# **INTRODUCTION**

The Department of Public Works, Special Districts oversees administration, operations, capital improvement, and maintenance of 16 water and sanitation Districts throughout the County.

Special Districts has conducted an extensive study of the various Districts to determine if they have the revenue to support the operations and maintenance of providing service. In many cases, because annual inflators were not part of the original rate structure, these Districts require rate increases in order to continue providing service.











# CONTINUATION OF FEE HEARING FOR FAWNSKIN AND CEDAR GLEN

As a result of the 2023 February/March Extreme Weather Event, the public hearing for the following districts is recommended to be continued to Tuesday, May 9, 2023:

- Sanitation district CSA 53B Fawnskin
- Water district CSA 70, Zone CG (Cedar Glen)

Due to the unprecedented snow levels created by several storms, residents may not have had enough time to address any questions they may have, or to protest the hearing if they chose.





# **COST DRIVERS**

Notable Water and Sanitation District increases in expenses include:

- **Labor:** Board approved labor increases 9%<sup>1</sup>, internal and external Memoranda of Understanding escalate costs
- **Equipment:** Wells, pumps, boosters, and electrical components
- Materials: Steel, PVC, hoses, fittings, and chemicals. Materials increased 15.6%<sup>2</sup>
- Vendors/Contractors: California Prevailing Wage rates up 19% from 2017<sup>3</sup>
- Utilities: Electricity is required for buildings, wells and pumps.
   Natural gas and sewer expenses are also paid for by the Districts
- Regulatory Obligations: California Air Resources Board (CARB), State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB), United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)

- The proposed increase is for 3 consecutive years
- The proposed rate increase aligns with the average California Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Riverside – San Bernardino – Ontario¹ between 2019 and 2021 to ensure service levels are maintained and to account for rising costs. Prices have continued to rise into 2022².
- High-risk Districts may need a more significant rate increase to ensure long-term sustainability. The following Districts will be evaluated in more detail over the next three years to determine the appropriate rate:
  - 1st District: Trona (CSA 82)
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> District: Hacienda Heights (CSA 70 W3), Cedar Glen (CSA 70 CG) Little Morongo (CSA 70 F), and Pioneertown (CSA 70 W4)
- High-risk Districts are impacted by:
  - Low fund balance
  - Increased operating expenses
  - Aged infrastructure
  - No economies of scale


## **RATES: PUBLIC OUTREACH**

### Outreach Activities Completed

- Mailings Proposition 218 notices mailed on February 7, 2023
- Webinar/Video presentations 12 total presentations
- In-person workshops five total workshops done for the larger CSAs
