IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

AMENDMENT NO. 1:

It is hereby agreed to amend Contract No. 22-88, effective immediately upon execution, as follows:

SECTION II. CONTRACTOR SERVICE RESPONSIBILITIES

Amend Paragraph A to read as follows:

A. Under a No Reject/No Eject Policy, have available eighteen (18) shelter beds for male and female Court Dependent or CFS Dependent Youth at two (2) shelter locations; twelve (12) shelter beds are allocated at one shelter location, while six (6) shelter beds are designated within another shelter location. Youth will be ages 11 through 17, including high-risk youth, such as youth with substance abuse issues, violent tendencies, and histories of sexual abuse.

Add Paragraphs DD through FF to read as follows:

- DD. Provide Social Workers that meet the following minimum qualifications:
 - Possession of a Bachelor's degree in Social Work, Counseling, or a related field, accompanied by a minimum of three (3) years of experience working with youth who have experienced trauma or youth in crisis situations, or
 - 2. Possession of a Master's degree in Social Work, Counseling, or a related field.
- EE. Provide Crisis Intervention Counselors that meet the following minimum qualifications:

- 1. Possession of a Bachelor's degree in Social Work, Counseling, or a related field, along with a minimum of two (2) years of experience working with youth who have experienced trauma or youth in crisis situations, or
- 2. Possession of a Master's degree in Social Work, Counseling, or a related field.
- FF. Provide services based on the rates specified and maintain each position as outlined in the Program Budget (Attachment C).

SECTION III. CONTRACTOR GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Add Paragraphs JJ and KK to read as follows:

- JJ. Executive Order N-6-22 Russian Sanctions On March 4, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order N-6-22 (the EO) regarding Economic Sanctions against Russia and Russian entities and individuals. "Economic Sanctions" refers to sanctions imposed by the U.S. government in response to Russia's actions in Ukraine (https://home.treasury.gov/policy-issues/financial-sanctions/sanctions-programs-and-country-information/ukraine-russia-related-sanctions), as well as any sanctions imposed under state law (https://www.dgs.ca.gov/OLS/Ukraine-Russia). The EO directs state agencies and their contractors (including by agreement or receipt of a grant) to terminate contracts with, and to refrain from entering any new contracts with, individuals or entities that are determined to be a target of Economic Sanctions. Accordingly, should it be determined that Contractor is a target of Economic Sanctions or is conducting prohibited transactions with sanctioned individuals or entities, that shall be grounds for termination of this agreement. Contractor shall be provided advance written notice of such termination, allowing Contractor at least 30 calendar days to provide a written response. Termination shall be at the sole discretion of the County.
- KK. Campaign Contribution Disclosure (SB 1439) Contractor has disclosed to the County using Attachment D Campaign Contribution Disclosure (AB 1439), whether it has made any campaign contributions of more than \$250 to any member of the Board of Supervisors within the earlier of: (1) the date of the submission of Contractor's proposal to the County, or (2) 12 months before the date this Contract was approved by the Board of Supervisors. Contractor acknowledges that under Government Code section 84308, Contractor is prohibited from making campaign contributions of more than \$250 to any member of the Board of Supervisors for 12 months after the County's consideration of the Contract.

In the event of a proposed amendment to this Contract, the Contractor will provide the County a written statement disclosing any campaign contribution(s) of more than \$250 to any member of the Board of Supervisors within the preceding 12 months of the date of the proposed amendment.

Campaign contributions include those made by any agent/person/entity on behalf of the Contractor or by a parent, subsidiary or otherwise related business entity of contractor.

SECTION V. FISCAL PROVISIONS

Amend Paragraph A to read as follows:

A. The maximum amount of reimbursement shall not exceed \$4,420,248 and shall be subject to availability of funds to the County. The Consideration to be paid to Contractor, as provided herein, shall be in full payment for all Contractor's services and expenses incurred in the performance, hereof, including travel and per diem.

Amend Paragraph C to read as follows:

C. If, at any time during the course of the Contract, Contractor is not able to provide all eighteen (18) shelter beds, it is at the County's discretion to prorate the operating costs for the given time period the beds were not available.

Amend Paragraph F as follows:

F. Costs for services under the terms of this Contract shall be incurred during the contract period except as approved by the County. Contractor shall not use funds from one budget period to pay prior or future period obligations.

Add Section V., Paragraphs J and K to read as follows:

- J. Any start-up costs that are paid to the shelter prior to being fully licensed will be repaid to the County if licensure is not obtained prior to the end of the contract.
- K. The Contractor shall not include in their invoice any charges related to staffing and expenses incurred during the expansion of the new expansion facility guaranteeing six (6) additional beds until 30 days prior to the Contractor's capacity to accept and house youth at said facility. It is incumbent upon the Contractor to obtain all necessary licenses relevant to the expansion. If the Contractor fails to secure all required licenses, they shall be held responsible for reimbursing the County for any funds disbursed for the purpose of the expansion costs.

SECTION VIII. TERM

Amend Section to read as follows:

This Contract is effective as of February 9, 2022 and is extended from the original expiration date of February 29, 2024, to expire on August 31, 2024, but may be terminated earlier in accordance with provisions of Section IX of the Contract. The Contract term may be extended for two (2) additional one (1) year periods by mutual agreement of the parties.

- (2) there is shared management and control between the entities; or
- (3) a controlling owner (50% or greater interest as a shareholder or as a general partner) in one entity also is a controlling owner in the other entity.

For purposes of (2), "shared management and control" can be found when the same person or substantially the same persons own and manage the two entities; there are common or commingled funds or assets; the business entities share the use of the same offices or employees, or otherwise share activities, resources or personnel on a regular basis; or there is otherwise a regular and close working relationship between the entities.
