Briefly describe the general nature of the contract:

The District as the Principal Permittee under the current Municipal NPDES Stormwater Permit on behalf of itself, the sixteen cities and San Bernardino County participates in the Middle Santa Ana River (MSAR) Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Task Force. The purpose of the MSAR TMDL Task Force is to identify activities that target sources of bacteria and to either eliminate the source of bacteria or prevent it from entering the Santa Ana River. This agreement is to provide continued funding to the Task Force to implement the requirements of the TMDL for bacterial indicators in the MSAR and to allocate funds during FY25-26 required for the compensation of the Santa Ana Watershed Project Authority as administrator to perform the tasks required by the Agreement shareholders.

Description of Task Force Budget

Annual Task Force Administration

- Organize and facilitate TMDL TASK FORCE meetings.
- Perform secretarial, clerical and administrative services, including providing meeting summaries to TMDL TASK FORCE members,
- Manage TMDL TASK FORCE funds and prepare annual reports of TMDL TASK FORCE assets and expenditures.
- Act as the contracting party, for the benefit of the TMDL TASK FORCE, for contracts with all consultants, contractors, vendors and other entities.
- Seek funding grants to assist with achieving the work of the TMDL TASK FORCE and other goals and objectives of the TMDL TASK FORCE.
- Coordinate with other agencies and organizations as necessary to facilitate TMDL TASK FORCE work.
- Administer the preparation of quarterly and annual reports, as required by the TMDL Implementation Plan, and submit them as required by the TMDL Implementation Plan on behalf of the TMDL TASK FORCE.
- Povide TMDL TASK FORCE members an opportunity to comment and approve any reports or other work product developed.
- Coordinate and facilitate the addition of other Monitoring Programs to the Task Force.
- SAWPA Administration fees may include up to a 5% escalator annually.

Description of Task Force Budget (continued)

TMDL Compliance Expert

Support stakeholders as a Regulatory Strategist and Compliance Expert.

TMDL Task 3 - Annual Watershed-wide Monitoring Program

Watershed-Wide Monitoring Program to assess compliance with REC-1 use water quality objectives for fecal coliform and evaluate numeric targets established for E. coli has been incorporated into the Regional Santa Ana River Bacteria Monitoring Program.

TMDL Task 4 - Urban Source Evaluation / Management

Includes effort to update TMDLs along with additional Characterization of Pathogen Indicator Pollution using available water quality data.

NON-TMDL Related activities

Comprehensive Bacteria Reduction Plan (CBRP) implementation

Includes efforts by the Counties to conduct source evaluation as part of their MS4 permit requirements detailed in each County's Comprehensive Bacteria Reduction Plan (CBRP).

Santa Ana River Bacteria Monitoring Program

This Santa Ana River Watershed Bacteria Monitoring Plan ("SAR Bacteria Monitoring Plan") establishes the requirements for bacteria sampling to support the following objectives:

- 1) Fulfill the monitoring and surveillance requirements of the 2012 adopted Basin Plan amendment (BPA) to Revise Recreation Standards for Inland Freshwaters in the Santa Ana Region.
- 2) Conduct sampling to support implementation of the Middle Santa Ana River (MSAR) Bacterial Indicator TMDL.
- 3) Support any additional bacterial indicator monitoring that may be conducted in the watershed to support regional regulatory activities or requirements.
