Operational Agreement

This Operational Agreement stands as evidence that the **San Bernardino County District Attorney's Office** and **Project Sister Family Services** intend to work together toward the mutual goal of providing maximum available assistance for crime victims residing in San Bernardino County through the Victim/Witness (VW) Assistance Program in San Bernardino County.

Each participating agency believes that implementation of the Victim/Witness (VW) Assistance Program, as described herein, will further this goal. To this end, each agency agrees to participate in the program, if funded and implemented, by coordinating and providing services outlined herein.

Program Background

The District Attorney's Victim/Witness (VW) Assistance Program provides mandatory services under PC 13835.5 to victims of all crime types. The services include: crisis intervention, emergency assistance, resource and referral assistance, emotional support, victim of crime claim assistance, property return, orientation to the criminal justice system, court escort, case status/disposition, notification of family and friends, employer notification/intervention and restitution assistance. Presentations and training for criminal justice agencies and public presentations are also mandated services through this program.

Roles

The San Bernardino County District Attorney's Office Victim/Witness (VW) Assistance Program will coordinate and provide the following services:

- Coordinate services and provide referrals and emergency assistance to crime victims of the Victim/Witness (VW) Assistance Program cases
- Assist victims by providing the California Victim Compensation Board (Cal VCB) program application and assisting them through the application process
- Provide to crime victims an orientation to the criminal justice system, case status and disposition, court escort and court support, and restitution assistance
- Provide training to staff on a regular basis and that said training will be expanded to include all components of the program
- Participation in meetings as needed to discuss issues of interagency coordination and information to ensure appropriate delivery of services for victims of the Victim/Witness (VW) Assistance Program cases.

Project Sister Family Services will coordinate the following services:

 The Project Sister Family Services will refer to the San Bernardino County District Attorney's Office women and male survivors of sexual assault and abuse, child victims of child abuse to include neglect, sexual, physical and emotional abuse, domestic violence, school and community violence, hate crimes, child abduction, children whose lives are victimized by parental substance abuse, high tech crimes against children to obtain information and assist with filling and filing the California Victim Compensation Board program application, explaining the procedure, obtaining required documentation and tracking information related to the claim

- The Project Sister Family Services will refer to the San Bernardino County District Attorney's Office women and male survivors of sexual assault and abuse, child victims of child abuse to include neglect, sexual, physical and emotional abuse, domestic violence, school and community violence, hate crimes, child abduction, children whose lives are victimized by parental substance abuse, high tech crimes against children for assisting them in understanding and participation in the criminal justice system/judicial proceedings as a result of a crime committed against the child
- The Project Sister Family Services will provide the following services to victims of sexual assault: 24-hour crisis intervention, advocacy and accompaniment to local hospitals, law enforcement interviews and legal proceedings, individual and group counseling, education and prevention programs to teach the community about the nature of sexual assault
