## PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #1 - REGIONAL PARK SUMMARY

Project Site is 3.9 miles

The Santa Ana River Trail is a regional amenity. This project will extend the current trail further east from California Avenue to Orange Street in Redlands, California, towards the ultimate goal of ending at the mountain crest in San Bernardino County. The Santa Ana River trail currently begins in Orange County and traverses through both Riverside and San Bernardino Counties, seventeen cities and will connect the mountains to the Pacific Ocean. By adding 3.9 miles to the current trail, this project will increase opportunities for walking, hiking, and biking for residents in all three counties.

## PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #2 - SIGNIFICANT REGIONAL ATTRACTION

The Santa Ana River Trail begins in Orange County and traverses through both Riverside and San Bernardino Counties, making it a current regional attraction. This project will lengthen the trail areas for bikers, hikers, and walkers to enjoy the biodiversity of the riparian flora and fauna along the Santa Ana River. Trail users will have also enjoy a first-hand view of the San Bernardino Mountains.

## PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #3 – TYPE OF PROJECT

This project is classified as an extension of a current amenity. The San Bernardino County section of the trail currently begins at the Riverside County line and ends at Waterman Avenue. There is a current construction project which will extend the trail further west past Waterman Avenue to California Street. If funded this project will complete planning and design for the extension of the Santa Ana River Trail from California Street to Orange Street. This project is currently at 35% completion for planning and design.

This renovation is needed to bring the Santa Ana River Trail closer to its goal of ending at the crest of the San Bernardino County Mountains. Following this section of trail is SART IV, B, C, D, and E. SART IV B/C is 3.3 miles. Planning and design for SART IV D/E has not started, and as a result the exact length has not been finalized.

## PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #4 - DESIGN INPUT

Regional Parks conducted an online survey and a virtual community workshop on Saturday, May 15, 2021. There were four participants in the community workshop and the Department received 12 responses to the survey. These responses indicated that the community continues to be in favor of moving forward with constructing the trail as planned. Community recommendations also included increased lighting, restrooms, and access points for this amenity.

## PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #5 – EMPLOYMENT OR VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

San Bernardino County Regional Parks will continue to offer community residents the opportunity to volunteer or apply for employment opportunities. Regional Parks will continue to work with community groups and individuals who would like to volunteer to implement special events, programs, activities, and/or clean-ups along the trail. Regional Parks provides information regarding volunteer opportunities on our website. Interested applicants, groups, or individuals, can download and submit applications via the County's website.

San Bernardino County Regional Parks offers full and part-time positions whose responsibilities include maintenance, management, and inspection of the Santa Ana River Trail. These positions include Assistant Park Superintendent, Park Ranger, and General Service Worker. Regional Parks provides information regarding employment opportunities on our website.

San Bernardino County Regional Parks has partnered with the Conservation Corps to implement small maintenance and clean-up projects at parks. We will continue to partner with this group in the future for similar projects along the Santa Ana River Trail. This partnership will ensure that the trail will remain clean and available for use by all users.

Coastal Conservancy has partnered with San Bernardino County Regional Parks in the past to provide funding for planning, development, and construction for SART III and IV. 

## **COUNTY AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER GOALS & OBJECTIVES**

Ensure Development of a Well-Planned, Balanced, and Sustainable County.

Provide for the Safety, Health and Social Service Needs of County Residents.

### FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of this item will not result in the use of Discretionary General Funding (Net County Cost). The Project is funded with California Coastal Conservancy Proposition 84 grant funds. The actions to adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration and file and post the Notice of Determination have minimal financial impact. Sufficient appropriation and revenue will be included in the Regional Parks Department (Parks) 2020-21 recommended budget.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines require an environmental document be prepared, circulated for public review and comment, considered, and adopted by the Board of Supervisors (Board) prior to the Board's approval of the Project. By adopting the Mitigated Negative Declaration pursuant to CEQA, the Board is finding that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment after implementation of the mitigation measures identified in the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND). The purpose of the aforementioned document is to disclose and incorporate mitigation measures to avoid any potentially significant effects to the environment resulting from the proposed Project. The specified mitigation measures and implementation of the Mitigation Monitoring and Report Plan (MMRP) included in the IS/MND indicate that this Project will not have a significant effect on the environment. Satisfaction of the CEQA requirements will allow Parks to apply for the environmental permits as needed to construct the Project.

Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Santa Ana River Trail Phase IV, Reach A in the Redlands Area April 21, 2020

On March 9, 2018, the Department of Public Works (Public Works) and Parks entered into Amendment No. 1 to a Memorandum of Understanding dated September 17, 2014, wherein Public Works agreed to provide design and project management services for the Project. Parks, with the assistance of the Department, proposes to construct the Project located on the southern bank of the Santa Ana River and local streets within the City of Redlands and unincorporated San Bernardino County. In general, construction activities associated with development of the recreational trail includes: earthwork including excavation and grading; construction of embankments and/or retaining walls; construction of storm drains, headwalls, and slope protection; construction of asphalt concrete dike, curb and gutter; installation of fencing, railing, access gates, trail delineators, and signage; painting of pavement striping and pavement markings; and construction of appurtenant features. Construction of this segment of the Santa Ana River regional trail system aligns with the County and Chief Executive Officer's goals and objectives by ensuring development of a well-planned, balanced, and sustainable County, as well as providing for the safety, health and social service needs of County residents.

The IS/MND is the environmental document prepared in accordance with the provisions of CEQA. CEQA requires the appropriate environmental review be completed prior to initiation of a project. The County is the lead agency on the Project for purposes of CEQA review. As a result, the Board is the appropriate authority to act on the adoption of the state environmental document.

The IS/MND was prepared by a County consultant under the supervision of Public Works. A Notice of Intent (NOI) for the Project was published in the San Bernardino Sun newspaper on January 17, 2020. Copies of the IS/MND were circulated to responsible and trustee agencies and interested parties and were also made available at Public Works' headquarters (825 E. Third Street, San Bernardino) beginning on January 17, 2020. The IS/MND was also submitted to the Office of Planning and Research, State Clearinghouse for state agency review for a period of 30 days beginning January 17, 2020, (State Clearinghouse No. 2020019050).

Public Works received two responses during the public review period, from California Department of Fish and Wildlife and San Bernardino Valley Water Conservation District. These responses are noted in the final copy of the IS/MND and resulted in no additional environmental impacts that would necessitate recirculation of the IS/MND. Since all of the potential environmental impacts can be adequately mitigated, Parks and Public Works recommends adoption of the IS/MND and MMRP, and a filing of the Notice of Determination with the Clerk of the Board in compliance with CEQA Guidelines §15075.

## **NOTICE OF INTENT** TO ADOPT A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE SANTA ANA RIVER TRAIL, PHASE IV, REACH A PROJECT

In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the State CEQA guidelines, the County of San Bernardino Department of Public Works in conjunction with the Regional Parks Department has prepared a Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) to evaluate the environmental effects associated with the proposed construction of an approximately 3.9-mile long section of the Santa Ana River Trail (SART) along the southern bank of the Santa Ana River and local streets within the City of Redlands.

The SART is a regional recreational trail that will eventually connect the mountains to the sea along the Santa Ana River within Orange, Riverside and San Bernardino Counties. Segments of the trail within San Bernardino County have been approved/constructed in various sections (phases) including Phases I, II, and III. The proposed section of the SART is SART Phase IV, Reach A, in which the trail would begin on the west side of California Street in the City of Redlands and terminate at Orange Street. The trail segments on the river bluffs would consist of a 10-foot wide asphalt/concrete trail and 2-foot graded shoulder on each side of the asphalt/concrete trail. Along the public right-ofway the existing road surface would be widened were possible to accommodate a Class-I bicycle lane. Under existing conditions portions of Pioneer Avenue and San Bernardino Avenue do not have curb and gutter, where possible ultimate curb and gutter would be constructed as part of the proposed Project.

In general, construction activities associated with development of the trail would include: earthwork including excavation and grading; construction of embankments and/or retaining walls; construction of storm drains, headwalls, and slope protection; construction of asphalt concrete dike, curb and gutter; installation of fencing, railing, access gates, trail delineators, and signage; painting of pavement striping and pavement markings; and, construction of appurtenant features.

Equipment staging and borrow/disposal during project construction may potentially occur at: (1) various locations within the disturbed vacant lands on the north side of the river bluff; (2) on disturbed road shoulders and/or street right-of-way on the south side of Alabama Street, northside of Pioneer Avenue; (3) on disturbed road shoulders and/or street right-of-way on the south side of Domestic Avenue; and, (5) on paved road shoulders and/or street right-of-way on the eastside of Texas Street.

The 30-day public comment period for the Draft Mitigated Negative Declaration begins on January 17, 2020 and closes on February 17, 2020. The document is available for review at the Public Works Department, Environmental Management Division Offices, Country of San Bernardino Regional Parks Department Offices, or on the website: http://cms.sbcounty.gov/dpw/Home.aspx .





COUNTY shall submit complete plans for the proposed occupancy to the DISTRICT'S flood control engineer at least thirty days prior to the date of such intended occupancy or use and obtain written approval therefore, which approval shall not be withheld, if in the opinion of the flood control engineer, the proposal does not interfere or conflict with the DISTRICT'S interests. Upon termination of this agreement, all facilities, structures and landscaping by COUNTY shall be removed prior to the termination date. COUNTY, its successors and assigns shall assume full responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the multi-use trail system including landscaping and appurtanances.
- 2. COUNTY adknowledges DISTRICT'S right to AREA OF COMMON USE and the priority of DISTRICT'S right within DISTRICT LANDS. Except in emergencies, COUNTY shall give reasonable notice to DISTRICT and receive DISTRICT approval before performing any work on COUNTY facilities in said AREA OF COMMON USE, or which said work will in any way after or obstruct the flow of or potential flow of waters within said flood control and water conservation works.
- 3. DISTRICT has and reserves the right to use AREA OF COMMON USE in any matter not in conflict with COUNTY'S needs for the proposed multi-use trail system including landscaping, without necessity for any further permit or permission from COUNTY. DISTRICT shall, except in emergencies, give reasonable notice to COUNTY before performing any work which may affect COUNTY'S facilities in said AREA OF COMMON USE.
- 4. The DISTRICT agrees to indemnify, and hold harmless the COUNTY, and their authorized agents, officers, volunteers and employees against any and all claims or actions arising from COUNTY'S negligent acts or emissions on account of any claim therefore.


