin submitting all require submittals necessary to begin work, as listed below. Failure to provide the required submittals within the time frame specified in the Notice to Proceed with Submittals may subject the Contractor to being charged working days for each and every day after the submittal due date.

Prior to construction, the following submittals are required:

- 1. Approved baseline progress schedule
- 2. Approved Statement of Compliance with Sections 1509 and 1510 of the CalOSHA Construction Safety Orders
- 3. Approved Fire Safety Plan
- 4. Approved Notice to Residents, in English and Spanish
- 5. Approved Notice of Materials to be Used
- 6. Approved Subcontracting Request
- 7. Approved Staging Area

- 8. Approved Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) or Water Pollution Control Plan (WPCP)
- 9. All other required environmental submittals.
- 10. Approved Traffic Control Plan
- 11. Valid proof of approved permits, if applicable
- 12. List of personnel assigned to the project
- 13. Emergency contact list
- 14. List of Equipment to be Used, which will include a description of each piece of equipment, the name and model number of each piece of equipment, and a unique ID number for each piece of equipment, which will be stenciled on each piece of equipment.
- 15. Any other pre-construction submittals deemed necessary by the Engineer.

Replace 8-1.04B, "Standard Start," with

8-1.04B Standard Start

After the pre-construction conference and prior to construction, he Engineer will issue the Notice to Proceed with Construction to the Contractor. The conflactor shall begin construction work within 15 days (excluding Saturdays, Sundays and holicays) after the Notice to Proceed with Construction. The Notice to Proceed with Construction is at the sole discretion of the County. The First Working Day Designated will be the date of the Notice to Proceed with Construction or the date of beginning construction work, whichever is later. In no case will the First Working Day Designated be later than 15 days after the Notice to Proceed with Construction, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays. The Department does not adjust time for starting before the First Working Tay.

The Contractor shall diligently prosecute the work to completion before the expiration of

EICHTY (80) WORKING DAYS

starting with the First Working Day Designated. (Refer to the definition of "Working Day" in section 1-1.07B of the e Special Provisions.) However, as provided in section 8-1.04A, the failure by Contractor to provide the required submittals identified in the Notice to Proceed with Submittals within the time frame specified in the Notice to Proceed with Submittals may subject the Contractor to being charged working days for each day and every day after the submittal due date.

Replace 8-1.10A, "General", with:

8-1.10A General

The Department specifies liquidated damages (Pub Cont Code § 10226). Liquidated damages, if any, accrue starting on the 1st day after the expiration of the working days through the day of Contract acceptance except as specified in sections 8-1.10B and 8-1.10C.

The Department withholds liquidated damages before the accrual date if the anticipated liquidated damages may exceed the value of the remaining work.

Replace section 9-1.02C, "Final Pay Item Quantities," with:

9-1.02C Final Pay Items

When an item of work is designated as (F) or (S-F) in the Bid Sheet, the estimated quantity for that item of work shall be the final pay quantity, unless the dimensions of any portion of that item are revised by the Engineer, for the item or any portion on the item is eliminated. If the dimensions of any portion of the item are revised, and the revision, result in an increase or decrease in the estimated quantity of that item of work, the final pay quantity for the item will be revised in the amount represented by the changes in the dimensions, except as otherwise provided for minor structures in Section 51-7.01D, "Toyment." If a final pay item is eliminated, the estimated quantity for the item will be eliminated. If a portion of a final pay item is eliminated, the final pay quantity will be revised in the amount represented by the eliminated portion of the item of work.

Delete Section 9-1.02D, "Quantities of Aggregate and Other Roadway Materials."

Delete the 11th, 12th, 13th, and 14th paragraphs in section 9-1.03, "PAYMENT SCOPE."

Replace the reference in the 16th paragraph to "Pub Cont Code §§ 10262 and 10262.5" in section 9-1.03, "PAYMENT SCOPE," with "Business and Professions Code section 7108.5."

Delete section 9-1.07 "PAYMENT ADJUSTMENTS FOR PRICE INDEX FLUCTUATIONS."

Add the following paragraphs to section 9-1.16, "PROGRESS PAYMENTS":

PAYMENTS – Attention is directed to the provisions in this Section 9-1.16, "Progress Payments," and Section 9-1.16E, "Withholds," of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

County and Contractor acknowledge and agree that Public Contract Code section 7201 applies to all contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2012, between a public entity and an original contractor, between an original contractor and a subcontractor, and between all subcontractors thereunder relating to the construction of any public work of improvement. Pursuant to Public Contract Code section 7201 the County will retain 5% of the payments made to Contractor and total retention proceeds withheld by County shall not exceed 5% of the contract price. However, this limitation does not apply to amounts retained by County in the

event of a good faith dispute or as required by law. Contractor shall also comply with Public Contract Code section 7201 in its retention of payments/contract amount to subcontractors.

The retention will be held for 35 days following the recordation of the Notice of Completion, at which time the County Auditor will issue a warrant for the withheld funds.

Contractor shall accept all payments from County via electronic funds transfer (EFT) directly deposited into the Contractor's designated checking or other banking account. Contractor shall promptly comply with directions and accurately complete forms provided by County required to process EFT payments.

Contractor may upon written request, and at their expense deposit substitute securities found in Government Code section 16430 as authorized by the Public Contract Code section 22300 in lieu of retention monies withheld to insure performance.

Partial payment for materials that are furnished but are not incorporated in the work may be made to the Contractor at the sole discretion of the Engineer.

The provisions of Public Contract Code section 20104.50, cited immediately below and at the end of these Special Provisions, dealing with the modification, performance and payment of public works contracts are incorporated herein.

20104.50.

- (a)(1) It is the intent of the Legislature in election this section to require all local governments to pay their contractors on time so that these contractors can meet their own obligations. In requiring prompt payment by all local governments, the Legislature hereby finds and declares that the prompt payment of outstanding receipts is not merely a municipal afair, but is, instead, a matter of statewide concern. (2) It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this article to fully occupy the field of public policy relating to the prompt payment of local governments' outstanding receipts. The Legislature finds and declares that all government officials, including those in local government, must set a standard of prompt payment that any business in the private sector which may contract for services should look towards for guidance.
- (b) Any local gency which fails to make any progress payment within 30 days after receipt of an undisputed and properly submitted payment request from a contractor on a construction contract shall pay interest to the contractor equivalent to the legal rate set forth in subdivision (a) of Section 685.010 of the Code of Civil Procedure.
- (c) Upon receipt of a payment request, each local agency shall act in accordance with both of the following:
- (1) Each payment request shall be reviewed by the local agency as soon as practicable after receipt for the purpose of determining that the payment request is a proper payment request.
- (2) Any payment request determined not to be a proper payment request suitable for payment shall be returned to the contractor as soon as practicable, but not later than seven days, after receipt. A request returned pursuant to this paragraph shall be accompanied

by a document setting forth in writing the reasons why the payment request is not proper.

- (d) The number of days available to a local agency to make a payment without incurring interest pursuant to this section shall be reduced by the number of days by which a local agency exceeds the seven-day return requirement set forth in paragraph (2) of subdivision €.
- (e) For purposes of this article:
- (1) A "local agency" includes, but is not limited to, a city, including a charter city, a county, and a city and county, and is any public entity subject to this part.
- (2) A "progress payment" includes all payments due contractors, except that portion of the final payment designated by the contract as retention earnings.
- (3) A payment request shall be considered properly executed if funds are available for payment of the payment request, and payment is not delayed due to an audit inquiry by the financial officer of the local agency.
- (f) Each local agency shall require that this atticle, or a summary thereof, be set forth in the terms of any contract subject to this article.

Delete the 2nd sentence in section 9-1.16D(1), "General."

Delete reference to "Pub Cont Cade § 10201.5" in section 9-1.16E(1), "General."

Replace "may" with "shall" in the 1st sentence of section 9-1.16E(4), "Stop Notice Withholds."

9-1.17D(1) Final Payment and Claims - After acceptance by the Director, the Engineer will make a proposed final estimate in writing of the total amount payable to the Contractor, including therein an itemization of said amount, segregated as to contract item quantities, extra work and any other basis for payments, and shall also show therein all deductions made or to be made for prior payments and amounts to be kept or retained under the provisions of the contract. All prior estimates and payments shall be subject to correction in the proposed final estimate. The Contractor shall submit written approval of the proposed final estimate or a written statement of claims as provided below.

On the Contractor's approval, or if he files no claim, the Engineer will issue a final estimate in writing in accordance with the proposed final estimate submitted to the Contractor and within 30 days thereafter the County will pay the entire sum so found to be due. Such final estimate and payment thereon shall be conclusive and binding against both parties to the contract on all questions relating to the amount of work done and the compensation payable therefor, except as otherwise provided in Sections 9-1.03C, "Records," and 9-1.09, "Clerical Errors."

If the Contractor files a claim(s), the Engineer will issue a semifinal estimate in accordance with the proposed final estimate submitted to the Contractor and within 30 days thereafter the County will pay the sum so found to be due. Such semifinal estimate any payment thereon shall be conclusive and binding against both parties to the contract on all questions relating to the amount of work done and the compensation payable therefor, except insofar as affected by the claim(s) filed within the time and in the manner required hereunder and except as otherwise provided in Sections 9-1.03C. "Records." and 9-1.09. "Clerical Errors."

For additional claims procedures and rights under the Public Contract Code, please see 5-1.43E, "Dispute Resolution for Claims subject to Public Contract Code sections 9204, 20104, 20104.2, 20104.4 and/or 20104.6," of these Special Provisions.

The Contractor shall keep full and complete records of the costs and additional time incurred for any work for which a claim for additional compensation is made. The Engineer or any designated claim investigator or auditor shall have access to those records and any other records as may be required by the Engineer to determine the facts or contentions involved in the claims. Failure to permit access to such records shall be sufficient cause for denying the claims.

Any claim for overhead type expenses or costs shall be supported by an audit report of an independent Certified Public Accountant. Any such overhead claim shall also be subject to audit by the County at its discretion.

Any costs or expenses incurred by the County in reviewing or a diting any claims that are not supported by the Contractor's cost accounting or other records shall be deemed to be damages incurred by the County within the meaning of the Cautorna False Claims Act.

Replace the 6th paragraph in section 9-1.17D(3) with:

Failure to comply with the claim procedures described in the Contract Documents is a bar to pursue the claim in a court of law.

DIVISION II – GENERAL CONSTRUCTION

10-1.01 ORDER OF WORK

Order of work shall conform to the provisions in Section 8, "Prosecution and Progress," of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

First Order of Work - The Contractor shall obtain the encroachment permits from the City of Hesperia. The City named herein do not authorize work within their respective jurisdiction without a permit.

Second Order of Work - The Contractor shall set up portable Changeable Message Signs at the locations specified in these Special Provisions and as designated by the Engineer.

Third Order of Work - The Contractor shall request the County Surveyors to conduct a monument survey to facilitate preservation of existing monuments. The survey shall be requested at least two (2) weeks in advance of work to be performed.

Fourth order of work – Prior to the start of construction, the Contractor shall coordinate with the Engineer and Environmental Management Division (EMD) for the approval of construction staging area per Section "Environmental Mitigation Measures" of these Special Provisions. If approved staging area is outside of existing road right-of-way, Contractor shall be required to submit construction staging agreement with property owner to the Engineer.

Fifth Order of Work – The Contractor shall take all necessary neast tements and photos of all existing traffic control devices within the project limits including all striping and pavement markings prior to removal. The purpose for measurements and photos is to establish a record of existing traffic control devices and this record will be as differ repainting stripes and pavement marking. The pavement markings and striping stall be repainted per "Striping and Pavement Marking Locations" (tables) attached elsewhere in these Special Provisions or as directed by the Engineer and "Paint Traffic Stripss." Pavement Markings" section of these Special Provisions.

Sixth Order of Work - The Contractor shall submit Construction Phasing Plan for the entire project limits, detailing the phantsed construction and staging for approval by the Engineer at least two weeks (10 working days) prior to the start of construction. The construction phasing plan must include crack sealing/filling activities if needed on the project, this plan should include haterials, submittals, price per TON and also duration of activity.

Attention is directed to sections, "Quality Control Program", "Public Safety", "Portable Changeable Messatt Suns", "Traffic Control System", "Survey Monuments" and "Coordination" of these Special Provisions.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of this section, including any additional mobilizing or demobilizing costs, other work or labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals, not otherwise provided for, shall be considered as included in the prices paid for **various contract items of work** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

10-1.02 SUPPLEMENTAL WORK AT FORCE ACCOUNT (UNFORESEEN SUBGRADE STABILIZATION, UTILITY CONFLICT, REPAIR POTHOLES, CRACKS SEALING, AND PAVEMENT PATCHING)

This work shall consist of extra work, related to specified items of work, necessary to address unforeseen conditions of position, location, and/or dimensions of existing underground and/or surface improvements, including utilities. Additionally, extra work related to unforeseen

subgrade soil condition where cold plane (also known as milling or header cut) operation occurs at either travel lanes or shoulder areas; and unknown areas of coverage for pothole repairs, cracks sealing and pavement patching. All these unforeseen conditions not specifically covered by contract items, but determined by the Engineer to be necessary to the completion of specified construction within the functional range, scope, and intent of the contract.

SUBGRADE STABILIZATION

If in the event, yielding or unfirmed subgrade soil condition were discovered in some or specific streets during the milling operation, the work shall be suspended temporarily and the Contractor shall notify the Engineer immediately. The Engineer shall investigate, assess, evaluate and determine as to whether extra work is required to address the subgrade condition. If determined by the Engineer that extra work is required, Contractor shall submit to the Engineer for his approval the best possible solution or alternative solution to stabilize the subgrade. The Engineer has the sole discretion to accept or reject such extra work.

Prior to milling, the Contractor shall identify and mark any damaged section of the existing asphalt concrete dike or berm, concrete curb and gutter within the project limit. The Contractor shall notify the Engineer and the latter shall determine if repair or reconstruction is necessary. The payment for the repair or reconstruction of any damaged as shart concrete dike or berm, concrete cross gutter, concrete curb and gutter shall be densited as included in the various items of work and no separate payment will be allowed therefor.

The Contractor shall protect the existing asphalt concrete dike or berm, concrete cross gutter, concrete curb and gutter or gutter face when milling or header cut) at all times. If in the event and due to Contractor's negligence while operating the milling machine in the process, the existing asphalt concrete dike or berm, concrete cross gutter, curb and gutter or gutter face starts to fail, crumble, break or shutter easily, the Contractor shall immediately repair and reconstruct the damage section of the curb and gutter and expenses thereof shall be borne by the Contractor.

UTILITY CONFLICT

Extra work to address substantial or latent physical conditions that differ materially from those indicated in the contract, or unknown physical conditions of an unusual nature, differing from those initially encounted and generally recognized as inherent in the work provided for in the contract will be addressed in accordance with Section 4-1.06, "Differing Site Conditions (23 CFR 635 109)" of the Standard Specifications.

Due to unforeseen event, milling operation or pavement rehabilitation, there are number of existing manholes, water valves or electrical vault or conduits that maybe covered currently with asphalt pavement located along any of the roads as shown on the Location Map elsewhere in these Special Provisions requiring extra work to repair or replace in kind, expose and adjust said utilities to finished grade as directed by the Engineer. However, Contractor shall coordinate with the utility agency or agencies prior to any work.

REPAIR POTHOLES, CRACKS SEALING AND PAVEMENT PATCHING IN EXISTING ASPHALT SURFACING

Prior to any pavement rehabilitation, Contractor shall field determine, assess, evaluate and verify if the existing asphalt surfacing requires pothole repairs, crack sealing and pavement patching. The Contactor shall submit and report his findings to the Engineer immediately. Said findings will be reviewed and field verified. At the discretion of the Engineer, no extra work will be granted without the Engineer's prior approval.

POTHOLE REPAIRS

To promote good adhesion and bonding, Contractor to sweep out the area to be repaired or patched with a bristle brush or broom. Remove any loose debris, dirt, ice or standing water from the area to be repaired or patched.

Use 3/8" max., HMA. Shovel into the pothole. If the fault is deep over six inches, apply in two-inch layers, compacting each layer in succession. Shovel enough material into the fault to slightly crown the "patch". When competed compress the "patch" with a Tamper.

PAVEMENT PATCHING

Use Hot Mix Asphalt for patching either 3/8" or #4 (whichever is vailable) to patch alligator areas and where existing AC surfacing is dilapidated.

CRACKS SEAL

If in the event, severe cracks in the existing as half concrete surfacing were found on the paved traffic lanes and shoulders that are 1/2" (0.25) wide to 2" in width shall be prepared and filled with crack sealant in accordance with these special provisions.

Cracks which are greater than 2" in width and potholes in the existing surface shall be filled with 3/8" max., HMA.

MATERIALS

The modified asphalt crack sealart shall be a mixture of paving asphalt and ground rubber or ground rubber and polymer. The gradation of the ground rubber shall be such that 100 percent will pass a 2.36-mm (11-2) sieve. The modified asphalt crack sealant shall conform to the following requirements:

Test	ASTM Designation	Requirements
Softening Point	D 36	82°C min.
Cone Penetration @ 25°C	D 3407	30 dmm min.
Resilience @ 25°C	D 3407	40 percent min.
Flow	D 3407	3 mm max.

The modified asphalt crack sealant material shall be furnished premixed in containers with an inside liner of polyethylene. Packaged material shall not exceed 60 pounds. The modified

asphalt crack sealant material shall be capable of being melted and applied to cracks at temperatures below 204°C. When heated, it shall readily penetrate cracks ½" wide or wider.

The Contractor shall provide the Engineer with a Certificate of Compliance conforming to the provisions in Section 6-1.07, "Certificate of Compliance," of the Standard Specifications with each shipment of crack sealant. Said certificate shall also certify that the sealant complies with the specifications and shall be accompanied with storage and heating instructions and cautions for the material.

PREPARATION

Cracks to be filled, potholes to be repaired, and adjacent asphalt concrete surfacing shall be cleaned and shall be free of dirt, vegetation, debris and loose sealant. A weed-killer/soil sterilant shall be applied. Cleaning shall be done by air blasting. Old sealant that protrudes above the asphalt concrete surfacing shall be completely removed. Routing will not be required. Hot compressed air or other means, approved by the Engineer, shall be used to clean and dry the crack immediately prior to application of material. When moisture is present, hot compressed air or other means, approved by the Engineer shall be used to clean and dry the crack immediately prior to application of material.

APPLICATION

The crack sealant material shall be applied only after the eracks and adjacent asphalt concrete surfacing have been cleaned. Crack sealant material shall be spread with any type nozzle or device approved for use by the Engineer that will place the material within the specified temperature range and to the dimension, shawn on the plans. All cracks shall be squeegeed when necessary after application of the track sealant material.

The finished sealant material placed shall be flush with the existing roadway surface. Within 2 days after application of sealant, scaled cracks that reopen or in which the sealant material sags below the surrounding aspect concrete surfacing and shoulders shall be resealed.

The curing time shall be per pany acturer's recommendation.

Attention is directed to sections, "Earthwork", "Miscellaneous Concrete Construction" and "Asphalt Concrete Dike or Berm" elsewhere in these special provisions.

Additional work falling within the scope and character of the existing contract items shall be considered as normal to the progress of construction and shall be addressed in accordance with Section 4-1.05, "Changes and Extra Work", of the Standard Specifications.

If the Contractor is delayed in the completion of the contract work as a direct result of the work described in this section, an extension of time as provided in the fifth paragraph of Section 8-1.10, "Liquidated Damages" will be granted.

Compensation for work performed under this section, and calculated as prescribed in Section 9-1.04, "Force Account Payment", of the Standard Specifications will be cumulative over the duration of the contract.

Prospective bidders shall include the Contract Amount printed in the proposal for "Supplemental Work At Force Account (Unforeseen Subgrade Stabilization, Utility

Conflict, Cracks Sealing and Pavement Patching)" as their bid for this contract item. The amount shown is purely arbitrary and no guarantee is given or implied that any payments will be made.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of this section, including any additional mobilizing or demobilizing costs, and furnishing all labor, equipment, material (includes imported materials if needed), tools and incidentals and doing all work determined by the Engineer to fall under this section shall be considered to be included in payments made for "Supplemental Work At Force Account (Unforeseen Subgrade Stabilization, Utility Conflict, Repair Potholes, Cracks Sealing and Pavement Patching)", and no separate payment will be made therefor.

10-1.03 WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PROGRAM (WPCP)

Water Pollution Control work shall conform to the provisions in Section 13-2, "Water Pollution Control Program," of the Standard Specifications, and these special provisions and the Construction Contractor's Guide and Specifications of the Coltrans Storm Water Quality Handbook (Handbook), and addenda thereto issued up to and including the date of advertisement of the project. The Handbooks may also be diwnleaded from the Storm Water Quality Manuals and Handbooks website at the following website:

Areas where pollutant discharge must be eliminated shall include, but not be limited to, spoil and stockpile areas, all staging areas, and pulverized areas created in connection with work under this contract, whether or not said areas are within the delineated project limits.

Full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals for doing all the work involved in developing, preparing, obtaining approval of, revising, amending, implementation and remit val of the WPCP as specified in the Standard Specifications, the Handbook, and these specifications, shall be included in the contract price paid for **Water Pollution Control Program** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

This **Water Pollution Control Program** will be paid as percentage of total item based on development and approval of the WPCP (15%), weekly inspections reports (70% divided by number of weeks of project), and final documentation submittal (15%). Payment will be withheld for failure to submit weekly inspection forms and will not be retro-paid when submitted.

10-1.04 MOBILIZATION

Mobilization shall consist of preparatory work and operations, including, but not limited to, those necessary for the movement of personnel, equipment, supplies and incidentals to the project site; for the establishment of all offices, buildings and other facilities necessary for work on the project; and for all other work and operations which must be performed or costs incurred prior to beginning work on the various contract items on the project site.

Mobilization shall conform to the provisions in section 9-1.16D, "Mobilization," of the Standard Specifications.

The contract lump sum price paid for **Mobilization** shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved in mobilization as specified herein. No additional compensation will be allowed for additional mobilization / demobilization costs due to weather days or loss of production due to cold weather

10-1.05 QUALITY CONTROL PROGRAM (QCP)

Quality Control Program (QCP) shall conform to the provisions in section 5-1.01, "General", section 19-5.03, "Construction" and section 39-2.01A "General" and other related sections of the Caltrans 2015 or 2018 Standard Specifications, these Special Provisions, County Quality Assurance Program (QAP) and as directed by the Engineer.

The Contractor shall submit for approval their QCP which outlines the testing for the entire project and must include a paving plan which outlines the quipment used, construction phasing plan, as well as testing in the field and at the plant

Full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals for doing all the work involved in developing, preparing, obtaining approval of, revising, amending, and implementation of the QCP as specified in the Standard Specifications, these special provisions, shall be included in the contract lamp symprice for **Quality Control Program** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor

The contract lump sum price paid for **Cality Control Program** shall include furnishing of plans, services, equipment and for doing all the work involved in quality control and assurance as specified herein and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

This **Quality Control Program** will be paid as percentage of total item based on development and approval of the QCP (15%), weekly inspections reports (70% divided by number of weeks of project), and final transportation submittal (15%). Payment will be withheld for failure to submit weekly inspection forms and will be retro paid when submitted.

.10-1.06 PUBLIC SAFETY

The Contractor shall provide for the safety of traffic and the public in conformance with the provisions in Section 7-1.04, "Public Safety," of the Standard Specifications and these special provisions.

The Contractor shall furnish, erect and maintain those fences, temporary railing (Type K), barricades, lights, signs and other devices and take such other protective measures that are necessary to prevent accidents or damage or injury to the public, especially pedestrians who travel through the work zone area. Where no other means of pedestrian passage through construction area is available, the Contractor shall provide detours for pedestrian travel.

When applicable, the California MUTCD latest edition Figure 6H-28 "Sidewalk Detour or Diversion" Typical Application 28 and Figure 6H-29" Crosswalk Closures and Pedestrian Detours" Typical Application 29 as included in the green sheets may be used and referenced as part of the project's Traffic Control Plan.

If any of the above referenced CA MUTCD Typical Application/s is/are not applicable due to project field conditions, or as required by the Engineer, the Contractor shall prepare a Pedestrian Traffic Control Plan and submit to the Engineer for review and approval. The Pedestrian Traffic Control Plan shall detail any pedestrian detour with all signage, barricades, fencing, delineators, etc. as necessary for safe pedestrian travel through or around the work zone area in conformance with the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) — Part 6 (latest edition) — Temporary Traffic Control sections 6D.01 "Pedestrian Considerations" and section 6D.02 "Accessibility Considerations". Refer to additional Traffic Control Plan requirements as specified in the Traffic Control System section of these Special Provisions. Nothing in these Special Provisions is to be construed as to reduce the minimum standards in the CA MUTCD.

The Contractor shall install temporary railing (Type K) between a type of en to public traffic and an excavation, obstacle, or storage area when the following conditions exist:

- 1) Excavations The near edge of the excavation is 16 featureless from the edge of the lane, except:
 - a) Excavations covered with sheet steel or concert covers of adequate thickness to prevent accidental entry by traffic or the public.
 - b) Excavations less than 1 foot deep.
 - c) Trenches less than 1-foot wide for irrigation pipe or electrical conduit, or excavations less than 1-foot in diameter.
 - d) Excavations parallel to the lane for the purpose of pavement widening or reconstruction.
 - e) Excavations protected by side slopes, where the slope is equal to or less than 1:4 (vertical:horizontal)
 - f) Excavations protected by existing barrier or railing.
 - g) Excavations within terripolary traffic control zones that do not extend beyond a single daylight period, for these zones alternative barrier systems should be considered.
- 2) Temporarily Unprotected ermanent Obstacles The work includes the installation of a fixed obstacle together. In a protective system, such as a sign structure together with protective railing and the Contractor elects to install the obstacle prior to installing the protective system; or the Contractor, for the Contractor's convenience and with permission of the Engineer, removes a portion of an existing protective railing at an obstacle and does not replace such railing complete in place during the same day.
- 3) Storage Areas Material or equipment is stored within 12 feet of the lane and the storage is not otherwise prohibited by the provisions of the Standard Specifications and these special provisions.

The approach end of temporary railing (Type K), installed in conformance with the provisions in this section "Public Safety" and in Section 7-1.04, "Public Safety," of the Standard Specifications, shall be offset a minimum of 15.33 feet from the edge of the traffic lane open to public traffic. The temporary railing shall be installed on a skew toward the edge of the traffic lane of not more than 1-foot transversely to 10 feet longitudinally with respect to the edge of the traffic lane. If the 15.33 feet minimum offset cannot be achieved, the temporary railing shall be installed on the 10:1 skew to obtain the maximum available offset between the

approach end of the railing and the edge of the traffic lane, and an array of temporary crash cushion modules shall be installed at the approach end of the temporary railing.

Temporary railing (Type K) shall conform to the provisions in Section 12-3.20, "Temporary Railing (Type K)," of the Standard Specifications. Temporary railing (Type K), conforming to the details shown on Standard Plans T3A and T3B or approved equal by the Engineer may be used.

The sixth paragraph of Section 12-3.20C(1), "General," of the Standard Specifications is amended to read:

Install a reflector on the top or face of the rail of each rail unit placed within 10 feet of a traffic lane as directed by the Engineer. Apply adhesive for mounting the reflector under the reflector manufacturer's instructions.

Reflectors on temporary railing (Type K) shall conform to the provisions in "Approved Traffic Products" of these special provisions.

Temporary crash cushion modules shall conform to the provisions in "Temporary Crash Cushion Module" of these special provisions.

Except for installing, maintaining and removing traffic control devices, whenever work is performed or equipment is operated in the following work a eas the Contractor shall close the adjacent traffic lane unless otherwise provided in the Standard Specifications and these special provisions:

Approach speed of public traffic (Pos ed Limit mph)	Work Areas
Over 45 mph	Within 6 feet of a traffic lane but not on a traffic lane
35 to 45 mph	Within 3 feet of a traffic lane but not on a traffic lane

The lane closure provisions of this section shall not apply if the work area is protected by permanent, temporary railing of barrier. When traffic cones or delineators are used to delineate a temporary code of traffic lane, the line of cones or delineators shall be considered to be the edge of traffic lane, however, the Contractor shall not reduce the width of an existing lane to less than 11 feet without written approval from the Engineer.

When work is not in progress on trench or other excavation that requires closure of an adjacent lane, the traffic cones or portable delineators used for the lane closure shall be placed adjacent to the edge of the traveled way. The spacing of the cones or delineators shall be the same as specified for the lane closure.

Open trenches left open overnight shall be protected by temporary railing (Type K) or other approved temporary traffic barrier as determined by the Engineer.

The locations of temporary railing (Type K) shall be shown on Traffic Control Plans for review and approval by the Engineer. Attention is directed to the Traffic Control System section elsewhere in these special provisions.

Contractor may propose to the Engineer an alternative to the use of temporary railing (Type K) and/or crash cushions in areas where the use of these devices is anticipated to be for a relatively short period of time but no more than five working days. Approval of the Engineer for the use of the proposed alternatives shall not relieve the Contractor from being solely responsible for any damages resulting from the use of these alternatives in accordance with Section 7-1.05A "General" subtitles "Indemnification" of the Standard Specifications and/or these Special Provisions.

Suspended loads or equipment shall not be moved nor positioned over public traffic or pedestrians.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of Section 7-1.04, "Public Safety," and the requirements of these special provisions, including furnishing all labor and installing temporary railing (Type K) and temporary crash cushion modules, shall be considered as included in the contract price paid for **Traffic Control System** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

10-1.07 TRAFFIC CONTROL SYSTEM

A. GENERAL:

This work shall consist of all operations necessary to conduct construction operations in a safe manner relative to public traffic, and shall conform to the requirements in Section "Temporary Pavement Delineation" of these Special Povisions, and those in Section 7-1.03, "Public Convenience," Section 7-1.04, "Public Safety" and Section 12, "Temporary Traffic Control," of the Standard Specifications. Nothing in these special Provisions shall be construed as relieving the Contractor from his responsibility as provided in said Section 7-1.04 of the Standard Specifications.

The requirements of this section, titled "General" shall apply to all projects except as modified below in Section B, "Special conditions," or as otherwise approved by the Engineer.

Construction that interferes with public traffic shall be performed only between 7:00 A.M., and 4:00 P.M., except that which is required under Sections 7-1.03, "Public Convenience," and 7-1.04, "Public Safety, or the Standard Specifications, as modified below in Section B, or as approved by the Engineer

The Contractor shall submit a Traffic Control Plan for the entire project limits, including intersections, detailing the proposed construction staging and traffic control for approval by the Engineer at least two weeks (10 working days) prior to the start of construction. The Traffic Control Plan shall not include any intersection closures or detours. The Traffic Control Plan shall comply with the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) – Part 6 (latest edition) - Temporary Traffic Control. Nothing in these Special Provisions is to be construed as to reduce the minimum standards in the CA MUTCD.

When applicable, the 2018 Caltrans "Temporary Traffic Control Systems" Standard Plans as included in the green sheets may be used and referenced as part of the project's Traffic Control Plan. A flashing arrow sign will be required on all lane closures and, if determined by the Engineer, will be required on shoulder closures as well.

When applicable, the Traffic Control Plan for shoulder closures may be as shown on the "Shoulder Closure" detail of Standard Plan T10, in the List of Standard and Special Drawings

(Green Pages). The spacing dimensions on the "Shoulder Closure" detail may be modified as determined by the Engineer. The traffic control plan for night time shoulder closures shall also include flashing beacons.

At any given time during active construction when the number of lanes is reduced from existing conditions for both directions of travel, active construction work zones shall be limited to the number of locations and delays to motorist in time as indicated below in section B or as determined by the Engineer.

Existing turn lanes for left and/or right turns, when present at intersections, shall remain open and operational; or when existing turn lanes are removed, temporary turn lanes shall be provided for turn movements.

If the Engineer determines that the Contractor's operations are resulting in unacceptable traffic delays, the Engineer reserves the right to implement alternate traffic plans. Specific details are as indicated below in section B unless otherwise directed by the Engineer.

The Contractor shall coordinate with local residents and businesses to provide ingress and egress for properties adjacent to the project for the convenience of local residents and businesses in carrying out their personal and business activities. Convenient access for mail, other delivery services, and trash services shall be included in the definition of "personal and business activities."

The Contractor shall prepare a "Notice to Residents," and distribute copies of said notice to properties that are adjacent to and / or are directly impacted by the project, as determined by the Engineer. The notice shall use the "Notice to Residents" template attached in the List of Standard and Special Drawings (Green Pages). The notice shall be placed on the door of said properties a minimum of seven (7) days before the Contractor begins work. The notice shall be in both English and Spanish (back side).

It is the Contractor's responsibility to have roads clear of interfering vehicles prior to the start of work and during work. The Contractor's responsible for notifying affected residents and businesses of the work schedule. Such notification would include placing notices (as stated above), making verbal contact, and furnishing and placing temporary "No Parking" signs 48 hours prior to the start of work, as well as notifying the California Highway Patrol 24 hours prior to such posting, such that interfering vehicles or objects may be towed or otherwise removed, if necessary. With regards a towing, the applicable County Code Sections are 52.0118, 52.0132, and 53.081

Section 12-1.04, "Payment," of the Standard Specifications is superseded by the following:

The cost of furnishing all flaggers, including transporting flaggers to provide for passage of public traffic through the work under the provisions in Section 7-1.03, "Public Convenience," and Section 7-1.04, "Public Safety," of the Standard Specifications, and elsewhere in these Special Provisions, will be borne solely by the Contractor.

If determined by the Engineer that additional flaggers are required during construction activities, Contractor shall provide flaggers at no additional cost to the County.

The Contractor shall furnish, install, maintain, move, remove, and dispose of all signs, lights, flares, barricades, and other facilities for the convenience and safety of the public, as required by these Special Provisions and Section 7-1.03, Section 7-1.04, and Section 12 of the Standard Specifications.

If any component in the traffic control system is displaced, or ceases to operate or function as specified from any cause during the progress of the work, the Contractor shall immediately

repair said component to its original condition or replace said component and shall restore the component to its original location.

When lane closures are made for work periods only, at the end of each work period, all components of the traffic control system, except portable delineators placed along open trenches or excavation adjacent to the traveled way shall be removed from the traveled way and shoulder. If the Contractor so elects, said components may be stored at selected central locations approved by the Engineer within limits of the highway right of way.

When temporary lane configuration changes are allowed to facilitate that day's construction activity, the Contractor, unless otherwise directed by the Engineer, shall restore lane configurations to pre-construction conditions at the end of the workday or during periods when active construction is not taking place.

B. SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

I. During Construction Activities

Construction on any and all Various Roads as listed on the Road Table elsewhere in these special provisions shall be performed on Montagy through Friday only (7:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.) for the duration of the project

In order to minimize impacts to school traffic, the Contractor is advised that working hours may need to be adjusted. The Contractor shall coordinate operating hours for construction activities jointly with the Engineer and Schools representative. The point of contact for the schools can be found in Section "Coordination" elsewhere in these Special Provisions.

The Contractor shall adhere to the orienting hour restrictions as determined and as directed by the Engineer.

Throughout the project area, public traffic shall be permitted to pass through construction operations at at times on a minimum of one 11-foot graded and compacted or paver lane to be used by both directions of travel with the use of flaggers. In order to control traffic, additional flaggers shall be required at any intersecting street or streets in between locations where flaggers have the traffic queued for paving operations. Any deviation from these special conditions shall be approved by the Engineer.

At any given time when the number of lanes on any and all Various Roads as listed on the Road Table elsewhere in these Special Provisions are reduced to one lane for both directions of travel, construction work zones shall be limited to one location per street for both directions of travel and delays to motorist shall be limited to 10 minutes in time or as otherwise specified in these Special Provisions or approved by the Engineer. Pedestrian safety; The Contractor shall provide passage for pedestrians through construction areas, or provide a detour where applicable. Work that interferes with existing sidewalks or crosswalks at intersections shall be conducted so as to minimize impacts to pedestrian traffic.

Pedestrian safety; The Contractor shall provide passage for pedestrians through construction areas, or provide a detour where applicable. Work that interferes with existing sidewalks or crosswalks at intersections shall be conducted so as to minimize impacts to pedestrian traffic.

In cases where a detour or an alternate pedestrian access cannot be provided, the Contractor shall be allowed to close sidewalk ramp areas where approved by the Engineer. The Contractor shall post sidewalk closure signs at these ramp locations at least two (2) days prior to the closure dates. Signs shall advise pedestrians of anticipated closure dates. Attention is also directed to the Public Safety section of these Special Provisions.

In cases where existing paved road widths are less than 24 feet, the Contractor may be allowed to utilize graded and compacted lane(s) as approved by the Engineer.

II. During Non-construction activities

On any and all Various Roads as listed on the Road Table elsewhere in these special provisions, the Contractor must provide two 11-foot graded and compacted or paved lanes, one for each direction of travel for use by public traffic overnight and when construction operations are not actively in progress. The full width of a graded and compacted or paved traveled way shall be open for use by public traffic overnight and when construction operations are not actively in progress.

The Contractor shall stage his construction operation accordigly in order to meet the above stated requirements.

C. MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT:

The contract lump sum price paid for Traffic Control System shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials (including, but not limited to, all traffic control components), tools, equipment, and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved in placing, removing, storing, maintaining, moving to new locations, and replacing and disposing of the components of the traffic control system, as shown on the plans, and as specified in the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

Full compensation for furnishing all lator, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved in furnishing, placing/installing, maintaining, relocating as necessary, removing and disporting of the Advance Warning signs including payment for permits, is included in the contract lump sum price paid for Traffic Control System, and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of these Special Provisions and those in Section 7-1.03, "Public Convenience," Section 7-1.04, "Public Safety," and Section 12, "Temporary Traffic Control," of the Standard Specifications, including furnishing all labor, materials (including all traffic control components), tools, equipment, and incidentals, shall be considered as included in the contract lump sum price paid for Traffic Control System, and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

Full compensation for furnishing, erecting, maintaining, and removing any additional construction area signs and other traffic control components including AWSs the Engineer may deem necessary shall be considered as included in the various contract items of work, and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

Full compensation for furnishing, installing, distributing, and removing the "Notice to Residents" shall be considered as included in the various contract items of work, and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

Full compensation for traffic control staging is included in the contract lump sum price paid for **Traffic Control System**, and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

The adjustment provisions in Section 4-1.05, "Changes and Extra Work," of the Standard Specifications, shall not apply to the item of Traffic Control System. Adjustments in compensation for traffic control components ordered by the Engineer beyond those called for in the referenced standards will be made as provided in Section 9-1.04, "Force Account," of the Standard Specifications. No adjustment will be made for decreases.

10-1.08 TEMPORARY PAVEMENT DELINEATION (2015 CALTRANS REVISED STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS)

This work, Temporary Pavement Delineation, shall consist of installing, maintaining, and removing temporary striping, pavement markings, channelizers, cones, and other devices necessary to the safe movement of public traffic through the project area and shall conform to the provisions in Section 12-6, "Temporary Pavement Delineation," of the Standard Specifications, the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Levices — part 6 (latest edition - published by the State Department of Transportation), and these special Provisions. Nothing in these Special Provisions shall be construed as relieving the Contractor from its responsibility as provided in Section 7-1.04, "Public Safety," of the Standard Specifications.

It is recognized that some conditions may prevail under Which the Contractor and other agencies may share in responsibilities for the public refety being affected by the work under this contract. It is, however, agreed among the part is that necessary renewal, connection to, and replacement of effective traffic controls formally applied to the pavement shall fall within the Contractor's sole liability.

GENERAL - Whenever the work caus subliteration of pavement delineation, temporary or permanent pavement delineation shall be in place prior to opening the traveled way to public traffic. Lane line or centerline parament delineation shall be provided at all times for traveled ways open to public traffic.

On multilane roadways, edge line delineation shall be provided at all times for traveled ways open to public traffic.

The Contractor shall and all work necessary, including any required lines or marks, to establish the alignment of temporary pavement delineation. Surfaces to receive temporary pavement delineation shall be dry and free of dirt and loose material. Temporary pavement delineation shall not be applied over existing pavement delineation or other temporary pavement delineation. Temporary pavement delineation shall be maintained until superseded or replaced with a new pattern of temporary pavement delineation or permanent pavement delineation.

Temporary pavement markers and removable traffic type tape which conflicts with a new traffic pattern or which is applied to the final layer of surfacing or existing pavement to remain in place shall be removed when no longer required for the direction of public traffic, as determined by the Engineer.

TEMPORARY LANE LINE AND CENTERLINE DELINEATION - Whenever lane lines and centerlines are obliterated, the minimum lane line and centerline delineation to be provided shall be temporary reflective raised pavement markers. The spacing requirements for temporary pavement markers shall comply with CA MUTCD 2014, Section 6F.79, "Temporary Raised Pavement Markers". The temporary reflective raised pavement markers shall be the

same color as the lane line or centerline the markers replace. Temporary reflective raised pavement markers shall be, at the option of the Contractor, one of the temporary pavement markers listed for short term day/night use (14 days or less) or long term day/night use (6 months or less) in "Prequalified and Tested Signing and Delineation Materials" elsewhere in these Special Provisions.

Temporary reflective raised pavement markers shall be placed in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and shall be cemented to the surfacing with the adhesive recommended by the manufacturer, except epoxy adhesive shall not be used to place pavement markers in areas where removal of the markers will be required.

Temporary lane line or centerline delineation consisting entirely of temporary reflective raised pavement markers shall be used on lanes opened to public traffic for a maximum of 14 days. Prior to the end of the 14 days the permanent pavement delineation shall be placed. If the permanent pavement delineation is not placed within the 14 days, the Contractor shall provide, at his expense, additional temporary pavement delineation. The additional temporary pavement delineation to be provided shall be equivalent to the pattern specified for the permanent pavement delineation for the area, as determined by the spineer.

Where "no passing" centerline pavement delineation is obliterate". The following "no passing" zone signing shall be installed prior to opening the lanes to public trat". W20-1 "ROAD WORK AHEAD" signs shall be installed from 1,000 feet to 2,000 feet a back of "no passing" zones. R4-1 "DO NOT PASS" signs shall be installed at the beginning and at every 2,000-foot interval within "no passing" zones. For continuous zones langer than 2 miles, W7-3aP "NEXT MILES" signs shall be installed beneath the W 0-1 signs installed ahead of "no passing" zones. R4-2 "PASS WITH CARE" signs shall be installed at the end of "no passing" zones. The exact location of "no passing" zone signing will be as determined by the Engineer and shall be maintained in place until permanent tho passing" centerline pavement delineation has been applied. The signing for "no passing" zones, shall be removed when no longer required for the direction of public traffic. The signing for "no passing" zones shall conform to the requirements in Section 12-3.11, "Construction Area Signs," of the Standard Specifications.

Full compensation for furnishing, placing, maintaining and removing the temporary reflective raised pavement markers, used for temporary lane line and centerline delineation (including the signing specified for the placing zones) and for providing equivalent patterns of permanent traffic lines for such areas when required; shall be considered as included in the lump sum contract place and for **Traffic Control System** and no separate payment will be made therefor.

TEMPORARY EDGE LINE DELINEATION - Whenever edge lines are obliterated, the temporary pavement delineation to replace those edge lines shall, at the option of the Contractor, consist of either solid 4-inch wide traffic stripe of the same color as the stripe the temporary edge line delineation replaces, or shall consist of traffic cones, portable delineators or channelizers placed at longitudinal intervals not to exceed 100 feet.

The lateral offset for traffic cones, portable delineators or channelizers used for temporary edge line delineation shall be as determined by the Engineer. If traffic cones or portable delineators are used as temporary pavement delineation for edge lines, the Contractor shall provide personnel to remain at the job site to maintain the cones or delineators during all hours of the day that they are in use.

Channelizers used for temporary edge line delineation shall be surface mounted type and shall be orange in color. Channelizer bases shall be cemented to the pavement in the same manner provided for cementing pavement markers to pavement in the section of these Special Provisions entitled, "Pavement Markers," except epoxy adhesive shall not be used to place channelizers on the top layer of pavement. Channelizers shall be, at the Contractor's opinion, one of the surface mount types (36") listed in "Prequalified and Tested Signing and Delineation Materials" elsewhere in these Special Provisions.

Temporary edge line delineation shall be removed when no longer required for the direction of public traffic, as determined by the Engineer.

Full compensation for furnishing, placing, maintaining and removing the temporary edge line delineation shall be considered as included in the lump sum price paid for **Traffic Control System** and no separate payment will be made therefor.

10-1.09 ENVIRONMENTAL MITIGATION MEASURES

This work shall consist of furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals; and performing all work necessary to comply with existing laws, codes, regulations, and/or permits related to Environmental Mitigation Measures and these special provisions. Contractor shall comply with the requirements of the permits from the Department of Fish and Game, the State Water Resources Control Board and the Corps of Engineers found elsewhere in these special provisions.

Environmental Mitigation Measures must comply with section 5-1.20B "Permits, Licenses Agreements and Certifications," section 14-10, "Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling" and section 14-11, "Hazardous Waste and Contamination" of the Standard Specifications.

The Contractor shall comply with the following mitigation measures:

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. All work, including equipment staging, will remain on disturbed areas. No new work outside disturbed areas or existing rights-of-way will be performed without further environmental evaluation.
- 2. Standard best manager ent plactices shall be implemented during all maintenance activities, especially those pertaining to dust control, erosion control, and storm water pollution prevention. If equipment is parked overnight then a drip pan, or some other form of protection shall be placed under the vehicle of out to contain any drips, leaks, and/or spills. All food and other trash generated on the worksite shall be removed from the site daily. Please contact EMD at (909) 387-8109 with any questions.

BIOLOGICAL RESOURCE CONDITIONS

1. To avoid impacts to any nesting migratory birds, project activities shall be conducted outside of bird nesting season (March 15 through September 1). If the maintenance project is scheduled during the nesting season, pre-construction nest survey(s) are required to ensure that impacts to nesting birds are avoided. The last survey is to be conducted within three days prior to the start of work. If occupied nests are observed within the project area, the qualified biologist shall flag off the area(s) supporting bird nest(s) to provide a buffer (size of buffer will be dependent of the species found to be nesting at the discretion of the biologist), between the nest(s) and limits of maintenance. The biologist shall provide appropriate recommendations to ensure that no "take" results from the subject maintenance activities in the vicinity of flagged nest(s). If the surveys are

negative maintenance activities can proceed as proposed. Please contact EMD at (909) 387-8109 to schedule pre-construction nest surveys.

CULTURAL RESOURCE CONDITIONS

Should prehistoric or historical archaeological resources be encountered during construction, the
evaluation of any such resources should proceed in accordance with all appropriate federal, state,
and local guidelines. Specifically, all work must be stopped in the immediate vicinity of the cultural
resource found until a qualified archaeologist can assess the significance of the resource. If a
cultural resource find is made, notify EMD at (909) 387-8109.

If human remains are encountered during construction, then the San Bernardino County Coroner's Office must be contacted in accordance with state law within 24 hours of the find and all work should be stopped until clearance is given by that office and any other involved agencies. The Coroner's Office may be contacted at the Coroner's Division, County of San Bernardino, 175 S. Lena Road, San Bernardino, CA. Tel: (909) 387-2978.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of this section not otherwise provided for, including furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and recidentals, and for doing all the work involved shall be considered as included in the pices paid for the **various items of work** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefore.

10-1.10 DUST CONTROL

This work, Dust Control, shall consist of all operations necessary to control fugitive dust arising from construction operations, and due to any disturbance of natural ground covers resulting therefrom, in compliance with governing ENA and NPDES requirements and shall conform to the provisions in Section 10-5, "Dust Control," of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

The Contractor shall furnish adequate dust control measures as provided in Section 10-5, "Dust Control," of the standard Specifications and these Special Provisions during normal nonwork hours (e.g., nights, weekends, or holidays) encompassed within working days authorized in the contract and executed contract change orders, at no additional cost to the Department. Additional dust control required during suspensions of work directed by the Engineer, for reasons stated in Section 8-1.06, "Suspensions" for which the Engineer authorizes extension of "Time of Completion" will be paid for as extra work as provided in Section 4-1.05. "Changes and Extra work," of the Standard Specifications

The CONTRACTOR is responsible for meeting and being in compliance with all of the requirements of the (Mojave or South Coast wherever the project applies) Air Quality Management District's (AQMD) "Rule 403, Fugitive Dust" including, but not limited to, those requirements pertaining to a Large Operation. In addition to the CONTRACTOR providing all required personnel and signage, the CONTRACTOR is required to provide all mandatory forms, correspondence and recordkeeping information directly to AQMD and provide copies of said items to the ENGINEER or his authorized representative in a timely manner. The CONTRACTOR shall also submit his proposed program and sign detail to meet the requirements of AQMD "Rule 403, Fugitive Dust" to the ENGINEER prior to the start of

construction. Information on AQMD and "Rule 403, Fugitive Dust" can be found at http://www.mdaqmd.ca.gov/index.aspx?page=142. Should the County be fined due to failure of the contractor complying with Rule 403 requirements, the amount of any such fines will be withheld from payments due to the contractor.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of AQMD, including furnishing all labor, water, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals shall be considered as included in the prices paid for **various contract items of work** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

10-1.11 FINISHING ROADWAY

Finishing roadway shall conform to the provisions in Section 22, "Finishing Roadway," Section 4-1.13, "Cleanup," of the Standard Specifications, and these Special Provisions.

On projects where there is no earthwork associated with the construction, Finishing Roadway shall consist of the work necessary to accomplish final clearing up. Such cleaning up shall involve the entire project, including intersecting streets and driveways, and all adjacent or nearby properties effected by the project or occupied by the Contractor during performance of the work.

Full compensation for furnishing all labor, materia's, tools equipment and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved for finishing roadway, has be considered as included in the contract lump sum price paid for **Finishing Roadway** and to additional compensation will be allowed therefore.

10-1.12 WATERING

Watering shall conform to the previsions in Section 10-6, "Watering," of the Standard Specifications.

Full compensation for conteming to the requirements of this section shall be considered as included in the contraction paid for the **various items of work** and no additional compensation will be alleved therefore.

10-1.13 PORTABLE CHANGEABLE MESSAGE SIGNS

Portable Changeable Message Signs shall conform to the provisions in Sections 12-3.32 "Portable Changeable Message Signs" of the Standard Specifications.

This work shall consist of furnishing, placing, maintaining, relocating as necessary, and removing Portable Changeable Message Signs (PCMS). The purpose of the PCMS is to provide drivers with advanced warning and up to date information on the traffic conditions during construction. Contractor shall coordinate the placement of the PCMSs and the information shown on the signs with the Engineer.

The PCMS shall be installed as a second order of work and shall occur one (1) week prior to the start of construction. Contractor shall provide a minimum of eight (8) message signs.

Contractor's attention is directed to the Section entitled, "Permits," elsewhere in these Special Provisions.

Due to various locations of the roads, the specific locations of the PCMS shall be determined by the Contractor in accordance with the specifications herein for review and approval by the Engineer. The boards shall be maintained and relocated if necessary as determined by the Engineer during construction.

Location of the temporary traffic controls, regulatory, warning and guide signs have a higher priority than the PCMS. The PCMS shall be placed where they can be easily identified with the corresponding project. If the placement of PCMS conflicts with the newly installed higher priority signs, such as the temporary traffic control devices or other priority devices, the PCMS shall be relocated by the Contractor at no extra cost to the Countral.

Due to public safety concerns, the PCMS shall not be allowed at the following locations:

- a) On the front, back, adjacent to or around any transceontrol device, including traffic signs, traffic control device posts or structures, and
- b) At key decision points where a dri er's attention is more appropriately focused on traffic control devices, roadway geometry, or traffic conditions. These locations include but are not limited to, stop or yield signs, and areas of limited sight distances.

PCMS shall be removed at the completion of the project.

The contract unit price paid for **Fortable Changeable Message Sign** shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals, and for doing all work involved in furnishing plazing, maintaining, relocating as necessary, and removing PCMS, as specified in the Standard Specification and these Special Provisions.

10-1.14 COLD PLANE ASPHALT CONCRETE PAVEMENT

Existing asphalt concrete pavement shall be cold planed at the locations and to the dimensions indicated on the plans and shall conform to the following provisions.

The provisions of Section 42-3, "Grinding", of the Standard Specifications shall not apply.

Planing asphalt concrete shall be performed by the cold planing method. Planing of the asphalt concrete pavement shall not be done by the heater planing method. Cold planing machines shall be capable of planing the pavement without requiring the use of a heating device to soften the pavement during or prior to the planing operation.

Cold planing machines shall be operated so as not to produce fumes or smoke. Cold planing machines shall be capable of producing a planed surface with no grooves greater than 3/8-

inch in width and 3/16-inch in depth, and shall be operated at a speed and in a manner to produce such a surface. The noise level produced by the combined planing operation shall not exceed 86 dBA at a distance of 50 feet at right angles to the direction of travel.

The depth, width and shape of the cut shall be as indicated in these special provisions and on the typical cross sections. Planing shall be performed in a manner to produce a straight cross slope between a minimum 0.07-foot depth of cut at the centerline established by the Engineer and a minimum 0.07-foot depth of cut at the outside edge as dimensioned on the typical cross-section. Areas between these boundaries, where the existing surface is below this specified plane (i.e., transversely bridged by the planer) shall not be planed. At conform lines (meet lines at intersections), transverse cuts shall be made to a minimum of 0.07-foot below the existing surface. The outside lines of the paved area shall be neat and uniform. Following the planing operations, a drop-off of more than 0.20-foot will not be allowed at any time between adjacent lanes open to public traffic.

Planed widths of pavement shall be continuous except for intersections at cross streets where the planing shall be carried around the corners and through the conformalines.

Where transverse joints are planed in the pavement at conform thes, no drop-off greater than 0.10-foot shall remain between the existing pavement and the paned area when the pavement is opened to public traffic. If asphalt concrete has not been placed to the level of the existing pavement before the pavement is to be opened to public traffic, a temporary asphalt concrete transition shall be constructed. Asphalt concrete or a temporary transition shall be placed to the level of the existing pavement and tapered in a slope of 30:1 or flatter to the level of the planed area.

Asphalt concrete for temporary transitions shall be commercial quality "hot" or "cold" mix and shall be spread and compacted by any method that will produce a smooth riding surface. Temporary asphalt concrete transitions shall be completely removed, including the removal of loose material from the underlying surface, before commencing subsequent restoration or paving operations. Such removed material shall be disposed of outside the highway right of way in accordance with the provisions in Section 5-1.20B(4), "Contractor-Property Agreement", Section 14-10, "Solid Wayte Disposal and Recycling", and Section 14-11, "Hazardous Waste and Contamination" 6 the Syndard Specifications.

The material planed from the roadway surface, including material deposited in existing or improved gutters or on the adjacent traveled way, shall become the property of the Contractor and shall be removed and disposed of outside the highway right of way in accordance with the provisions in section 5-1.20B(4), "Contractor-Property Agreement", section 14-10, "Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling" and section 14-11, "Hazardous Waste and Contamination" of the Standard Specifications. Removal of the cold planed material shall be concurrent with the planing operations and follow within 50 feet of the planer, unless otherwise directed by the Engineer.

In order to preserve the structural integrity of the road, public safety and convenience, the Contractor shall overlay all feathered, milled or cold planed areas or sections of the road immediately within seven (7) working days, as shown on the plans, and as directed by the Engineer.

Cold plane asphalt concrete will be measured by the square yard. The quantity to be paid for will be the actual area of surface cold planed irrespective of the number of passes required to obtain the specified depth of cut. Low areas in existing pavement, bridged by the cold planer when adjacent cuts meet the specified minimum depth, will not be deducted from the measured areas.

The contract price paid per square yard for Cold Plane Asphalt Concrete Pavement (0.07' Thk); Cold Plane Asphalt Concrete Pavement (0.12' Thk); and Cold Plane Asphalt Concrete Pavement (0.20' Thk) shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials including asphalt concrete for temporary transitions, tools, equipment and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved in cold planning, removing and disposing of planed material; and constructing, maintaining, removing and disposing of temporary transitions, as shown on the plans, as specified in the Standard Specifications and these special provisions, and as directed by the Engineer.

10-1.15 SLURRY SEAL

The Slurry Seal shall be a Type II Polymer Modified Asphalt English. Slurry Seal conforming to Caltrans Standard Specifications 2015, Section 37-3 "Starry Seal and Micro-Surfacing".

The asphalt emulsion shall be a quick-setting type and stade as specified in Section 37-3.02B(3) "Polymer Modified Asphaltic Emulsion".

The asphalt emulsion shall be polymer modified W1 2-72 percent minimum polymer content, and not exceed to more than 3 percent.

As specified in Section 37-3.03B "Proportioning" the slurry seal mixture shall have proper workability and (a) will permit traffic, no controlled with pilot cars, on the slurry seal within one hour after placement without the occurrence of bleeding, raveling, separation or other distress, and (b) prevent development of bleeding, raveling, separation or other distress within 15 days after placing the slurry seal.

Immediately before commercing he slurry seal operations, all surface metal utility covers shall be protected by thoroughly covering the surface with an appropriate adhesive and paper or plastic. No adhesive material shall be permitted to cover, seal or fill the joint between the frame and cover of the surface. Covers are to be uncovered and cleaned of slurry material by the end of the same work day.

The quantity for slurry seal includes the weight determined by combining the weights of the aggregate and asphaltic emulsion. The payment quantity for slurry seal does not include the weights of the added water and set-control additives.

The contract unit price paid per square yard for **Slurry Seal (Type II)** shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved in furnishing and placing of the slurry seal, complete in place, including cleaning the surface and protecting the slurry seal until it has set, all as shown on the plans, as specified in these specifications and as directed by the Engineer.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of this section shall be considered as included in the prices paid for the various contract items of work and no additional compensation will be allowed therefore.

10-1.16 POLYMER MODIFIED ASPHALTIC EMULSION CHIP SEALS

General

This work includes specifications for applying polymer modified asphaltic emulsion chip seals in accordance with Section 37-2.03 of 2018 Standard Specifications, these Special Provisions, as shown on the plan, and as directed by the Engineer.

A polymer modified asphaltic emulsion chip seal includes applying a polymer modified asphaltic emulsion, followed by aggregate, and then a flush coat.

The Contractor shall use single polymer modified asphaltic emulsion chip seal application rate of 0.30-0.45 gal/sy. Double application will not be allowed and paid for.

Submittals

Immediately after sampling, submit two 1-quart cans of polymer modified asphaltic emulsion taken in the presence of the Engineer. A sample must be submitted in an insulated shipping container.

Quality Assurance

Polymer Modified Asphaltic Emulsions

Circulate polymer modified asphalic emulsions in the distributor truck before sampling. Take samples from the distributor truck as mid load or from a sampling tap or thief. Before taking samples, draw and dispose of legallon. In the presence of the Engineer, take two 1-quart samples for acceptance testing.

For polymer modified aspecified emulsions, the authorized laboratory must perform quality control sampling and lesting at the specified frequency and location for the following quality characteristics:

You may stockpile aggregate for the polymer modified asphaltic emulsion chip seals if you prevent contamination. As regate must have damp surfaces at spreading. If water visibly separates from the aggregate, do not spread. You may redampen aggregate in the delivery vehicle.

Spread aggregate before the polymer modified asphaltic emulsion sets or breaks.

Do not spread aggregate more than 2,500 feet ahead of the completed initial rolling.

Replace Section 37-2.03D "Payment" with:

MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

The Contractor shall use a **single chip seal application of 3/8" max aggregate gradation** with emulsion application rate of 0.30-0.45 gal/sy; and screenings spread rate of 23-30 lb/sy, respectively. The Contractor has the option of using double application, subject however to the approval of the Engineer.

The contract price paid per square yard for **Polymer Modified Asphalt Emulsion Chip Seal** shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals and for doing all the work involved in furnishing and applying asphaltic emulsion and screenings, complete in place as shown on the plans, as specified in the Standard Specifications and these special provisions, as directed by the Engineer, and no additional compensation will be allowed therefore.

The Contractor may be granted additional working days, but there will be no additional compensation for weather related delays or scheduling delays. The Contractor is expected to have accounted for potential weather-related delays and scheduling delays in his or her bid.

10-1.17 ASPHALT CONCRETE (RAP Optional)

Asphalt concrete shall conform to the provisions in Section 39-2, "Hot Mix Asphalt" of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

The Contractor may produce asphalt concrete using reclaimed asphalt pavement (RAP). The Contractor may substitute RAP for a portion of the virgin aggregate in asphalt concrete in an amount **not exceeding 15 percent** of the asphalt concrete day aggregate mass.

RAP shall not be used in Open Graded Asphalt Concrete or Rubberized Asphalt Concrete.

RAP shall be processed from asphalt concrete removed from pavement surfaces. RAP shall be stored in stockpiles on smooth surfaces free of cebbs and organic material. RAP stockpiles shall consist only of homogeneous RAP. The Contractor may process and stockpile RAP throughout the project's life. Processing and stockpiling operations shall prevent material contamination and segregation.

The asphalt concrete shall conform to the following requirements:

- 1. Asphalt concrete shall be ploduced at a central mixing plant.
- 2. The aggregate for Aspiralt Concrete shall conform to Type A, 1/2-inch, Aggregate Gradation, as specified in Section 39-2.02B(4)(b), "Aggregate Gradations," of the Standard Specification. The asphalt binder grade shall be PG 70-10 HMA.
- 3. If the Contractor does not use RAP, the amount of asphalt binder to be mixed with the aggregate for Type A asphalt concrete will be determined by the Contractor and submitted to the Engineer for approval in accordance with California Test 367 (except Open Graded asphalt concrete) or California Test 368 for Open Graded asphalt concrete using the samples of aggregates furnished by the Contractor in conformance with Section 39-2.01A(4), "Quality Assurance," of the Standard Specifications.
- 4. If the Contractor uses RAP, the amount of asphalt binder to be mixed with the combined virgin aggregate and RAP will be determined by the Contractor and submitted to the Engineer for approval in accordance with California Test 367 amended by Lab Procedure-9 (LP-9). LP-9 is available at:

http://www.dot.ca.gov/hq/esc/Translab/ormt/fpmlab.htm

Whenever in Lab Procedure-9 the terms "Hot Mix Asphalt" and "HMA" are used, they shall be understood to mean and refer to "Asphalt Concrete" and "AC" respectively.

At least 5 days before starting production of asphalt concrete using RAP, the Contractor shall submit a proposed asphalt concrete mix design in writing to the Engineer.

Replace The First Paragraph of Section 39-2.01A(3)(d) "Test Results", with:

For mix design, JMF verification, production start-up, and each 10,000 tons, submit AASHTO T 283 and AASHTO T 324 (Modified) test results electronically to the Engineer.

Add The Following as the First Paragraph of Section 39-2.01A(4)(b) "Job Mix Formula Verification", with:

At the Engineer's sole discretion, the Engineer may choose to variy the full Job Mix Formula (JMF), or any portion thereof, or accept the Contractors substitted test results in lieu of verification testing in accordance with the following sections. It any case, this verification will serve the purposes of this project alone, and shall not be used for any other project.

Remove the paragraphs of Section 39-2.01A((b) "Job Mix Formula Verification", as follows

Paragraph 9; which start "You may adjust..."

Paragraph 1 valich starts "For each HMA type..."

Paragr oh 11; which starts "A verified JMF..."

Replace Section 39-2.01A(4)(d) "Job Mix Formula Renewal", with:

Replace Section 39-2.01D "Payment" with:

Replace the second paragraph of Section 39-2.02A(1) "Summary", as follows:

You may, by written request separate from the Job Mix Formula (JMF) submittal, request the Engineer allow you to use a Warm Mix Asphalt (WMA) Technology.

Remove the first paragraph and table of Section 39-2.02B(4)(b) "Aggregate Gradations".

Remove the second paragraph and table of Section 39-2.02C "Aggregate Gradations".

A prime/tack coat is required:

- a) Prime Coat shall be applied to the base prior to placing the Hot Mix Asphalt. Prime Coat shall be e-prime or approved equal and will be spread at a rate of 0.15 to 0.35 gal/sy, as directed by the Engineer.
- b) Tack coat shall be applied to existing pavement including planed surfaces, between layers of HMA and vertical surfaces of curbs, gutters, and construction joints. Tack coat must comply with the specifications for asphaltic emulsion in 2015 Caltrans Standard Specifications Section 94, "Asphaltic Emulsion," or asphalt binder in Section 92, "Asphalt Binders." Tack coat shall be spread at a rate of 0.02 to0.10 gal/sy, as directed by the Engineer.

The price paid for asphalt concrete shall include all costs for prime or tack coat(s) applied to all edges and between layers of asphalt concrete paving or overlay.

Additional asphalt concrete surfacing material shall be placed along the edge of the surfacing at road connections and private drives, hand raked, if necessary, undcompacted to form smooth connecting surfaces. Full compensation for furnishing at labor and tools and doing all the work necessary to hand rake said connecting surfaces shall be considered as included in the contract prices paid per ton for the various contract items of asphalt concrete surfacing involved and no additional compensation will be at two therefor.

Replace Section 39 2.020 "Payment" with:

Quantities of asphalt concrete with/with ut RAP, will be paid for at the contract unit price per ton for Asphalt Concrete (Type A, 1/2-inch Aggregate Gradation, PG 70-10 HMA)

shall include full compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment and incidentals, and for doing all the work involved in constructing asphalt concrete complete in place, as shown on the plans, and as specified in the Standard Specifications, these special provisions, and as directed by the Engineer.

10-1.18 PAVEMENT MARKERS

Pavement markers shall conform to the provisions in Section 81-3, "Pavement Markers," of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

The Contractor shall install two-way blue retroreflective markers in accordance with Section 81-3 of the Standard Specifications.

Location of the blue retroreflective pavement markers shall be as shown on California MUTCD 2014 Figure 3B-102 (CA), "Examples of Fire Hydrant Location Pavement Markers," included within these Special Provisions and as directed by the Engineer.

The Contractor shall install Type D two way yellow and Type G one-way clear retroreflective markers as specified on plans.

Full compensation for furnishing and placing blue pavement markers shall be considered as included in the contract prices paid for **Pavement Marker (Retroreflective - Blue)** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

Full compensation for furnishing and placing pavement markers shall be considered as included in the contract prices paid for **Pavement Marker (Retroreflective – Type D and G)** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

10-1.19 PAINT TRAFFIC STRIPES & PAVEMENT MARKINGS (2015 CALTRANS REVISED STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS)

Materials and application for painted traffic stripes (traffic lines) and pavement markings shall conform to the provisions of paint traffic stripes in Section 84-2, "Traffic Stripes and Pavement Markings," of the Standard Specifications.

Traffic stripes and pavement markings shall be white or yellow to match the color of the existing markings as shown on the plans and as noted on the attached Striping and Pavement Marking Locations" (tables) and/or as determined by the Engineer.

The following traffic stripes and pavement markings shall be pointed at the same location of the existing stripes as shown on the plans and as noted on the attached "Striping and Pavement Marking Locations" (tables) and/or as determined by the Engineer.

The 6" single dash yellow centerline strip shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A20A, Detail 1

The 6" single dash yellow cente line stripe shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A20A, Deta 15.

The one direction – no passing zone yellow stripe shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A 0A, Detail 15

The one direction— no passing zone yellow stripe shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A20A, Detail 18

The 6" double y low centerline stripe shall be painted as shown on 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A20A, Detail 21 and shall be counted as 1 stripe per Section 84-3.06 of the Standard Specifications.

The 6" double yellow centerline stripe with raised pavement markers shall be painted as shown on 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A20A, Detail 22 and shall be counted as 1 stripe per Section 84-3.06 of the Standard Specifications.

The 6" white right edgeline stripe shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A20B, Detail 27B.

The Type I 10' straight arrow pavement markings shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24A.

The Type IV right/left turn arrow pavement markings shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24A.

The Type VI merging arrow pavement markings shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24A.

The Type VII left/straight arrow pavement markings shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24A.

The "20", "30", "40". "45", "50" numerical pavement markings shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24C.

The STOP, SIGNAL, AHEAD, white pavement markings shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24D.

The SCHOOL, yellow pavement markings shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24D.

The 12" solid white limit line shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24E.

The 12" solid white (basic) crosswalk lines, golf cart crossing lines, shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24F.

The 12" solid yellow (basic) school crosswalk lines shall be painted as shown per 2018 Caltrans Standard Plan A24F.

The contractor shall make any removals and raint any necessary extensions to existing centerline stripes, lane line stripes, channelizing line stripes caused by realignment of crosswalks as shown on plans and/or as directed by the Engineer.

The contract prices paid per linear foot har faint 6" wide Traffic Stripe (2-Coat), and Paint Double 6" wide Yellow Traffic Stripe (2-Loat) and per square foot for Paint Pavement Marking (2-Coat) shall include fra compensation for furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals, and for oring all the work involved in applying paint stripes and pavement markings, complete in place, including establishing alignment for stripes and layout work, as shown on the plant, as specified in the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions, and as directed by the Engineer.

10-1.20 SURVEY MONUMENTS

Attention is directed to Section 78-2, "Survey Monuments", of the Standard Specifications and these Special Provisions.

The Contractor shall request the County Surveyor to conduct a monument review survey at least two (2) weeks prior to the start of construction to facilitate preservation of existing survey monumentation.

The County Surveyor will provide the contractor with locations of survey monuments prior to paving and will file the required pre-construction documentation. Monuments not disturbed or destroyed during normal construction activities which are within 0.20' of the existing surface prior to construction shall be left exposed at the completion of the paving project. The contractor shall install self-adhesive "I.D.Locators", or equivalent markers approved by the

engineer, over monuments prior to paving and remove the markers at the completion of the paving.

The County Surveyor will reset or replace any survey monumentation located by the preconstruction survey which is destroyed or disturbed by normal construction activities associated with the project, and file the required documentation.

The Contractor shall preserve and protect in place any established survey monumentation, when it is possible to do so. In areas of pavement removal where monuments are disturbed or damaged during construction, and the monuments have been located and referenced by a preconstruction survey, the contractor shall remove the damaged monument in its entirety prior to paving. Monuments not disturbed or damaged by construction activities may be left in place.

If any survey monumentation is disturbed or destroyed through negligence of the contractor, or by reason of the Contractor's failure to conform to requirements of this section, the survey monumentation shall be replaced or restored by the County Surveyor at the Contractor's expense.

Full compensation for conforming to the requirements of the section shall be considered as included in the prices paid for the **various contract items** of **work** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefore.

10-1.21 PERMIT

Prior to construction, the Contractor shall obtain and pay for all permits as required for all work involved within **City of Hesperia.** These Cities do not authorize any work within their jurisdiction without any permit.

A sample copy of City of Hespel a construction or encroachment permit application are attached elsewhere in these special provisions for information purposes only.

The Contractor shall conform to the permit requirements in performance of work on this project.

Full compensation for permit fees and complying with the requirements of City of Hesperia with respect to operations under their jurisdiction, not otherwise provided for, shall be considered as included in the prices paid for the **various contract items of work** and no additional compensation will be allowed therefor.

10-1.22 COORDINATION



1. When crosswalks or other pedestrian facilities are closed or relocated, temporary facilities shall be detectable and shall include accessibility features consistent with the features present in the existing pedestrian facility.

Guidance:


- 2. Where high speeds are anticipated, a temporary traffic barrier and, if necessary, a crash cushion should be used to separate the temporary sidewalks from vehicular traffic.
- 3. Audible information devices should be considered where midblock closings and changed crosswalk areas cause inadequate communication to be provided to pedestrians who have visual disabilities.

Option:

- 4. Street lighting may be considered.
- 5. Only the TTC devices related to pedestrians are shown. Other devices, such as lane closure signing or ROAD NARROWS signs, may be used to control vehicular traffic.
- 6. For nighttime closures, Type A Flashing warning lights may be used on arricad s that support signs and close sidewalks.
- 7. Type C Steady-Burn or Type D 360-degree Steady-Burn warning Lights have used on channelizing devices separating the temporary sidewalks from vehicular traffic flow.
- 8. Signs, such as KEEP RIGHT (LEFT), may be placed along a temp rary sidewalk to guide or direct pedestrians.


Notes for Figure 6H-29—Typical Application 29 Crosswalk Closures and Pedestrian Detours

Standard:

- 1. When crosswalks or other pedestrian facilities are closed or relocated, temporary facilities shall be detectable and shall include accessibility features consistent with the features present in the existing pedestrian facility.
- 2. Curb parking shall be prohibited for at least 50 feet in advance of the midblock crosswalk. Guidance:
 - 2. Parking should be prohibited in advance of mid-block crosswalks. Mid-block crosswalks should be avoided, when possible. See Section 3B.18.
 - 3. Audible information devices should be considered where midblock closings and changed crosswalk areas cause inadequate communication to be provided to pedestrians who have visual disabilities.
- 4. Pedestrian traffic signal displays controlling closed crosswalks should be covered or deactivated. Option:
 - 5. Street lighting may be considered.
 - 6. Only the TTC devices related to pedestrians are shown. Other devices, such as late closure signing or ROAD NARROWS signs, may be used to control vehicular traffic.
 - 7. For nighttime closures, Type A Flashing warning lights may be used a barricades supporting signs and closing sidewalks.
 - 8. Type C Steady-Burn or Type D 360-degree Steady-Burn aming lights may be used on channelizing devices separating the work space from vehicular traffic.
 - 9. In order to maintain the systematic use of the fluorescent, ellow-green background for pedestrian, bicycle, and school warning signs in a jurisdiction, the fluorescent yellow-green background for pedestrian, bicycle, and school warning signs may be used in TTC zones.

CHAPTER 6D. PEDESTRIAN AND WORKER SAFETY

Section 6D.01 Pedestrian Considerations

Support:

of A wide range of pedestrians might be affected by TTC zones, including the young, elderly, and people with disabilities such as hearing, visual, or mobility. These pedestrians need a clearly delineated and usable travel path. Considerations for pedestrians with disabilities are addressed in Section 6D.02.

Standard:

- 02 The various TTC provisions for pedestrian and worker safety set forth in Part 6 shall be applied by knowledgeable (for example, trained and/or certified) persons after appropriate evaluation and engineering judgment.
 - 03 Advance notification of sidewalk closures shall be provided by the maintaining agency.
- 04 If the TTC zone affects the movement of pedestrians, adequate pedestrian access and walkways shall be provided. If the TTC zone affects an accessible and detectable pedestrian facility, the accessibility and detectability shall be maintained along the alternate pedestrian route.

 Option:
- os If establishing or maintaining an alternate pedestrian route is not feasible during the project, an alternate means of providing for pedestrians may be used, such as adding free bas ervice around the project or assigning someone the responsibility to assist pedestrians with disabilities through the project limits. Support:
- ⁰⁶ It must be recognized that pedestrians are reluctant to retrice their steps to a prior intersection for a crossing or to add distance or out-of-the-way travel to a destination.

 Guidance:
 - of The following three items should be considered when playing for pedestrians in TTC zones:
 - A. Pedestrians should not be led into conflicts with vehicles equipment, and operations.
 - B. Pedestrians should not be led into conflict with verifics moving through or around the worksite.
 - C. Pedestrians should be provided with a convenient and accessible path that replicates as nearly as practical the most desirable characteristics of the existing sidewalk(s) or footpath(s).
- 08 A pedestrian route should not be so red and/or moved for non-construction activities such as parking for vehicles and equipment.
- op Consideration should be made to a parate pedestrian movements from both worksite activity and vehicular traffic. Unless an acceptable role that loes not involve crossing the roadway can be provided, pedestrians should be appropriately directed with alwance signing that encourages them to cross to the opposite side of the roadway. In urban and a churba, areas with high vehicular traffic volumes, these signs should be placed at intersections (rather than widblock locations) so that pedestrians are not confronted with midblock worksites that will induce them to attempt skirting the worksite or making a midblock crossing.
- ¹⁰ Figures 6H-28 and 6H-29 show typical TTC device usage and techniques for pedestrian movement through work zones.

Guidance:

- 11 To accommodate the needs of pedestrians, including those with disabilities, the following considerations should be addressed when temporary pedestrian pathways in TTC zones are designed or modified:
 - A. Provisions for continuity of accessible paths for pedestrians should be incorporated into the TTC plan.
 - B. Access to transit stops should be maintained.
 - C. A smooth, continuous hard surface should be provided throughout the entire length of the temporary pedestrian facility. There should be no curbs or abrupt changes in grade or terrain that could cause tripping or be a barrier to wheelchair use. The geometry and alignment of the facility should meet the applicable requirements of the "Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines for Buildings and Facilities (ADAAG)" (see Section 1A.11).
 - D. The width of the existing pedestrian facility should be provided for the temporary facility if practical. Traffic control devices and other construction materials and features should not intrude into the usable width of the

- sidewalk, temporary pathway, or other pedestrian facility. When it is not possible to maintain a minimum width of 60 inches throughout the entire length of the pedestrian pathway, a 60 x 60-inch passing space should be provided at least every 200 feet to allow individuals in wheelchairs to pass.
- E. Blocked routes, alternate crossings, and sign and signal information should be communicated to pedestrians with visual disabilities by providing devices such as audible information devices, accessible pedestrian signals, or barriers and channelizing devices that are detectable to the pedestrians traveling with the aid of a long cane or who have low vision. Where pedestrian traffic is detoured to a TTC signal, engineering judgment should be used to determine if pedestrian signals or accessible pedestrian signals should be considered for crossings along an alternate route.
- F. When channelization is used to delineate a pedestrian pathway, a continuous detectable edging should be provided throughout the length of the facility such that pedestrians using a long cane can follow it. These detectable edgings should comply with the provisions of Section 6F.74.
- G. Signs and other devices mounted lower than 7 feet above the temporary pedestrian pathway should not project more than 4 inches into accessible pedestrian facilities.

Option:

12 Whenever it is feasible, closing off the worksite from pedestrian intrusion probe preferable to channelizing pedestrian traffic along the site with TTC devices.

Guidance:

- 13 Fencing should not create sight distance restrictions for road users. Fencis should not be constructed of materials that would be hazardous if impacted by vehicles. Wooden children fencing, and similar systems placed immediately adjacent to motor vehicle traffic should not be used as such fitters for crashworthy temporary traffic barriers.
- 14 Ballast for TTC devices should be kept to the minimum amount needed and should be mounted low to prevent penetration of the vehicle windshield.
- 15 Movement by work vehicles and equipment across designated pedestrian paths should be minimized and, when necessary, should be controlled by flaggers or TC. Staging or stopping of work vehicles or equipment along the side of pedestrian paths should be avoided, since it encourages movement of workers, equipment, and materials across the pedestrian path.
- 16 Access to the work space by workers and equipment across pedestrian walkways should be minimized because the access often creates unacceptable changes in grade, and rough or muddy terrain, and pedestrians will tend to avoid these areas by attempting non-intersection crossings where no curb ramps are available. Option:
- 17 A canopied walkway may be used to protect pedestrians from falling debris, and to provide a covered passage for pedestrians.

Guidance:

- 18 Covered walkways should be turdily constructed and adequately lighted for nighttime use.
- 19 When pedestrian and vericle paths are rerouted to a closer proximity to each other, consideration should be given to separating them by a temporary traffic barrier.
- 20 If a temporary traffic barrier is used to shield pedestrians, it should be designed to accommodate site conditions.

Support:

21 Depending on the possible vehicular speed and angle of impact, temporary traffic barriers might deflect upon impact by an errant vehicle. Guidance for locating and designing temporary traffic barriers can be found in Chapter 9 of AASHTO's "Roadside Design Guide" (see Section 1A.11).

Standard:

22 Short intermittent segments of temporary traffic barrier shall not be used because they nullify the containment and redirective capabilities of the temporary traffic barrier, increase the potential for serious injury both to vehicle occupants and pedestrians, and encourage the presence of blunt, leading ends. All upstream leading ends that are present shall be appropriately flared or protected with properly installed and maintained crashworthy cushions. Adjacent temporary traffic barrier segments shall be properly connected in order to provide the overall strength required for the temporary traffic barrier to perform properly.

23 Normal vertical curbing shall not be used as a substitute for temporary traffic barriers when temporary traffic barriers are needed.

Option:

²⁴ Temporary traffic barriers or longitudinal channelizing devices may be used to discourage pedestrians from unauthorized movements into the work space. They may also be used to inhibit conflicts with vehicular traffic by minimizing the possibility of midblock crossings.

Support:

25 A major concern for pedestrians is urban and suburban building construction encroaching onto the contiguous sidewalks, which forces pedestrians off the curb into direct conflict with moving vehicles.

26 If a significant potential exists for vehicle incursions into the pedestrian path, pedestrians should be rerouted or temporary traffic barriers should be installed.

Support:

27 TTC devices, jersey barriers, and wood or chain link fencing with a continuous detectable edging can satisfactorily delineate a pedestrian path.

Guidance:

28 Tape, rope, or plastic chain strung between devices are not detectable, de not comply with the design standards in the "Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines for Luildings and Facilities (ADAAG)" (see Section 1A.11), and should not be used as a control for pedestrian povements.

29 In general, pedestrian routes should be preserved in urban and compression suburban areas. Alternative routing should be discouraged.

30 The highway agency in charge of the TTC zone should regularly inspect the activity area so that effective pedestrian TTC is maintained.

Support:

31 Other laws and requirements are unique to California and need to be followed when providing pedestrian access through or around TTC zones.

of Additional information on the design and construction of accessible temporary facilities is found in publications listed in Section 1A 11 (see Publications 12, 38, 39, and 42).

Guidance:

of The extent of pedestri, a needs should be determined through engineering judgment or by the individual responsible for each TTC zone situation. Adequate provisions should be made for pedestrians with disabilities.

Standard:

03 When existing pedestrian facilities are disrupted, closed, or relocated in a TTC zone, the temporary facilities shall be detectable and include accessibility features consistent with the features present in the existing pedestrian facility. Where pedestrians with visual disabilities normally use the closed sidewalk, a barrier that is detectable by a person with a visual disability traveling with the aid of a long cane shall be placed across the full width of the closed sidewalk.

Support:

o4 Maintaining a detectable, channelized pedestrian route is much more useful to pedestrians who have visual disabilities than closing a walkway and providing audible directions to an alternate route involving additional crossings and a return to the original route. Braille is not useful in conveying such information because it is difficult to find. Audible instructions might be provided, but the extra distance and additional street crossings might add complexity to a trip.

Guidance:

05 Because printed signs and surface delineation are not usable by pedestrians with visual disabilities, blocked routes, alternate crossings, and sign and signal information should be communicated to pedestrians with visual

disabilities by providing audible information devices, accessible pedestrian signals, and barriers and channelizing devices that are detectable to pedestrians traveling with the aid of a long cane or who have low vision.

Support:

of The most desirable way to provide information to pedestrians with visual disabilities that is equivalent to visual signing for notification of sidewalk closures is a speech message provided by an audible information device. Devices that provide speech messages in response to passive pedestrian actuation are the most desirable. Other devices that continuously emit a message, or that emit a message in response to use of a pushbutton, are also acceptable, signing information can also be transmitted to personal receivers, but currently such receivers are not likely to be carried or used by pedestrians with visual disabilities in TTC zones. Audible information devices might not be needed if detectable channelizing devices make an alternate route of travel evident to pedestrians with visual disabilities.

Guidance:

or If a pushbutton is used to provide equivalent TTC information to pedestrians with visual disabilities, the pushbutton should be equipped with a locator tone to notify pedestrians with visual disabilities that a special accommodation is available, and to help them locate the pushbutton.

Section 6D.03 Worker Safety Considerations

Support:


of Equally as important as the safety of road users traveling through the TC zone is the safety of workers. TTC zones present temporary and constantly changing conditions that are unexpected by the road user. This creates an even higher degree of vulnerability for workers on or near the today.


o2 Maintaining TTC zones with road user flow inhibited a little as possible, and using TTC devices that get the road user's attention and provide positive direction are of particular importance. Likewise, equipment and vehicles moving within the activity area create a risk of workers on foot. When possible, the separation of moving equipment and construction vehicles from workers of foot provides the operator of these vehicles with a greater separation clearance and improved sight lines to minimize exposure to the hazards of moving vehicles and equipment.


Guidance:


03 The following are the key elements of worker safety and TTC management that should be considered to improve worker safety:

- A. Training—all workers should be vained on how to work next to motor vehicle traffic in a way that minimizes their vulnerability. Worker having specific TTC responsibilities should be trained in TTC techniques, device usage, and place vehicles.
- B. Temporary Traffic Barriers—temporary traffic barriers should be placed along the work space depending on factors such as la val cicarance of workers from adjacent traffic, speed of traffic, duration and type of operations, time of day, and volume of traffic.
- C. Speed Reduction—reducing the speed of vehicular traffic, mainly through regulatory speed zoning, funneling, lane reduction, or the use of uniformed law enforcement officers or flaggers, should be considered. The use of regulatory speed zone signing tends to be more effective when law enforcement is present. Refer to Section 6C.01.
- D. Activity Area—planning the internal work activity area to minimize backing-up maneuvers of construction vehicles should be considered to minimize the exposure to risk.
- E. Worker Safety Planning—a trained person designated by the employer should conduct a basic hazard assessment for the worksite and job classifications required in the activity area. This safety professional should determine whether engineering, administrative, or personal protection measures should be implemented. This plan should be in accordance with the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, as amended, "General Duty Clause" Section 5(a)(1) Public Law 91-596, 84 Stat. 1590, December 29, 1970, as amended, and with the requirement to assess worker risk exposures for each job site and job classification, as per 29 CFR 1926.20 (b)(2) of "Occupational Safety and Health Administration Regulations, General Safety and Health Provisions" (see Section 1A.11).








- (d) (1) (A) Upon receipt of a claim pursuant to this section, the public entity to which the claim applies shall conduct a reasonable review of the claim and, which is seriod not to exceed 45 days, shall provide the claimant a written statement identifying that portion of the claim is disputed and what portion is undisputed. Upon receipt a claim, a public entity and a contractor may, by mutual agreement, extend the time period provided in this subdivision.
- (B) The claimant shall furnish reasonable document ion to support the claim.
- (C) If the public entity needs approval from its governing body to provide the claimant a written statement identifying the disputed porton and the undisputed portion of the claim, and the governing body does not meet within the 5 days or within the mutually agreed to extension of time following receipt of a claim sent by registered mail or certified mail, return receipt requested, the public entity shall have up to three days following the next duly publicly noticed meeting of the governing bray after the 45-day period, or extension, expires to provide the claimant a written statement identifying the disputed portion and the undisputed portion.
- (D) Any payment due on an andisputed portion of the claim shall be processed and made within 60 days after the public entity issues its written statement. If the public entity fails to issue a written statement paragraph (3) shall apply.
- (2) (A) If the claimant disputes the public entity's written response, or if the public entity fails to respond to a claim issued pursuant to this section within the time prescribed, the claimant may demand in writing an informal conference to meet and confer for settlement of the issues in dispute. Upon receipt of a demand in writing sent by registered mail or certified mail, return receipt requested, the public entity shall schedule a meet and confer conference within 30 days for settlement of the dispute.
- (B) Within 10 business days following the conclusion of the meet and confer conference, if the claim or any portion of the claim remains in dispute, the public entity shall provide the claimant a written statement identifying the portion of the claim that remains in dispute and the portion that is undisputed. Any payment due on an undisputed portion of the claim shall be processed and made within 60 days after the public entity issues its written statement. Any disputed portion of the claim, as identified by the contractor in writing, shall be submitted to nonbinding mediation, with the public entity and the claimant sharing the associated costs equally. The

public entity and claimant shall mutually agree to a mediator within 10 business days after the disputed portion of the claim has been identified in writing. If the parties cannot agree upon a mediator, each party shall select a mediator and those mediators shall select a qualified neutral third party to mediate with regard to the disputed portion of the claim. Each party shall bear the fees and costs charged by its respective mediator in connection with the selection of the neutral mediator. If mediation is unsuccessful, the parts of the claim remaining in dispute shall be subject to applicable procedures outside this section.

- (C) For purposes of this section, mediation includes any nonbinding process, including, but not limited to, neutral evaluation or a dispute review board, in which an independent third party or board assists the parties in dispute resolution through negotiation or by issuance of an evaluation. Any mediation utilized shall conform to the timeframes in this section.
- (D) Unless otherwise agreed to by the public entity and the contractor in writing, the mediation conducted pursuant to this section shall excuse any further obligation under Section 20104.4 to mediate after litigation has been commenced.
- (E) This section does not preclude a public entity from requiring a bitration of disputes under private arbitration or the Public Works Contract Arbitration program, if mediation under this section does not resolve the parties' dispute.
- (3) Failure by the public entity to respond to a claim from a contractor within the time periods described in this subdivision or to otherwise meet the time requirements of this section shall result in the claim being deemed rejected in its entirety. A claim that is denied by reason of the public entity's failure to have responded to a claim, or its failure to otherwise meet the time requirements of this section, shall not constitute an adverse finding with regard to the merits of the claim or the responsibility or qualifications of the claimant.
- (4) Amounts not paid in a timely manner as required by this section shall bear interest at 7 percent per annum.
- (5) If a subcontractor or a lower ties subcontractor lacks legal standing to assert a claim against a public entity because pivily a contract does not exist, the contractor may present to the public entity a claim to be left of a subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor. A subcontractor may request in writing either on his or her own behalf or on behalf of a lower tier subcontractor, that the contractor present a claim for work which was performed by the subcontractor or by a lower tier subcontractor on behalf of the subcontractor. The subcontractor requesting that the claim be presented to the public entity shall furnish reasonable documentation to support the claim. Within 45 days of receipt of this written request, the contractor shall notify the subcontractor in writing as to whether the contractor presented the claim to the public entity and, if the original contractor did not present the claim, provide the subcontractor with a statement of the reasons for not having done so.
- (e) The text of this section or a summary of it shall be set forth in the plans or specifications for any public works project that may give rise to a claim under this section.
- (f) A waiver of the rights granted by this section is void and contrary to public policy, provided, however, that (1) upon receipt of a claim, the parties may mutually agree to waive, in writing, mediation and proceed directly to the commencement of a civil action or binding arbitration, as applicable; and (2) a public entity may prescribe reasonable change order, claim, and dispute

resolution procedures and requirements in addition to the provisions of this section, so long as the contractual provisions do not conflict with or otherwise impair the timeframes and procedures set forth in this section.

- (g) This section applies to contracts entered into on or after January 1, 2017.
- (h) Nothing in this section shall impose liability upon a public entity that makes loans or grants available through a competitive application process, for the failure of an awardee to meet its contractual obligations.
- (i) This section shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2020, and as of that date is repealed, unless a later enacted statute, that is enacted before January 1, 2020, deletes or extends that date.

20104.

- (a)(1) This article applies to all public works claims of three hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$375,000) or less which arise between a contractor and a local agency.
- (2) This article shall not apply to any claims resulting from a contract tetween a contractor and a public agency when the public agency has elected to recolve my disputes pursuant to Article 7.1 (commencing with Section 10240) of Chapter 1 of Part 2.
- (b)(1) "Public work" means "public works contract" as defined in Section 1101 but does not include any work or improvement contracted for by the state or the Regents of the University of California.
- (2) "Claim" means a separate demand by the contractor for (A) a time extension, (B) payment of money or damages arising from work a ne by, or on behalf of, the contractor pursuant to the contract for a public work and payment of which is not otherwise expressly provided for or the claimant is not otherwise entitled to, or (C) an amount the payment of which is disputed by the local agency.
- (c) The provisions of this acticle or a summary thereof shall be set forth in the plans or specifications for any work which may give rise to a claim under this article.
- (d) This article applies only to contracts entered into on or after January 1, 1991.

20104.2 For any claim subject to this article, the following requirements apply:

- (a) The claim shall be in writing and include the documents necessary to substantiate the claim. Claims must be filed on or before the date of final payment. Nothing in this subdivision is intended to extend the time limit or supersede notice requirements otherwise provided by contract for the filing of claims.
- (b)(1) For claims of less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), the local agency shall respond in writing to any written claim within 45 days of receipt of the claim, or may request, in writing, within 30 days of receipt of the claim, any additional documentation supporting the claim or relating to defenses to the claim the local agency may have against the claimant.

- (2) If additional information is thereafter required, it shall be requested and provided pursuant to this subdivision, upon mutual agreement of the local agency and the claimant.
- (3) The local agency's written response to the claim, as further documented, shall be submitted to the claimant within 15 days after receipt of the further documentation or within a period of time no greater than that taken by the claimant in producing the additional information, whichever is greater.
- (c)(1) For claims of over fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) and less than or equal to three hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$375,000), the local agency shall respond in writing to all written claims within 60 days of receipt of the claim, or may request, in writing, within 30 days of receipt of the claim, any additional documentation supporting the claim or relating to defenses to the claim the local agency may have against the claimant.
- (2) If additional information is thereafter required, it shall be requested and provided pursuant to this subdivision, upon mutual agreement of the local agency and the claimant.
- (3) The local agency's written response to the claim, as further documented, shall be submitted to the claimant within 30 days after receipt of the further documentation, or within a period of time no greater than that taken by the claimant in producing the additional information or requested documentation, whichever is greater.
- (d) If the claimant disputes the local agency's writer response, or the local agency fails to respond within the time prescribed, the claimant may so notify the local agency, in writing, either within 15 days of receipt of the local agency's response or within 15 days of the local agency's failure to respond within the time prescribed, respectively, and demand an informal conference to meet and confer for settlement of the local agency shall schedule a meet and confer conference within 30 days for settlement of the dispute.
- (e) Following the meet and confer conference, if the claim or any portion remains in dispute, the claimant may file a claim as provided in Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 900) and Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 910) of Part 3 of Division 3.6 of Title 1 of the Government Code. For purposes of these provisions, the running of the period of time within which a claim must be filed shall be to be from the time the claimant submits his or her written claim pursuant to subdivision (a) until the time that claim is denied as a result of the meet and confer process, including any period of time utilized by the meet and confer process.
- (f) This article does not apply to tort claims and nothing in this article is intended nor shall be construed to change the time periods for filing tort claims or actions specified by Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 900) and Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 910) of Part 3 of Division 3.6 of Title 1 of the Government Code.
- The following procedures are established for all civil actions filed to resolve claims subject to this article:
- (a) Within 60 days, but no earlier than 30 days, following the filing or responsive pleadings, the court shall submit the matter to nonbinding mediation unless waived by mutual stipulation of both parties. The mediation process shall provide for the selection within 15 days by both parties of a disinterested third person as mediator, shall be commenced within 30 days of the

submittal, and shall be concluded within 15 days from the commencement of the mediation unless a time requirement is extended upon a good cause showing to the court or by stipulation of both parties. If the parties fail to select a mediator within the 15-day period, any party may petition the court to appoint the mediator.

- (b)(1) If the matter remains in dispute, the case shall be submitted to judicial arbitration pursuant to Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 1141.10) of Title 3 of Part 3 of the Code of Civil Procedure, notwithstanding Section 1141.11 of that code. The Civil Discovery Act (Title 4 (commencing with Section 2016.10) of Part 4 of the Code of Civil Procedure) shall apply to any proceeding brought under this subdivision consistent with the rules pertaining to judicial arbitration.
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, upon stipulation of the parties, arbitrators appointed for purposes of this article shall be experienced in construction law, and, upon stipulation of the parties, mediators and arbitrators shall be paid necessary and reasonable hourly rates of pay not to exceed their customary rate, and such fees and expenses shall be paid equally by the parties, except in the case of arbitration where the arbitrator, for good cause, determines a different division. In no event shall these fees of expenses be paid by state or county funds.
- (3) In addition to Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 1.41.10) of Title 3 of Part 3 of the Code of Civil Procedure, any party who after receiving an arbitration award requests a trial de novo but does not obtain a more favorable judgment shall in addition to payment of costs and fees under that chapter, pay the attorney's fees on the other party arising out of the trial de novo.
- (c) The court may, upon request by any party, order any witnesses to participate in the mediation or arbitration process.

20104.6

- (a) No local agency shall f il to pay money as to any portion of a claim which is undisputed except as otherwise provided in the contract.
- (b) In any suit filed under Section 20104.4, the local agency shall pay interest at the legal rate on any arbitration award or judgment. The interest shall begin to accrue on the date the suit is filed in a court of law.

ARTICLE 1.7

Modification; Performance, Payment

20104.50

(a) (1) It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this section to require all local governments to pay their contractors on time so that these contractors can meet their own obligations. In requiring prompt payment by all local governments, the Legislature hereby finds and declares that the prompt payment of outstanding receipts is not merely a municipal affair, but is, instead, a matter of statewide concern.

- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this article to fully occupy the field of public policy relating to the prompt payment of local governments' outstanding receipts. The Legislature finds and declares that all government officials, including those in local government, must set a standard of prompt payment that any business in the private sector which may contract for services should look towards for guidance.
- (b) Any local agency which fails to make any progress payment within 30 days after receipt of an undisputed and properly submitted payment request from a contractor on a construction contract shall pay interest to the contractor equivalent to the legal rate set forth in subdivision (a) of Section 685.010 of the Code of Civil Procedure.
- (c) Upon receipt of a payment request, each local agency shall act in accordance with both of the following:
- (1) Each payment request shall be reviewed by the local agency as soon as practicable after receipt for the purpose of determining that the payment request is a proper payment request.
- (2) Any payment request determined not to be a proper payment request suitable for payment shall be returned to the contractor as soon as practicable, but not late than seven days, after receipt. A request returned pursuant to this paragraph shall be a companied by a document setting forth in writing the reasons why the payment request is not proper.
- (d) The number of days available to a local agency to make a payment without incurring interest pursuant to this section shall be reduced by the number of days by which a local agency exceeds the seven-day return requirement set forth in paragraph (2) of subdivision (c).
- (e) For purposes of this article:
- (1) A "local agency" includes, but is not limited to, a city, including a charter city, a county, and a city and county, and is any public entity subject to this part.
- (2) A "progress payment" includes all payments due contractors, except that portion of the final payment designated by the contract as retention earnings.
- (3) A payment request shall be considered properly executed if funds are available for payment of the payment request, and payment is not delayed due to an audit inquiry by the financial officer of the local agency.
- (f) Each local agency shall require that this article, or a summary thereof, be set forth in the terms of any contract subject to this article.



I agree to provide County with any relevant information requested and shall permit County access to company's parises upon reasonable notice for purposes on interviewing employees and inspecting records. I shall maintain all project records for at least three (3) years after final payment under the contract.

ARTICLE XI. Contractor shall comply with the Prevailing Wage Laws described in this Agreement, including Exhibit A.

As required by Labor Code section 1.71.1(a) "A contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid on, be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of any contract for public work, is exampled in this chapter, unless currently registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5. It is not a violation of this section for an unregistered contractor to submit a bid that is authorized by Section 7029.1 of the Business and Professions Code or by Section 10164 or 20103.5 of the Public Contract Code, provided the contractor is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 at the time the contract is awarded."

EXHIBIT A - PREVAILING WAGE REQUIREMENTS

A. All or a portion of the Scope of Work in the Contract requires the payment of prevailing wages and compliance with the following requirements:

1. Determination of Prevailing Rates:

Pursuant to Labor Code sections 1770, et seq., the County has obtained from the Director of the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) pursuant to the California Labor Code, the general prevailing rates of per diem wages and the prevailing rates for holiday and overtime work in the locality in which the Scope of Work is to be performed. Copies of said rates are on file with the County, will be made available for inspection during regular business hours, may be included elsewhere in the specifications for the Scope of Work, and are also available online at www.dir.ca.gov. The wage rate for any classification not listed, but which may be required to execute the Scope of Work, shall be commensurate and in accord with specified rates for similar or comparable classifications for those performing similar or comparable duties. In accordance with Labor Code section 1773.2, the Contractor shall post, at appropriate and conspicuous locations on the job site, a schedule showing all applicable prevailing wage rates and shall comply with the requirements of Labor Code section 5 17 3, et seq.

2. Payment of Prevailing Rates

Each worker of the Contractor, or any subcontractor, engages in the Scope of Work, shall be paid not less than the general prevailing wage rate recardless of any contractual relationship which may be alleged to exist between the Contractor, and subcontractor, and such worker.

3. Prevailing Rate Penalty

The Contractor shall, as a penalty, forfeit two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to the County for each calendar day or portion thereof, for each volve paid less than the prevailing rates as determined by the Director of the DIR for each work or craft in which such worker is employed by the Contractor or by any subcontractor in connection with the Scope of Work. Pursuant to California Labor Code section 1773, the difference between such prevailing wage rates and the amount paid to each worker for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for which each worker was paid less than the prevailing wage rate, shall be paid to each worker by the Contractor.

4. Ineligible Contractors:

Pursuant to the provisions If Labor Code section 1777.1, the Labor Commissioner publishes contractors ineligible to perform work as a contractor or subcontractor on and distributes a list a public works project. his list of debarred contractors is available from the DIR website at /Public-Works/PublicWorks.html. Any contract entered into between a http://www.dir.ca.go contractor and a lebaned subcontractor is void as a matter of law. A debarred subcontractor may not rec ve public money for performing work as a subcontractor on a public works my public money that may have been paid to a debarred subcontractor by a contract, and contractor on the project shall be returned to the County. The Contractor shall be responsible for the payment of wages to workers as a debarred subcontractor who has been allowed to work on the Scope of Work.

5. Payroll Records:

a. Pursuant to California Labor Code section 1776, the Contractor and each subcontractor, shall keep accurate certified payroll records, showing the name, address, social security number, work classification, straight time and overtime hours worked each day and week, and the actual per diem wages paid to each journeyman, apprentice, worker or other employee employed by them in connection with the Scope of Work. The payroll records enumerated herein shall be verified by a written declaration made under penalty of perjury that the information contained in the payroll record is true and correct and that the Contractor or subcontractor has complied with the requirements of the California Labor Code sections 1771, 1811, and 1815 for any Scope of Work performed by his or her employees. The payroll records shall be available for inspection at all reasonable hours at the principal office of the Contractor on the following basis:

- i. A certified copy of an employee's payroll record shall be made available for inspection or furnished to such employee or his/her authorized representative on request;
- ii. A certified copy of all payroll records shall be made available for inspection or furnished upon request to the County, the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement of the DIR;
- iii. A certified copy of payroll records shall be made available upon request to the public for inspection or copies thereof made; provided, however, that a request by the public shall be made through either the County or the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement. If the requested payroll records have not been previously provided to the County or the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement, the requesting party shall, prior to being provided the records, reimburse the cost of preparation by the Contractor, subcontractor and the entity through which the request was made; the public shall not be given access to such records at the principal office of the Contractor;
- iv. The Contractor shall file a certified copy of the payroll records with the entity that requested such records within ten (10) days after receipt of a written request; and
- v. Copies provided to the public, by the County or the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement shall be marked or obliterated in such a manuer as to prevent disclosure of an individual's name, address and social security number. The name and address of the Contractor or any subcontractor, performing a pant of the Scope of Work shall not be marked or obliterated. The Contractor shall inform the County of the location of payroll records, including the street address, city and courty and shall, within five (5) working days, provide a notice of a change of location and address.
- b. The Contractor shall have ten (10) days from Leceipt of the written notice specifying in what respects the Contractor must comply with the above requirements. In the event Contractor does not comply with the requirements on the section within the ten (10) day period, the Contractor shall, as a penalty to the County, forfeit one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each calendar day, or portion thereof for each worker, until strict compliance is effectuated. Upon the request of the Division of Lab estandards Enforcement, such penalty shall be withheld from any portion of the payments then due or to become due to the Contractor.

6. Limits on Hours of Work:

Pursuant to California Lator Code section 1810, eight (8) hours of labor shall constitute a legal day's work. Pursuant to California Labor Code section 1811, the time of service of any worker employed at any time by the Contractor or by a subcontractor, upon the Scope of Work or upon any part of the California Labor Code section 1815. Is limited and restricted to eight (8) hours during any one calendar week, except as provided for under Labor Code section 1815. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, work performed by employees of Contractor or any subcontractor, in excess of eight (8) hours per day and forty (40) hours during any one week, shall be permitted upon compensation for all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day at not less than one and one-half (1½) times the basic rate of pay.

7. Penalty for Excess Hours:

The Contractor shall pay to the County a penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each worker employed on the Scope of Work by the Contractor or any subcontractor, for each calendar day during which such worker is required or permitted to work more than eight (8) hours in any calendar day and forty (40) hours in any one calendar week, in violation of the provisions of the California Labor Code, unless compensation to the worker so employed by the Contractor is not less than one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day.

8. Senate Bill 854 (Chapter 28, Statutes of 2014) and Senate Bill 96 (Chapter 28, Statutes of 2017) Requirements:

- a. Contractor shall comply with Senate Bill 854 and Senate Bill 96. The requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - No contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a bid proposal (submitted on or after March 1, 2015) for a public works project unless registered with the DIR pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5, with limited exceptions from this requirements for bid purposes only as allowed under Labor Code section 1771.1(a).
 - ii. No contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a contract for public work or perform work on a public works project (awarded on or after April 1, 2015) unless registered with the DIR pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5.
 - iii. This project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the DIR.
 - iv. As required by the DIR, Contractor is required to post job site notices, as prescribed by regulation, regarding compliance monitoring and enforcement by the DIR.
 - v. Contractors and all subcontractors must submit certified payroll records online to the Labor Commissioner for all new public works projects issued on or after April 1, 2015, and for all public works projects, new or ongoing, on or after January 1, 2016.
 - 1) The certified payroll must be submitted at least monthly to the Labor Commissioner.
 - 2) The County reserves the right to require Contractor and all subcontractors to submit certified payroll records more frequently than monthly to the Labor Commissioner.
 - 3) The certified payroll records must be in a format prescribed by the Labor Commissioner.
 - vi. Registration with the DIR and the such ssion of certified payroll records to the Labor Commissioner are not required if the profit works project is \$25,000 or less when the project is for construction, alteration, lemolition, installation or repair work, or if the public works project is \$15,000 or less when the project is for maintenance work.
- b. Labor Code section 1725.5 states the following:

"A contractor shall be recittered pursuant to this section to be qualified to bid on, be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of any public work contract that is subject to the requirements of this chapter. For the purposes of this section, "contractor" includes a subcontractor as defined by Section 1722.1.

- (a) To qualify the stration under this section, a contractor shall do all of the following:
- (1) (A) Register with the Department of Industrial Relations in the manner prescribed by the department and pay an initial nonrefundable application fee of four hundred dollars (\$400) to qualify for registration under this section and an annual renewal fee on or before July 1 of each year thereafter. The annual renewal fee shall be in a uniform amount set by the Director of Industrial Relations, and the initial registration and renewal fees may be adjusted no more than annually by the director to support the costs specified in Section 1771.3.
- (B) Beginning June 1, 2019, a contractor may register or renew according to this subdivision in annual increments up to three years from the date of registration. Contractors who wish to do so will be required to prepay the applicable nonrefundable application or renewal fees to qualify for the number of years for which they wish to preregister.
- (2) Provide evidence, disclosures, or releases as are necessary to establish all of the following:
- (A) Workers' compensation coverage that meets the requirements of Division 4 (commencing with Section 3200) and includes sufficient coverage for any worker whom the contractor

employs to perform work that is subject to prevailing wage requirements other than a contractor who is separately registered under this section. Coverage may be evidenced by a current and valid certificate of workers' compensation insurance or certification of self-insurance required under Section 7125 of the Business and Professions Code.

- (B) If applicable, the contractor is licensed in accordance with Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 7000) of the Business and Professions Code.
- (C) The contractor does not have any delinquent liability to an employee or the state for any assessment of back wages or related damages, interest, fines, or penalties pursuant to any final judgment, order, or determination by a court or any federal, state, or local administrative agency, including a confirmed arbitration award. However, for purposes of this paragraph, the contractor shall not be disqualified for any judgment, order, or determination that is under appeal, provided that the contractor has secured the payment of any amount eventually found due through a bond or other appropriate means.
- (D) The contractor is not currently debarred under Section 1777.1 or under any other federal or state law providing for the debarment of contractors from public works.
- (E) The contractor has not bid on a public works contract, been listed in a bid proposal, or engaged in the performance of a contract for public works without being lawfully registered in accordance with this section, within the preceding 12 montrs of since the effective date of the requirements set forth in subdivision (e), whichever is earlier. If a contractor is found to be in violation of the requirements of this paragraph, the period of disqualification shall be waived if both of the following are true:
- (i) The contractor has not previously been outlet be in violation of the requirements of this paragraph within the preceding 12 months.
- (ii) The contractor pays an additional nonrefundable penalty registration fee of two thousand dollars (\$2,000).
- (b) Fees received pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the State Public Works Enforcement Fund established by Section 1771.3 and shall be used only for the purposes specified in that section.
- (c) A contractor who fails to pay the renewal fee required under paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) on or before the excitation of any prior period of registration shall be prohibited from bidding on or engaging in the performance of any contract for public work until once again registered pursuant to it is seed. If the failure to pay the renewal fee was inadvertent, the contractor may renew its registration retroactively by paying an additional nonrefundable penalty renewal fee equal to the amount of the renewal fee within 90 days of the due date of the renewal fee.
- (d) If, after a body awarding a contract accepts the contractor's bid or awards the contract, the work covered by the bid or contract is determined to be a public work to which Section 1771 applies, either as the result of a determination by the director pursuant to Section 1773.5 or a court decision, the requirements of this section shall not apply, subject to the following requirements:
- (1) The body that awarded the contract failed, in the bid specification or in the contract documents, to identify as a public work that portion of the work that the determination or decision subsequently classifies as a public work.
- (2) Within 20 days following service of notice on the awarding body of a determination by the Director of Industrial Relations pursuant to Section 1773.5 or a decision by a court that the contract was for public work as defined in this chapter, the contractor and any subcontractors

are registered under this section or are replaced by a contractor or subcontractors who are registered under this section.

- (3) The requirements of this section shall apply prospectively only to any subsequent bid, bid proposal, contract, or work performed after the awarding body is served with notice of the determination or decision referred to in paragraph (2).
- (e) The requirements of this section shall apply to any bid proposal submitted on or after March 1, 2015, to any contract for public work, as defined in this chapter, executed on or after April 1, 2015, and to any work performed under a contract for public work on or after January 1, 2018, regardless of when the contract for public work was executed.
- (f) This section does not apply to work performed on a public works project of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) or less when the project is for construction, alteration, demolition, installation, or repair work or to work performed on a public works project of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) or less when the project is for maintenance work."

c. Labor Code section 1771.1 states the following:

- "(a) A contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid on be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of any contract for public work, as deticed at this chapter, unless currently registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Jection 1725.5. It is not a violation of this section for an unregistered contractor to submit a balanat is authorized by Section 7029.1 of the Business and Professions Code or by Section 10164 or 20103.5 of the Public Contract Code, provided the contractor is registered to renorm public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 at the time the contract is awarded.
- (b) Notice of the requirement described in subdivision (a) shall be included in all bid invitations and public works contracts, and a bid but not be accepted nor any contract or subcontract entered into without proof of the contractor or subcontractor's current registration to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5.
- (c) An inadvertent error in listing a subcontractor who is not registered pursuant to Section 1725.5 in a bid proposal shall not be grounds for filing a bid protest or grounds for considering the bid nonrespondive, provided that any of the following apply:
- (1) The subcontractor is registered prior to the bid opening.
- (2) Within 2 harm after the bid opening, the subcontractor is registered and has paid the penalty registration fee specified in subparagraph (E) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 1725.5.
- (3) The subcontractor is replaced by another registered subcontractor pursuant to Section 4107 of the Public Contract Code.
- (d) Failure by a subcontractor to be registered to perform public work as required by subdivision (a) shall be grounds under Section 4107 of the Public Contract Code for the contractor, with the consent of the awarding authority, to substitute a subcontractor who is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 in place of the unregistered subcontractor.
- (e) The department shall maintain on its Internet Web site a list of contractors who are currently registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5.
- (f) A contract entered into with any contractor or subcontractor in violation of subdivision (a) shall be subject to cancellation, provided that a contract for public work shall not be unlawful, void, or voidable solely due to the failure of the awarding body, contractor, or any subcontractor to comply with the requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section.

- (g) If the Labor Commissioner or his or her designee determines that a contractor or subcontractor engaged in the performance of any public work contract without having been registered in accordance with this section, the contractor or subcontractor shall forfeit, as a civil penalty to the state, one hundred dollars (\$100) for each day of work performed in violation of the registration requirement, not to exceed an aggregate penalty of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) in addition to any penalty registration fee assessed pursuant to clause (ii) of subparagraph (E) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 1725.5.
- (h)(1) In addition to, or in lieu of, any other penalty or sanction authorized pursuant to this chapter, a higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor who is found to have entered into a subcontract with an unregistered lower tier subcontractor to perform any public work in violation of the requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section shall be subject to forfeiture, as a civil penalty to the state, of one hundred dollars (\$100) for each day the unregistered lower tier subcontractor performs work in violation of the registration requirement, not to exceed an aggregate penalty of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).
- (2) The Labor Commissioner shall use the same standards specified in subparagraph (A) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 1775 when determining the severity of the violation and what penalty to assess, and may waive the penalty for a first time violation that was unintentional and did not hinder the Labor Commission as ablity to monitor and enforce compliance with the requirements of this chapter.
- (3) A higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor shall not be liability for penalties assessed pursuant to paragraph (1) if the lower tier subcontractor's performance is in violation of the requirements of Section 1725.5 due to the reportation of a previously approved registration.
- (4) A subcontractor shall not be liable for an expensive assessed against a higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor pursuant to paragraph (1). A higher tiered public works contractor or subcontractor may not require a lower tiered subcontractor to indemnity or otherwise be liable for any penaltics pursuant to paragraph (1).
- (i) The Labor Commissioner of the or her designee shall issue a civil wage and penalty assessment, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1741, upon determination of penalties pursuant to subdivision (r), and subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (h). Review of a civil wage and penalty assessment issued under this subdivision may be requested in accordance with the previsions of Section 1742. The regulations of the Director of Industrial Relations, which givern pioceedings for review of civil wage and penalty assessments and the withholding of centrest payments under Article 1 (commencing with Section 1720) and Article 2 (commencing with Section 1770), shall apply.
- (j)(1) Where a contractor or subcontractor engages in the performance of any public work contract without having been registered in violation of the requirements of Section 1725.5 or this section, the Labor Commissioner shall issue and serve a stop order prohibiting the use of the unregistered contractor or the unregistered subcontractor on all public works until the unregistered contractor or unregistered subcontractor is registered. The stop order shall not apply to work by registered contractors or subcontractors on the public work.
- (2) A stop order may be personally served upon the contractor or subcontractor by either of the following methods:
- (A) Manual delivery of the order to the contractor or subcontractor personally.
- (B) Leaving signed copies of the order with the person who is apparently in charge at the site of the public work and by thereafter mailing copies of the order by first class mail, postage prepaid to the contractor or subcontractor at one of the following:
- (i) The address of the contractor or subcontractor on file with either the Secretary of State or the Contractors' State License Board.

- (ii) If the contractor or subcontractor has no address on file with the Secretary of State or the Contractors' State License Board, the address of the site of the public work.
- (3) The stop order shall be effective immediately upon service and shall be subject to appeal by the party contracting with the unregistered contractor or subcontractor, by the unregistered contractor or subcontractor, or both. The appeal, hearing, and any further review of the hearing decision shall be governed by the procedures, time limits, and other requirements specified in subdivision (a) of Section 238.1.
- (4) Any employee of an unregistered contractor or subcontractor who is affected by a work stoppage ordered by the commissioner pursuant to this subdivision shall be paid at his or her regular hourly prevailing wage rate by that employer for any hours the employee would have worked but for the work stoppage, not to exceed 10 days.
- (k) Failure of a contractor or subcontractor, owner, director, officer, or managing agent of the contractor or subcontractor to observe a stop order issued and served upon him or her pursuant to subdivision (j) is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in county jail not exceeding 60 days or by a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or both.
- (I) This section shall apply to any bid proposal submitted on or after March 1, 2015, and any contract for public work entered into on or after April 1, 2015. This section shall also apply to the performance of any public work, as defined in this chapter, or or after January 1, 2018, regardless of when the contract for public work was entered.
- (m) Penalties received pursuant to this section shall be eposited in the State Public Works Enforcement Fund established by Section 1771.3 and shall be used only for the purposes specified in that section.
- (n) This section shall not apply to work performed on a public works project of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) or less when the project is for construction, alteration, demolition, installation, or repair work or to work performed on a public works project of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) or less when the project is for maintenance work."

d. Labor Code section 1771 states the following:

- "a) All of the following are applicable to all public works projects that are otherwise subject to the requirements of this chapter:
- (1) The call for bids and contract documents shall specify that the project is subject to compliance senitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.
- (2) The awarding body shall post or require the prime contractor to post job site notices, as prescribed by regulation.
- (3) Each contractor and subcontractor shall furnish the records specified in Section 1776 directly to the Labor Commissioner, in the following manner:
- (A) At least monthly or more frequently if specified in the contract with the awarding body.
- (B) In a format prescribed by the Labor Commissioner.
- (4) If the contractor or subcontractor is not registered pursuant to Section 1725.5 and is performing work on a project for which registration is not required because of subdivision (f) of Section 1725.5, the unregistered contractor or subcontractor is not required to furnish the records specified in Section 1776 directly to the Labor Commissioner but shall retain the records specified in Section 1776 for at least three years after completion of the work.

- (5) The department shall undertake those activities it deems necessary to monitor and enforce compliance with prevailing wage requirements.
- (b) The Labor Commissioner may exempt a public works project from compliance with all or part of the requirements of subdivision (a) if either of the following occurs:
- (1) The awarding body has enforced an approved labor compliance program, as defined in Section 1771.5, on all public works projects under its authority, except those deemed exempt pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 1771.5, continuously since December 31, 2011.
- (2) The awarding body has entered into a collective bargaining agreement that binds all contractors performing work on the project and that includes a mechanism for resolving disputes about the payment of wages.
- (c) The requirements of paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) shall only apply to contracts for public works projects awarded on or after January 1, 2015.
- (d) The requirements of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) shall apply to all contracts for public work, whether new or ongoing, on or after January 1, 2016."

B. STATE PUBLIC WORKS APPRENTICESHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. State Public Works Apprenticeship Requirement

- a. The Contractor is responsible for compliance with Later Code section 1777.5 and the California Code of Regulations, title 8, sections 230 200.2 for an apprenticeable occupations (denoted with "#" symbol next to craft name in DIR Prevailing Wage Determination), whether employed by the Contractor, subcontractor, vendor or concultant. Included in these requirements is (1) the Contractor's requirement to provide notification (i.e. DAS-140) to the appropriate apprenticeship committees; (2) pay training fund contributions for each apprenticeable hour employed on the Contract; and (3) utilize apprentices in a minimum ratio of not less than one apprentice hour for each five journeyman hours by a appletion of Contract work (unless an exception is granted in accordance with Labor Code section 1777.5) or request for the dispatch of apprentices.
- b. Any apprentices employed a perform any of the Scope of Work shall be paid the standard wage to apprentices under the regulations of the craft or trade for which such apprentice is employed, and such individual shall be employed only for the work of the craft or trade to which such individual is registered. Only apprentices, as defined in California Labor Code section 3077, who are in training under apprenticeship standards and written apprenticeship agreements under California Labor Code sections 3070 et seq. are eligible to be employed for the Scope of Work. The engloyment and training of each apprentice shall be in accordance with the provisions of the apprenticeship standards and apprentice agreements under which such apprentice is training.

2. Compliance with <u>California Labor Code section 1777.5</u> requires all public works contractors to:

- a. Submit Contract Award Information (DAS-140):
 - i. Although there are a few exemptions (identified below), all Contractors, regardless of union affiliation, must submit contract award information when performing on a California public works project.
 - ii. The DAS-140 is a notification "announcement" of the Contractor's participation on a public works project—it is not a request for the dispatch of an apprentice.
 - iii. Contractors shall submit the contract award information (you may use form DAS 140) within 10 days of the execution of the prime contract or subcontract, but in no event later than the first day in which the Contractor has workers employed on the public work.

- iv. Contractors who are already approved to train apprentices (i.e. check "Box 1" on the DAS-140) shall only be required to submit the form to their approved program.
- v. Contractors who are NOT approved to train apprentices (i.e. those that check either "Box 2" or "Box 3" on the DAS-140) shall submit the DAS-140 TO EACH of the apprenticeship program sponsors in the area of your public works project. For a listing of apprenticeship programs see

b. Employ Registered Apprentices

- Labor Code section 1777.5 requires that a contractor performing work in an "apprenticeable" craft must employ one (1) hour of apprentice work for every five (5) hours performed by a journeyman. This ratio shall be met prior to the Contractor's completion of work on the project. "Apprenticeable" crafts are denoted with a pound symbol "#" in front of the craft name on the prevailing wage determination.
- ii. All Contractors who do not fall within an exemption category (see below) must request for dispatch of an apprentice from an apprenticeship program (for each apprenticeable craft or trade) by giving the program actual notice of at least 72 hours (business days only) before the date on which apprentices are required.
- iii. Contractors may use the "DAS-142" form for making a request for the dispatch of an apprentice.
- iv. Contractors who are participating in an approved a prenticeship training program and who did not receive sufficient number of top ences from their initial request must request dispatch of apprentices from ALL OTHEX apprenticeship committees in the project area in order to fulfill this requirement.
- v. Contractor should maintain and submit at the submittal to the apprenticeship committees (a.g. fax transmittal confirmation). A Contractor has met its requirement to employ apprentices only after it has successfully made a dispatch request to all apprenticeship pregrams in the project area.
- vi. Only "registered" apprentices may be paid the prevailing apprentice rates and must, at all times work under the supervision of a Journeyman (Cal. Code Regs., tit 8, § 230.1).

c. Make Training Fund Control

- i. Contractors performing in apprenticeable crafts on public works projects, must make training function tributions in the amount established in the prevailing wage rate publication or journeymen and apprentices.
- ii. Contractors have se the "CAC-2" form for submittal of their training fund contributions.
- iii. Confictors who do not submit their training fund contributions to an approved apprenticeship training program must submit their contributions to the California Apprenticeship Council (CAC), PO Box 420603, San Francisco, CA 94142-0603.
- iv. Training fund contributions to the CAC are due and payable on the 15th day of the month for work performed during the preceding month.
- v. The "training" contribution amount identified on the prevailing wage determination shall not be paid to the worker, unless the worker falls within one of the exemption categories listed below.

3. Exemptions to Apprenticeship Requirements:

- a. The following are exempt from having to comply with California apprenticeship requirements. These types of contractors <u>do not</u> need to submit a DAS-140, DAS-142, make training fund contributions, or utilize apprentices:
 - i. When the Contractor holds a sole proprietor license ("Owner-Operator") and no workers were employed by the Contractor. In other words, the contractor performed the entire work from start to finish and worked alone.

- ii. Contractors performing in non-apprenticeable crafts. "Apprenticeable" crafts are denoted with a pound symbol "#" in front of the craft name on the prevailing wage determination.
- iii. When the Contractor has a direct contract with the Public Agency that is under \$30,000.
- iv. When the project is 100% federally-funded and the funding of the project does not contain any city, county, and/or state monies (unless the project is administered by a state agency in which case the apprenticeship requirements apply).
- v. When the project is a private project not covered by the definition of public works as found in Labor Code section 1720.

4. Exemption from Apprenticeship Rations:

- a. The Joint Apprenticeship Committee shall have the discretion to grant a certificate, which shall be subject to the approval of the Administrator of Apprenticeship, exempting the Contractor from the 1-to-5 ratio set forth in this Section when it finds that any one of the following conditions are met:
 - i. Unemployment for the previous three-month period in such area exceeds an average of fifteen percent (15%); or
 - ii. The number of apprentices in training in such area exceeds a ratio of 1-to-5 in relation to journeymen; or
 - iii. The Apprenticeable Craft or Trade is replacing at least one-thirtieth (1/30) of its journeymen annually through apprenticeship training, either on a statewide basis or on a local basis; or
 - iv. If assignment of an apprentice to any work performed under the Contract Documents would create a condition which would jecoardize such apprentice's life or the life, safety or property of fellow employees or the practical large, or if the specific task to which the apprentice is to be assigned is or uch a nature that training cannot be provided by a journeyman.
- b. When such exemptions from the z-to-s ratio between apprentices and journeymen are granted to an organization which represents contractors in a specific trade on a local or statewide basis, the member contractors will not be required to submit individual applications for approval to local Joint Apprentices Committees, provided they are already covered by the local apprenticeship standards.

5. Contractor's Compliante

a. The responsibility of combliance with this Section for all Apprenticeable Trades or Crafts is solely and exclusive that of the Contractor. All decisions of the Joint Apprenticeship Committee (Condenthis Section are subject to the provisions of California Labor Code section 3081 and penalties are pursuant to Labor Code section 1777.7 and the determination of the Labor Commissioner.

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
