12 The Director of the Department of Public Works or his/her designee, in  
 13 review by the County Chief Executive Officer or his/her designee, may, in  
 14 his or her discretion, allow the following discounts once annually:

- 15 • Waive fees for County-sponsored or co-sponsored events.
- 16 • Discount 50% off for County employees and their family.
- 17 • Waive fees for County Employees and their family.
- 18 • Offer up to 50 free tickets for the Department of Public Works –
- 19 Special District’s Regional Manager to provide for promotional events.
- 20 • Discount fees for any qualified non-profits if such discount serves a
- 21 public purpose. Any such discount, if provided, will not exceed 50% of
- 22 the general admission fee.
  - 23 ○ A “qualified non-profit” shall mean an organization exempt from
  - 24 federal income tax pursuant to § 501(c)(3) such as an
  - 25 organization operated exclusively for one or more of the
  - 26 following purposes; religious, charitable, scientific, testing for
  - 27 public safety, literary, educational, fostering national or
  - 28 international sports competition, or the prevention of cruelty of

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children or animals. Veteran organizations created before 1880 under § 501(c)(23) may also qualify. See IRS publication 557.

- Discount fees in special circumstances for other persons or entities. Any such discount, if provided, will not exceed 50% of the general admission fee.
- Set special event entrance fees for Department-sponsored events.
- All special event entrance fees set by the Director of Public Works shall take into account all costs incurred in connection with the special event, specifically including, but not limited to, any increased park security, supplies, services, labor and administrative overhead.

4 waive, or refund any fee set forth in this chapter provided all of the following conditions  
5 are met:


6 (a) Exigent conditions exist whereby obtaining Board approval of the fee


