R2 Revised SCOPE OF WORK

FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Name of Project: Transitional Housing for Homeless Youth

Scope of Work:

CONTRACTOR will provide transitional housing services to homeless youth throughout San Bernardino County (County). The Project will provide a total of 24 beds to homeless youth and will be a collaboration between multiple agencies which span the entire County, covering all five regions (West Valley, East Valley, Central Valley, Desert, and Mountains), providing access to transitional housing services for all youth in the County.

The Project will help 24 youth transition from homelessness to independent and self-supporting members of the community. The Project will provide shared housing that includes all expenses, at no cost to the youth. Youth will be invited to participate in weekly case management to help them achieve the goals they create for themselves.

Youth will enter the Project from homelessness and remain for an average of 12 months. The Project will assist the youth work toward achieving educational goals while seeking employment. Project case managers will assist youth to schedule their classes, arrange transportation to and from school, and set aside study time and also to identify and apply for employment including assisting with writing resumes, completing job applications, and preparing for interviews. After obtaining employment, Project case managers will help the youth learn how to manage their money and how to be a good employee, including arriving for work on time, not calling off sick, arriving to work clean and dressed appropriately, and treating the employer and coworkers with respect. The Project will teach youth how to cohabitate with housemates, including how to share a refrigerator and kitchen with people who may eat on different schedules and eat different foods; and how to share a television, gaming console, and communal spaces. Project case managers will help the youth learn how to settle disputes without violence or supervision.

The Project will teach the youth how to manage their money including creating a budget and savings for unexpected expenses and they will also learn about credit. Each youth will have a planned exit to move into their own house or apartment and will exit with a savings account and a budget. The Project will assist the youth find their new housing, help them complete the application process, move into their new place, and provide them with some essential items such as furniture and utensils. Once the youths exit the Project into permanent housing, the Project case manager will conduct 30, 60, and 90-day follow-ups to examine project effectiveness and inquire about any additional services that may benefit the youth as they move forward with their successful lives.

Measurable Outcomes:

- 24 youth will participate in 650 case management sessions.
- 24 youth will demonstrate an increase in their communication skills.
- 24 youth will demonstrate an ability to create a budget.
- 18 youth will move into stable housing.
- 18 youth will gain employment.
- 14 youth will enroll in continuing education.

Case managers will track these outcomes and report them into the data management system each week.
