  - a. Approve an allocation of \$669,479 from the 2024-25 Fifth District's Board of Supervisors
     Discretionary Fund District Specific Priorities Program budget to Bloomington
     Recreation and Park District for the Ayala Park Shade Structures Project.
  - b. Approve **Contract No. 25-226** with Bloomington Recreation and Park District to provide funding for the Ayala Park Shade Structures Project, in the amount of \$669,479, for the contract term of April 8, 2025, through April 7, 2027.
  - c. Authorize the Auditor-Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector to post the necessary budget adjustments, as detailed in the Financial Impact section, to provide funding for the Ayala Park Shade Structures Project (Four votes required).
- 2. Acting as the governing body of Bloomington Recreation and Park District:
  - a. Approve the Capital Improvement Program Ayala Park Shade Structures Project in the amount of \$669,479.
  - b. Approve **Contract No. 25-226** with San Bernardino County to receive funding for the Ayala Park Shade Structures Project, in the amount of \$669,479, for the contract term of April 8, 2025, through April 7, 2027.
  - c. Authorize the Auditor-Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector to post budget adjustments as detailed in the Financial Impact section, for the Ayala Park Shade Structures Project (Four votes required).

Approval of this item will not result in the use of additional Discretionary General Funding (Net County Cost). On September 21, 2021 (Item No. 18), November 16, 2021 (Item No. 33), February 6, 2024 (Item No. 61), and June 11, 2024 (Item No. 110), the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved an allocation of \$4 million, \$7 million, \$6 million, and \$3 million, respectively, to the Board Discretionary Fund – District Specific Priorities Program (Priorities Program), for each of the five supervisorial districts for projects that meet a public purpose, and provide services to citizens that promote health, safety, economic well-being, and other public services that enhance quality of life and meet the needs of County residents. On an annual basis, unspent appropriations for discretionary funding will be carried over into the subsequent year's budget.

The Ayala Park Shade Structures Project will be funded by the Fifth District's Priorities Program budget. The total Project allocation of \$669,479 includes Construction and Construction Contingency, and Project Management, Design Services, Inspection Services and other Project related costs.

The following 2024-25 budget adjustments are requested for this item:

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Priorities Program projects help promote the vision of a complete County by recognizing the unique traits of each Supervisorial District and, thereby, allow individual Board Districts to work with community partners through County services and contractual agreements to identify programs, projects, and initiatives that support the vision, meet a public purpose and provide services to residents that promote health, safety, economic well-being, education, recreation, and other public services that enhance quality of life and meet the needs of the County's residents. Projects under the Priorities Program are based on District Supervisor discretion and are presented by the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for Board approval.

The Bloomington Recreation and Park District (District) maintains two community parks (Ayala Park and Kessler Park), an equestrian arena, sports fields, and a community center that offers various recreational activities for the community of Bloomington. The Department of Public Works – Special Districts (Department), through its Operations Division, directly manages, operates and maintains the District.

The Ayala Park Shade Structure Project consists of demolishing and removing existing concrete at eight existing picnic tables to make way for new concrete pads and new permanent shade

structures to be installed. These new permanent shade structures will provide shade and shelter from weather elements to the eight picnic areas and create a more welcoming and accessible environment for the community to use.

The Department anticipates proceeding at a later date with any necessary environmental or California Environmental Quality Act findings, approval of the Project's plans and specifications, and authorization to advertise for bids.

Under the Board Discretionary Fund Priorities Program contract terms, the CEO, at the direction of the identified Supervisor, may extend the terms of the contracts, in writing, under the following conditions:

- a. In aggregate, all extensions do not exceed 12 calendar months;
- b. Is specifically requested by the contractor;
- c. Will not change the project goals or scope of services;
- d. Is in the best interest of the County and contractor in performing the scope of services under the contract; and
- e. Does not alter the amount of compensation under the contract.

Board discretionary funding allocations under the Priorities Program with community partners must be for projects or services of \$10,000 or more as described in County Policy 05-10. Additionally, contracts that include non-profit organizations, government entities, or educational institutions are non-competitive. Contracts with community partners that include for-profit organizations are to be processed according to existing County procurement policies. Contracts with other government agencies or for-profit organizations require a matching contribution of at least 25% of the proposed projects. Per County Policy 05-10, the District is exempt from providing a matching contribution because it is a Board-governed entity. All contracts shall be paid on a lump-sum basis or under other terms as approved by the Board.
