### IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

### **AMENDMENT NO.2**

IN THAT CERTAIN Contract No. 22-575 by and between San Bernardino County, a political subdivision of the State of California, (hereinafter referred to as County) and Pacific Clinics (hereinafter referred to as Contractor), which first became effective July 1, 2022, the following changes are hereby made and agreed to:

- 1. ARTICLE V Funding and Budgetary Restrictions, paragraph H is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - H. The maximum financial obligation under this contract shall not exceed \$2,000,000 for the contract term.
- II. ARTICLE VI Provisional Payment, paragraph B.1 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - B.1 For each fiscal year period (FYs 2022/23, 2023/24, 2024/25, and 2025/26), no single monthly payment for any mode of service shall exceed one-twelfth (1/12) of the maximum allocations for the mode of service unless there have been payments of less than one-twelfth (1/12) of such amount for any prior month of the Agreement. To the extent that there have been such lesser payments, then the remaining amount(s) may be used to pay monthly services claims which

exceed one-twelfth (1/12) of the maximum for that mode of service. Each claim shall reflect the actual costs expended by the Contractor subject to the limitations and conditions specified in this Agreement.

- III. ARTICLE XVII Personnel, paragraph L is hereby replaced in its entirety and revised as follows:
  - L. Levine Act Campaign Contribution Disclosure (formerly referred to as Senate Bill 1439)

Contractor has disclosed to the County using Attachment III – Levine Act Campaign Contribution Disclosure Senate Bill (formerly referred to as Senate Bill 1439), whether it has made any campaign contributions of more than \$500 to any member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer [Sheriff, Assessor-Recorder-Clerk, Auditor-Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector and the District Attorney] within the earlier of: (1) the date of the submission of Contractor's proposal to the County, or (2) 12 months before the date this Contract was approved by the Board of Supervisors. Contractor acknowledges that under Government Code section 84308, Contractor is prohibited from making campaign contributions of more than \$250 to any member of the Board of Supervisors or other County elected officer for 12 months after the County's consideration of the Contract.

Campaign contributions include those made by any agent/person/entity on behalf of the Contractor or by a parent, subsidiary or otherwise related business entity of Contractor.

- IV. ARTICLE XIV Duration and Termination, paragraph A is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - A. The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2026 inclusive.
- V. ARTICLE XVIII Prohibited Affiliations paragraph H.3.a is hereby amended to read as follows:

- VI. This amendment hereby adds Schedules A and B for FY 2025-26. All previously approved schedules remain in effect.
- VII. ATTACHMENT III <u>CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE</u> (SB 1439) is hereby replaced with <u>LEVINE ACT-CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE</u> (formerly referred to as SB 1439) as attached.
