1	ORDINANCE NO.
2	An ordinance of Big Bear Valley Recreation and Park
3	District repealing Ordinance No. 75-6 and Ordinance No. 79- 1 and adopting new provisions.
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5	The Board of Directors of the Big Bear Valley Recreation and Park District,
6	County of San Bernardino, State of California, ordains as follows:
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8	SECTION 1. Rules and Regulations:
9	(A) Unlawful Acts in Public Parks and Public Places
10	It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the following acts within the limits
11	of any property owned or maintained by the Big Bear Valley Recreation and Park
12	District ("District"):
13	a) To occupy any property from sundown to sunrise or outside the posted
14	hours unless otherwise permitted. To loiter in violation of Penal Code sections 416,
15	647h, or 653.22, or other law during established park hours.
16	b) To conduct any organized activity in a non-designated area, without first
17	obtaining authorization in the form of an approved facility use application.
18	c) To throw, project, or operate any object that is capable of causing
19	personal injury or damage to property along or across any property owned or used by a
20	District.
21	d) To disturb, annoy or infringe upon other park users, or use profane
22	language, fight or gambledisrupt the use of the park by others.
23	e) To utilize any area or facility that has been designated through a prior
24	reservation.
25	f) To throw, discard, place or dispose of any garbage, refuse, biohazard or
26	hazardous material, in any place other than a garbage can or proper receptacle
27	maintained for that purpose. To forage or rummage through waste receptacles.
28	Garbage and refuse shall not be brought in from outside a park and deposited in park

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1 garbage cans or receptacles.

g) To enter, be, or remain in any property, while in the possession of, under
the influence of, or consuming alcoholic beverages. Special event permits for alcohol
must be obtained in advance through the appropriate office.

h) To utilize, operate, or bring any outside entertainment apparatus, including
but not limited to: bounce houses, slip and slides, inflatable pools, slack-line equipment,
or remote-controlled devices without prior District approval.

8 i) To smoke or vape any type of substance (legal or Illegal) or to possess
9 any narcotics at any time.

j) To possess any weapons or firearms including but not limited to: paintball,
air soft, BB guns, pellet guns, or wrist rockets.

k) To hold a music concert or other amplified musical event without District
approval. To play music at decibel levels that infringe upon passive use of public parks.
Special event permits for concert events must be obtained in advance through the
appropriate office.

16 I) To light or maintain any fire except in District provided free-standing
17 barbeques or visitor-provided propane stove.

m) To exceed the posted playground manufacturer age restrictions on any
 equipment. Adult supervision required as posted.

n) To use <u>for as a restroom</u> any area besides a permanent or portable
restroom as designated. Failure to use the proper facility will result in the maximum
penalty.

o) To lead or let loose any animal, domestic or non-domestic, of any kind.
Riding or leading of To ride or lead horses or other animals through, or across any
property unless specifically authorized to be used for such purpose. This shall not apply
to domestic animals (dogs or cats) when led by a leash or chain not more than six feet
long and under full control of the owner or custodian. Owners are responsible for the
behavior of their pet, must clean up animal waste and dispose of it in the proper

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receptacle, and may not leave animals unattended. Owners will also be held
responsible for reparation of damages done by their animals. In parks with dedicated
Dog Park Areas, dogs are restricted to those areas and must follow the rules posted for
use.

5 p) To park, drive, or repair any vehicle on any road, path, or any area except
6 those designated by the District.

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To drive in excess of 5 miles per hour unless otherwise posted.

8 r) To misuse, destroy or mutilate any park property or flora. To kill, molest,
9 or capture any wildlife or disturb its habitat.

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(B) The District may adopt reasonable rules and standards, subject to the approval
 of the Board of Directors, which may authorize the Director of Special Districts or
 designee to issue permits to groups to engage in specified recreational activities in
 specified parks or areas owned or governed or used by the District.

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16 (C) EXCEPTIONS. The provisions of this ordinance shall not be construed to
 17 prohibit persons from engaging in organized recreational activities conducted and
 18 scheduled by the District or to prohibit the District from conducting such activities.

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SECTION 2. This ordinance and various parts, sections and clauses hereof are
hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause is
judged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of record, the remainder of this ordinance
shall not be affected thereby.

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SECTION 3. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance, as determined
 by the Director of Special Districts, or authorized representatives, may be denied the
 use of the parks and park facilities under the jurisdiction of this ordinance.

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1	SECTION 4. Penalty: Any person found to be in the violation of the provisions of
2	this ordinance shall be subject to a fine up to \$1,000. If found guilty, a person may be
3	refused future access to all parks and park facilities under the jurisdiction of this
4	ordinance.
5	SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from the date of
6	adoption.
