The foregoing is not intended, and shall not be understood by the agency making this Grant Subaward, to contravene requirements applicable to Standard Form 312 (which relates to classified Information), Form 4414 (which relates to sensitive compartmented information), or any other form issued by a federal department or agency governing the nondisclosure of classified information.

- a. In accepting this Grant Subaward, Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients):
 - 1) Represent that they neither require, nor have required, internal confidentiality agreements or statements from employees or contractors that currently prohibit or otherwise currently restrict (or purport to prohibit or restrict) employees or contractors from reporting waste, fraud, or abuse as described above; and
 - 2) Certify that, if they learn, or are notified, that they have, or have been, requiring their employees or contractors to execute agreements or statements that prohibit or otherwise restrict (or purport to prohibit or restrict), reporting of waste, fraud, or abuse as described above, they will immediately stop any further obligations of Grant Subaward funds, will provide prompt written notification to Cal OES, and will resume (or permit resumption of) such obligations only if expressly authorized to do so by Cal OES.
- b. If Subrecipients are authorized under this award to make Second-Tier Subawards, procurement contracts, or both:
 - 1) Subrecipients represent that:

25. Limit on Use of Grant Funds for Grantees' Employees' Salaries

With respect to this Grant Subaward, federal funds may not be used to pay cash compensation (salary plus bonuses) to any employee of the Grant Subaward recipient at a rate that exceeds 110% of the maximum annual salary payable to a member of the federal government's Senior Executive Service (SES) at an agency with a Certified SES Performance Appraisal System for that year. Subrecipients shall provide the Cal OES Program Specialist with a copy of any curricula, training materials, proposed publications, reports, or any other written materials that will be published, including web-based materials and website content, resulting from this Grant Subaward at least forty-five working days prior to the targeted dissemination date. Any written, visual, or audio publications, with the exception of press releases, whether published at the grantee's or government's expense, shall contain the following statements: 'This project was supported by Grant No. ______, awarded by the Bureau of Justice Assistance. The Bureau of Justice Assistance is a component of the Department of Justice's Office of Justice Programs, which also includes the Bureau of Justice Statistics, the National Institute of Justice, the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, the Office for Victims of Crime, and the SMART Office. Points of view or opinions in this document are those of the author and do not necessarily represent the official position or policies of the U.S. Department of Justice."

28. Press Releases

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) shall transmit to the Cal OES Program Specialist copies of all official award-related press releases at least fifteen working days prior to public release. Advance notice permits time for coordination of release of information by Cal OES where appropriate and to respond to press or public inquiries.

29. Copyright; Data rights

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) acknowledge that OJP reserves a royalty-free, non-exclusive, and irrevocable license to reproduce, publish, or otherwise use, and authorize others to use (in whole or in part, including in connection with derivative works), for Federal purposes: (1) any work subject to copyright developed under a Grant Subaward; and (2) any rights of copyright to which a Subrecipient (at any Second-Tier Subrecipient) purchases ownership with Federal support.

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) acknowledge that OJP has the right to (1) obtain, reproduce, publish, or otherwise use the data first produced under a Grant Subaward; and (2) authorize others to receive, reproduce, publish, or

otherwise use such data for Federal purposes. "Data" includes data as defined in Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) provision 52.227-14 (Rights in Data – General).

It is the responsibility of the Subrecipient (and any Second-Tier Subrecipient) to ensure that the provisions of this condition are included in any Grant Subawards (and any Second-Tier Subrecipient) under this award.

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) have the responsibility to obtain from Subrecipients, contractors, and subcontractors (if any) all rights and data necessary to fulfill the Subrecipient's obligations to the Government under this Grant Subaward. Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) shall ensure that any forensic laboratory, forensic laboratory system, medical examiner's office, or coroner's office that will receive any portion of the Grant Subaward uses generally accepted laboratory practices and procedures as established by accrediting organizations or appropriate certifying bodies.

a. External Investigations

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) shall ensure that requirements associated with 34 U.S.C. section 10562(4) (which relate to processes in place to conduct independent external investigations into allegations of serious negligence or misconduct by employees or contractors) are satisfied with respect to any forensic laboratory system, medical examiner's office, coroner's office, law enforcement storage facility, or medical facility in the State that will receive a portion of the grant amount.

b. Accreditation

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) shall ensure that any forensic laboratory or forensic laboratory system (not including any medical examiner's office or coroner's office) that will receive any portion of the award either is accredited, or will use a portion of this award to prepare and apply for accreditation by not more than two years from the award date of this award.

Additionally, with respect to accreditation, the Subrecipient (and any Second-Tier Subrecipient) shall ensure that for any Grant Subaward it makes under this award, it will require in a legally-binding and enforceable writing, such as the Grant

Subaward documentation (for example, Grant Subaward terms and conditions), that its Subrecipient: (1) if accredited, must continue to demonstrate such accreditation as a condition of receiving or using the Grant Subaward funds; or (2) if not accredited, must use the Grant Subaward funds to prepare and apply for accreditation.

The Coverdell statute (see 34 U.S.C. section 10562(2)) and the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program solicitation state certain requirements and guidance associated with proper accreditation and regarding what BJA will consider to be acceptable documentation of accreditation. The Subrecipient is to contact the Cal OES Program Specialist for clarification or guidance if it should have any question as to what constitutes proper accreditation for the purposes of the Coverdell program. Grant Subaward funds may not be used under this Grant Subaward by a forensic laboratory or forensic laboratory system with accreditation (or by such laboratory to obtain accreditation) that BJA determines not to be consistent with the Coverdell law and the solicitation or to be otherwise deficient.

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) agree to notify Cal OES promptly upon any change in the accreditation status of any forensic science laboratory or forensic laboratory system that receives funding under this Grant Subaward.

31. Use of Funds: No Research

Funds provided under this Grant Subaward shall be used only for the purposes and types of expenses set forth in the Request for Application. Funds shall not be used for general law enforcement functions or non-forensic investigatory functions, and shall not be used for research or statistical projects or activities. Use of Grant Subaward funds for construction of new facilities is restricted by statute. Any questions concerning this provision should be directed to the Cal OES Program Specialist prior to incurring the expense or commencing the activity in question.

To ensure compliance with the Government Performance and Results Act (Pub. L. No. 103-62) and the GPRA Modernization Act of 2010 (Pub. L. No. 111-352), program performance under this Grant Subaward is measured by the following: (1) percent reduction in the average number of days from the submission of a sample to a forensic science laboratory to the delivery of test results to a requesting office or agency (calculated by reporting the average number of days to process a sample at the beginning of the grant period versus the average number of days to process a sample at the end of the grant period); (2) percent reduction in the number of backlogged forensic cases (calculated by reporting the number of backlogged forensic cases at the beginning of the grant period versus the number of backlogged forensic cases at the end of grant period), if applicable to the Grant Subaward; and (3) the number of forensic science or medical examiner/coroner's

office personnel who completed appropriate training or educational opportunities with these Coverdell funds, if applicable to the Grant Subaward. Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) are required to collect and report data relevant to these measures.

32. Forensic Science or Medical Examiner Services Fees

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) understand and agree that, throughout the Grant Subaward Performance Period, it must promptly notify Cal OES if it either starts or stops charging fees for forensic science or medical examiner services, or if it revises its method of allocating fees received for such services to program income. Notice must be provided in writing to the Cal OES Program Specialist within fifteen business days of implementation of the change.

33. External Investigations

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) acknowledge that, as stated in the solicitation for the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program, BJA assumes that Subrecipients (and Second-Tier Subrecipients) of Coverdell funds will make use of the process referenced in their certification as to external investigations and will refer allegations of serious negligence or misconduct substantially affecting the integrity of forensic results to government entitles with an appropriate process in place to conduct independent external investigations, such as the government entity (or entities) identified in the grant application. The Subrecipient shall submit the following information as part of its final report: (1) the number and nature of any allegations of serious negligence or misconduct substantially affecting the integrity of forensic results received during the Grant Subaward: (2) information on the referrals of such allegations (e.g., the government entity or entities to which referred, the date of referral); (3) the outcome of such referrals (if known as of the date of the report); and (4) if any such allegations were not referred, the reason(s) for the non-referral. Should the project period for this award be extended, the Subrecipient shall submit the above information as to subsequent twelve-month periods every twelve months thereafter (as part of a semiannual progress report) until the close of the Grant Subaward, at which point the Subrecipient shall submit the required information as to any period not covered by prior reports as part of its final report. The Subrecipient understands and agrees that funds may be withheld (including funds under future awards), or other related requirements may be imposed, if the required information is not submitted on a timely basis.

34. Subrecipient Integrity and Performance Matters

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) must comply with any and all applicable requirements regarding reporting of information on civil, criminal, and administrative proceedings connected with (or connected to the performance of) either this OJP award or any other grant, cooperative agreement, or procurement

contract from the federal government. Under certain circumstances, Subrecipients of OJP awards are required to report information about such proceedings, through the federal System for Award Management (known as "SAM"), to the designated federal integrity and performance system (currently, "FAPIIS").

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) understand and agree that program income earned during the Grant Subaward Performance Period may be expended only for permissible uses of funds specifically identified in the Request for Application for the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program. The Subrecipient further understands and agrees that program income earned during the Grant Subaward Performance Period may not be used to supplant State or local government funds, but instead may be used only to increase the amount of funds that would, in the absence of Federal funds or program income, be available from State or local government sources for the permissible uses of funds listed in the Request for Application.

Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) understand and agree that program income that is earned during the final one hundred twenty (120) days of the Grant Subaward Performance Period may, if appropriate, be obligated (as well as expended) for permissible uses during the one hundred twenty-day (120-day) period following the end of the Grant Subaward Performance Period. These activities have been determined not to have a significant impact on the quality of the human environment.

b. Modifications

Throughout the term of this Grant Subaward, Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) agree that for any activity that is the subject of a completed EA, it will inform Cal OES of (1) any change(s) that it is considering making to the previously assessed activity that may be relevant to environmental impact; or (2) any proposed new activities or changed circumstances that may require assessment as to environmental impact, such as new activities that involve the use of chemicals or involve construction or major renovation. Subrecipients (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) will not implement a proposed change or new activity until BJA, with the assistance of Cal OES, has determined whether the proposed change or new activity (or changed circumstances) will require additional review under NEPA. Approval for implementation will not be unreasonably withheld as long as any requested modification(s) is consistent with eligible program purposes and found acceptable under a BJA-conducted environmental impact review process.

37. Unmanned Aircraft Systems

The Subrecipient (and any Second-Tier Subrecipients) agrees that no funds under this Grant Subaward (including via subcontract or subaward, at any tier) may be used for unmanned aircraft systems (UAS), which includes unmanned aircraft vehicles (UAV), or for any accompanying accessories to support UAS.

Project Narrative

Background:

The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department-Scientific Investigations Division (SBSD-SID) services over eighty local agencies and Sheriff's stations in San Bernardino County, California. The County of San Bernardino is the largest county in the continental United States. There are over 2.2 million residents in San Bernardino County and the population continues to rise annually. It is the 5th most populous county in California and the 14th most populous County in the United States. In 2019 San Bernardino County was identified as one of the most dangerous cities (ranked #23). Homicides and violent crimes continue to rise thus providing increased workload from the more than 80 Agencies SBCSD-SID provides service to.

The SBCSD-SID is a forensic science laboratory accredited through ANSI National Accreditation Board (ANAB, certificate #FT-0315). The Crime Laboratory first attained the accreditation status under the legacy program in 1995 and renewed it every five years until 2016. In 2016, the Laboratory achieved accreditation

under the ISO 17025 International Program and renewed it in 2020. The Laboratory is on a 4-year cycle for renewal with the next full assessment set to occur in 2024. Among the many disciplines covered by the certificate are Firearms, Fire Debris, Materials (Trace), Biology, Controlled Substance, Toxicology (Blood Alcohol only), Crime Scene Investigations (CSI) and Bloodstain Pattern Analysis.

The SBCSD-SID has a training budget as part of the overall operating costs of the laboratory operations. Information learned from these training classes will be disseminated at individual Section meetings.

The release of the National Academy of Science Report, titled "Strengthening Forensic Science in the United States A Path Forward", calls for, among other things, adequate funding for education Forensic Science. The report states that forensic science practitioners require continuing professional development and training and may need to complete additional training for certification purposes. Continuing professional development is the "mechanism through which a forensic scientist remains current or advances to a higher level of expertise, specialization or responsibility".

currently available space for additional analysts, the only viable means of improving productivity and reducing case analysis backlogs is by enhancing the expertise of the current staff and developing processes for efficiency.

The laboratory intends to utilize funding from the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant to allow members of SBCSD-SID to attend a variety of training and continuing education opportunities. Grant funding will provide opportunities for new staff to receive specialized training and existing staff to be provided ongoing training and continuing education opportunities. An opportunity to attend national and international meetings and symposia in the various specialties of forensic science is imperative to staying current in the field. Forensic symposia include such topics as legal, financial, accreditation, and technical considerations as well as being a forum for sharing of ideas and novel solutions. As newer and more advanced technologies, procedures, protocols, and training techniques become available to the forensic community and the existing technologies become outdated it is imperative that Criminalists are provided with the necessary training opportunities to continue to build on their expertise and to provide the best possible service to the client agencies and stakeholders. This



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grant funding will be utilized for improving the quality of analysis throughout the Scientific Investigations Division

Current Staffing and statistics:

The Firearms/Toolmarks Section is staffed at five full-time Firearms Examiners, one staff member is in training and one position has a candidate in the background process. Twenty to thirty cases per month are submitted for bullet, fired cartridge case, firearm and toolmark comparisons. The cases are triaged through a priority assessment by the Firearms Supervisor to maximize effectiveness through a thorough and current understanding of the firearms and ammunition available, as well as the nuances associated with toolmark examinations.

In 2021 the Firearms/Toolmarks Section completed 132 firearms cases, and 451 NIBIN entry cases. Only cases with court dates, cases needing analysis for filing purposes, or high visibility cases are currently being assigned for analysis as priority one. These cases are handled as soon as possible. All other case requests are worked as time permits as priority two. Currently the number of backlogged firearms cases is 339, and the number of backlogged NIBIN cases is 2257. The current average turnaround time for firearms cases is 54 days and for NIBIN cases

is 32 days. The turnaround time is expected to decrease as new staff members are trained and begin to contribute to casework.

The Trace Section is staffed at one full time and one part-time examiner. Both staff members are proficient in gunshot residue analysis and fire debris analysis. The Trace Section completed 261 cases with a turnaround time of 17 days in 2021. Currently the number of backlogged cases 22 and the current turnaround time is 32 days.

The Crime Scene Investigations (CSI) Section is staff at one Sheriff's Supervising Crime Scene Specialist, two Sheriff's Lead Crime Scene Specialists and eleven Sheriff's Crime Scene Specialists who respond to crime scenes. The CSI Section processed 289 crime scenes with a turnaround time for the completion of crime scene reports of 24 days in 2021. Once the crime scene is completed, personnel must complete latent print processing and swabbing for DNA evidence on collected items. Sheriff's Crime Scene Specialists complete crime scene, autopsy, vehicle processing, trajectory, bloodstain pattern analysis, photography, and technical processing reports. Currently the backlog of CSI crime scene reports is 42 days. The current average turnaround time for the completion of reports is 37 days. To facilitate the investigation and prosecution of crimes related to these

scenes, it is essential that the turnaround time be kept to less than 30 days in all cases.

The Controlled Substances Section is staffed with six full-time Criminalists. The Section completed 10457 controlled substance cases with an average turnaround time of 47 days in 2021. The Controlled Substances Section classifies a case as "backlog" when it is not completed within ten days of submission. Currently the number of controlled substances backlogged cases is 2053. The current average turnaround time is 61 days. The goal is to maintain the turnaround time at less than 10 days.

The Blood Alcohol Section of the Forensic Alcohol Unit has three full-time Criminalists. These Criminalists are responsible for the calibration of the breath alcohol instruments in San Bernardino County, training officers, testing for alcohol levels in blood, and providing testimony. The Blood Alcohol Section completed 2738 cases with a turnaround time of 17 days in 2021. Currently the number of backlogged cases is 20. The current average turnaround time is 42 days. The goal is to maintain the turnaround time at less than 10 days.

The CAL ID Section consists of 26 staff members that conduct forensic examinations related to Ten Print Exams and Latent Print Comparison. Currently there are 131 latent comparison cases backlogged. These are property crimes, there is not a backlog of crimes against person cases. The Latent Section has received 914 cases containing 4,358 latent prints thus far in 2022. Prior to COVID the average number of cases received was 2,500 with 9,000-10,000 latent prints.

Project Design and Implementation:

The SBCSD-SID intents to utilize grant funding to allow staff members to attend a variety of training and continuing education opportunities as outlined in the budget narrative. 




