- 19 (b) A security/cleaning deposit is required for Category II & III
 20 Community Center Rentals of which \$30.00 is non-refundable.
 21 Deposit amounts required are listed below. Deposits take up to 60
 22 days after date of event to be returned and the net deposit returned
 23 will include any associated deductions. Deductions of the deposit
 24 will be made for unpaid fees, facility or equipment damage, and
 25 non-refundable deposit portion.
- 26 (1) Category II Deposit.....\$75.00
- 27 (2) Category III Deposit.....\$100.00
- 28 (c) Groups using District's facilities are held responsible for

1 damage/repair costs and will be invoiced for any labor, materials
2 and replacement costs if in excess of the deposit amounts provided
3 when facilities are left dirty or damaged.

4 (d) Proof of liability insurance is necessary for all rentals, activities, or
5 usage of facilities in the amount of \$1 million.

6 (e) Requests to serve or provide alcohol require special permission
7 from the Director of the Department of Public Works ~~Special~~
8 ~~Districts~~ or his designee in writing. Along with special permission
9 Alcohol Liability Insurance is required and must be obtained
10 through Risk Management in addition to other insurance coverage
11 required.

12 (f) The Director of the Department of Public Works ~~Special Districts~~
13 is authorized to establish and charge fees pertaining to recreational
14 activities and day care services, provided that these fees do not
15 exceed the reasonable costs of providing the services or that these
16 fees otherwise comply with the law. A list of these fees is on the
17 Department's Website.

18 **419. Fee Deferral, Waiver, or Refund.** This subsection is effective the date that this
19 ordinance is effective. In the event of a disaster, or other good cause shown to serve a
20 public purpose, the Director the Department of Public Works ~~of~~ ~~Special Districts~~ may
21 defer payment of, waive, or refund any fee set forth in this chapter provided all of the
22 following conditions are met:

23 (a) Exigent conditions exist whereby obtaining Board approval of the fee
24 waiver/refund/deferral would not be immediately feasible; and

25 (b) The Director of the Department of Public Works ~~Special District~~ receives
26 concurrence from the County Chief Executive Officer.

28 SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from the date of
