AMENDMENT NO. 6 TO CONTRACT NUMBER 18-741
BETWEEN SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY
AND FORENSIC LOGIC, LLC, A WHOLLY-OWNED SUBSIDIARY OF SOUNDTHINKING, INC.

This Amendment No. 6 ("Amendment No. 6") to the Software License Service Agreement dated October 1, 2018 (the "Agreement") between the County of San Bernardino ("County") on behalf of the San Bernardino County Sheriff/ Corner/Public Administrator, and Forensic Logic, LLC, is entered into effective as of the last date of signature below. Except as amended herein, all other terms of the Agreement remain in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between the Agreement and this Amendment No. 6, this Amendment No. 6 shall control.

WHEREAS, on or about January 1, 2022, Forensic Logic, LLC was acquired by, and became a wholly-owned subsidiary of ShotSpotter, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, on or about April 10, 2023, ShotSpotter, Inc. changed its company name to SoundThinking, Inc. ("SoundThinking"); and

WHEREAS, on or about April 10, 2023, SoundThinking announced that the product name CopLink had been changed to CrimeTracer; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to renew the subscription services for CrimeTracer for an additional one-year term.

Now, therefore, the Parties agree as follows:

1. In consideration for the County's payment of the fees set forth in Proposal #SBCOSCT09212023 Rev 1 dated January 17, 2024, attached hereto as Exhibit A, Forensic Logic, LLC, the subscription services for CrimeTracer (formerly COPLINK), shall be renewed for the period April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025.

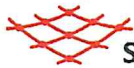

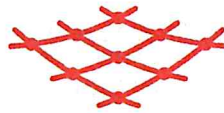

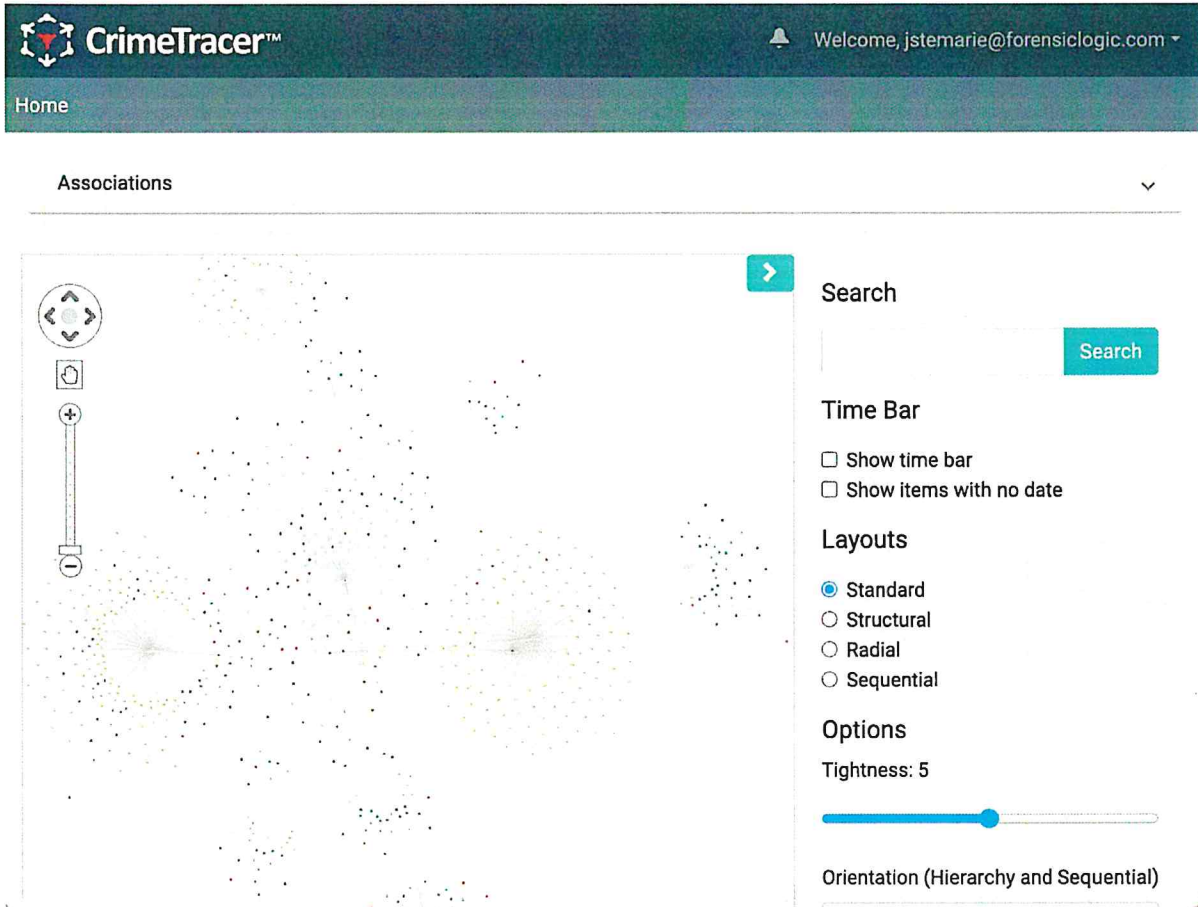


Figure 4. CrimeTracer Associations

SoundThinking will provide, at a minimum, the following resources and services to ensure a successful implementation for the Department:

- SoundThinking will provide Advanced Training. Classes will take place at a time and place of the Department's choosing. During this time, SoundThinking Instructor(s) will need access to projection/display equipment and either an agency-provided guest wi-fi network, or suitable cellular coverage to support a hotspot connection. Classes will consist of an overview of the CrimeTracer application, how to get signed in, where to find help, Quick Search fundamentals, and Advanced Search elements including Associations, Refined Searching and Visualization Tools. The Department may also elect to include a hands-on lab session, depending on availability of student computer resources. Classes are 2-3 hours depending on inclusion of labs.
- SoundThinking will provide onsite, remote, and recorded training sessions as needed.
 - SoundThinking will work closely with the Department to promote adoption and maximize the effectiveness of the CrimeTracer platform based on feedback given.

San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department Roles and Responsibilities

To maximize the value of the CrimeTracer service for the Department, SoundThinking will require the Department to agree to the following:

- Identify key command and technical staff to support the implementation.
 - Assign technical staff to assist with network and systems integrations (approximately 4-6 hours per system).
- Assign technical staff to assist with whitelisting public networks, providing user account information, and coordinating training resources.
- Participate in training classes.

Agent: A third-party individual or firm who, for compensation, is representing a party or a participant in the matter submitted to the Board of Supervisors. If an agent is an employee or member of a third-party law, architectural, engineering or consulting firm, or a similar entity, both the entity and the individual are considered agents.

Otherwise related entity: An otherwise related entity is any for-profit organization/company which does not have a parent-subsiary relationship but meets one of the following criteria:

- (1) One business entity has a controlling ownership interest in the other business entity;
- (2) there is shared management and control between the entities; or
- (3) a controlling owner (50% or greater interest as a shareholder or as a general partner) in one entity also is a controlling owner in the other entity.

For purposes of (2), "shared management and control" can be found when the same person or substantially the same persons own and manage the two entities; there are common or commingled funds or assets; the business entities share the use of the same offices or employees, or otherwise share activities, resources or personnel on a regular basis; or there is otherwise a regular and close working relationship between the entities.

Parent-Subsidiary Relationship: A parent-subsidiary relationship exists when one corporation has more than 50 percent of the voting power of another corporation.
