AMENDMENT NO. 1

CHILD WELFARE COLLABORATION AGREEMENT

Pursuant to Section 2.2 of their January 1, 2021 Child Welfare Collaboration Agreement, as amended (Agreement), Casey Family Programs (CFP) and San Bernardino County Children and Family Services (CFS), enter into this Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement, effective January 1, 2022 (First Amendment). The Parties agree as follows:

- 1. 2022 Strategy and Identified Outcomes Plan.** In 2022, the Parties shall undertake the Strategies in the 2022 Strategy and Identified Outcomes Plan detailed in Attachment 1 which is hereby incorporated to the Agreement. Throughout the Term of the Agreement, the Collaboration Leads shall document the Work Efforts and Collaboration Strategies in the Work Plan. On a quarterly basis, the Parties shall evaluate and document the progress and impact of the Collaboration Strategies and Work Efforts according to the reporting schedule in Attachment 1.
- 2. Electronic Signatures.** This Contract may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts shall together constitute one and the same Contract. The parties shall be entitled to sign and transmit an electronic signature of this Contract (whether by facsimile, PDF or other email transmission), which signature shall be binding on the party whose name is contained therein. Each party providing an electronic signature agrees to promptly execute and deliver to the other party an original signed Contract upon request.
- 3. Agreement otherwise in full force and effect.** Except as specifically set forth herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect.

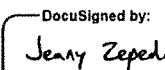
