## Vaccinating San Bernardino County

**Total Cases: 291,989 \* Adjusted Case Rate 2.6/100,000 \* Overall Positivity: 1.4% \* Equity Positivity: 1.5%**  
**Testing Volume: 264 tests/100,000**

<b>Total Doses Administered to Residents of San Bernardino County</b>	<b>1,377,826</b>
<b>Eligible county residents (ages 16+) who have been vaccinated</b>	<b>47.6%</b>
<b>Eligible county residents who have been fully vaccinated</b>	<b>37.1%</b>

## Mask Guidelines

- Last Thursday, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) lifted masking requirements for fully vaccinated people.
  - Exceptions are where required by federal, state, local, tribal or territorial laws, including local business and workplace guidance. Masks are required on public transit such as buses, trains and airplanes.
- California Department of Public Health (CDPH) surveyed the Counties and ultimately determined to maintain the current mask orders within the State at this time. While San Bernardino County believes the CDC guidance is prudent, we are required to follow and adhere to CDPH guidance
- San Bernardino County Public Health is in the process of reviewing existing County Health Orders to ensure alignment with CDPH

Safest			Walk, run, wheelchair roll, or bike outdoors with members of your household

Less Safe			Dine at an outdoor restaurant with friends from multiple households	
			Attend a crowded, outdoor event, like a live performance, parade, or sports event

Less Safe			Visit a barber or hair salon	
			Go to an uncrowded, indoor shopping center or museum	
			Attend a small, indoor gathering of fully vaccinated and unvaccinated people from multiple households	
Least Safe			Go to an indoor movie theater	
			Attend a full-capacity worship service	
			Sing in an indoor chorus	
			Eat at an indoor restaurant or bar	
			Participate in an indoor, high intensity exercise class

### *Pfizer Vaccine is Approved for Ages 12 and Above*

- The Food and Drug Administration and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention announced that children age 12 to 15 can receive the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine.
- Since last Thursday, the County has vaccinated more than 1,000 children 12-15 years old.
- Parents must complete consent forms on behalf of 12-year-olds.
- Consent forms are available at county vaccination sites.
