COVID– 19 & Safety Protocols

The Sheriff's Athletic Federation frequently monitors current county, state and federal COVID – 19 protocols and mandates. Due to last year's mandates, the event was cancelled. SAF will continue monitoring and will be prepared to make last minute decisions, if needed. However, the entirety of the mud run is held outdoors, and we currently have plans in place to ensure social distancing occurs during registration.

All staff working the event will have their temperatures checked prior to the event. Additionally, SAF will dispense water bottles as opposed to water coolers, and sanitation stations will be made available. Staff will wear face coverings during the registration process and will be encouraged for all participants.

Adjustments will be made in order to reduce physical interaction between participants and staff. This includes, but not limited to, cashless transactions, self-serve medal collection, self-serve T-shirt collection, and self-serve bag check.

Lastly, capacity will be limited, ranging from 25%-75% of standard capacity, based on state and federal guidelines.
