(b) The Board of Supervisors has further determined that persons who 4 commit the act of littering or illegal dumping damage neighborhoods and the 5 environment. The results of littering or illegal dumping can be severe. The blight, 6 decay and unhealthful conditions created by littering and illegal dumping negatively 7 impact the quality of life of County residents and lead to diminished property values. 8 Illegally dumped waste quickly becomes hazardous to the environment. Tires. 9 refrigerators, household hazardous materials, television and auto parts often contain 10 toxins. -Mice, rats and mosquitoes make illegally dumped waste their breeding habitat. 11 These vectors can spread diseases such as West Nile virus, malaria, encephalitis and 12 Littering frequently becomes a public nuisance. The Board of Lyme disease. 13 Supervisors finds that there is a need to provide additional for the deterrents toof 14 littering and illegal dumping. The Board of Supervisors has further determined that 15 anyone caught committing the act of littering or illegal dumping faces citation and arrest 16 or administrative or civil enforcement actions.

17 (c) The procedures contained in this Gehapter for the citation and arrest of, or 18 administrative or civil action against, persons caught committing the act of littering or 19 illegal dumping are expressly intended as a deterrent and remedy to further the 20 abatement of littering and illegal dumping; to protect residents and the public at large 21 from harm to their health, safety and welfare; to avoid destruction and injury to lives and 22 property; and to compensate the County for damages incurred as a result of the 23 occurrence of the nuisance activities. Examples of such damages are the costs of 24 cleaning up litter and illegal dump sites and diverting limited public agency resources to 25 address the nuisance activities through direct enforcement or other programs designed 26 to prevent littering and illegal dumping.

For the purposes of this <u>Gc</u>hapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the

1 context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

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2	CITATION OFFICER. A"Citation officer" means a representative of any County	
3	Delepartment authorized by the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors to enforce	
4	the provisions of this Cchapter under § 37.0203 Section 28.0803 by issuing citations, but	
5	who is not authorized to arrest violators.	
6	COMMERCIAL QUANTITIES. Any "Commercial quantities" means any amount	
7	of waste matter generated in the course of a trade, business, profession, or occupation,	
8	or an amount of wasterwaste matter equal to or in excess of one cubic yard.	
9	CUBIC YARD. The "Cubic yard" means the volume of a cube with all sides being	
10	one yard (three feet/36 inches) in length.	
11	ILLEGAL DUMPING. The "Illegal dumping" means the willful throwing, dropping,	
12	placing or depositing of any waste matter, bulky item, hazardous waste, solid waste or	
13	liquid waste on any public or private property in the unincorporated area of the County	
14	that is not approved and appropriately permitted as a disposal site for the disposal of	
15	the type of waster matter thrown, dropped, placed or deposited at the site	
16	ILLEGAL DUMPING ENFORCEMENT OFFICER. A Citation Officer"Illegal	
17	dumping enforcement officer" or "code enforcement officer" means a citation officer or	
18	code enforcement officer who is also defined and authorized under Penal Code	
19	§section 830.7(j), to arrest illegal dumpers. and litterers to the extent necessary to	
20	enforce laws related to illegal waste dumping or littering pursuant to this chapter. An	
21	ILLEGAL DUMPING ENFORCEMENT OFFICER illegal dumping officer or code	
22	enforcement officer is a public officer. An ILLEGAL DUMPING ENFORCEMENT	
23	OFFICERillegal dumping officer or code enforcement officer shall be appointed by the	
24	Director of San Bernardino County-the Land Use Services Department.	
25	NUISANCE. Has "Litter" and "littering" means the discarding, dropping, or	
26	scattering of small quantities of waste matter ordinarily carried on or about the person or	
27	the person's non-commercial vehicle, including, but not limited to, beverage containers	
28	and closures, packaging, wrappers, wastepaper, newspapers, cigarette butts, and	

1 magazines, in a place other than a place or container for the proper disposal thereof, 2 and including waste matter that escapes or is allowed to escape from a container, 3 receptacle, package, or vehicle. 4 "Nuisance" has the same meaning as set forth in Civil Code §section 3479. 5 **PERSON.** An"Person" means an individual, trust, firm, partnership, joint stock 6 company, joint venture, or corporation. 7 **PUBLIC AGENCY.** Any "Public agency" means any County department, 8 Federal, State and any federal, state, or local agency. 9 WASTE MATTER. Any "Waste matter" means any form of physical matter 10 described by the following: 11 **BULKY ITEM.** Any"Bulking item" means any discarded furniture, (1) 12 home or industrial appliance or abandoned vehicle or any part of an abandoned vehicle. 13 (2) SOLID WASTE. All"Solid waste" means all putrescible and non-14 putrescible solid, semisolid and liquid wastes, including garbage, trash, refuse, paper, 15 rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes, demolition and construction wastes, dewatered, 16 treated or chemically fixed sewage sludge which is not hazardous waste, manure, 17 vegetable or animal solid and semisolid wastes, and other discarded solid and semisolid 18 wastes. 19 (3) HAZARDOUS WASTE. Any"Hazardous waste" means any waste 20 as defined in the Health and Safety Code Section 25117, or as the statue may be 21 amended or reenacted. 22 LIQUID WASTE. All"Liquid waste" means all forms of liquid waste (4) 23 not otherwise defined in or otherwise deemed to fall within the coverage afforded by the 24 Health and Safety Code §section 25117; including but not limited to gray water, black 25 water, water-based or oil-based paints; chemical solutions; non-potable water 26 contaminated with any substance rendering it unusable for irrigation or construction; 27 oils, fuels, hydrocarbon liquids, and other petroleum distillates or by-products. 28 <del>37.0203</del>28.0803 Authority.

Pursuant to the authority cited in Chapter <u>42</u> of Division <u>31</u> of Title <u>31</u> of the <u>San</u>
Bernardino County Code and other relevant <u>Ss</u>tate law, the <u>San Bernardino County</u>
Board of Supervisors authorizes the following County departments and divisions to
enforce the provisions of this <u>Cchapter</u>: Land Use Services Department, Environmental
Health Services Department, County Fire <u>Protection District, County Sheriff's</u>
Department, and Solid Waste Management Division.

7 37.020428.0804 Littering and Illegal Dumping.

8 (a) Any person who illegally dumps waste matter, or causes, maintains and/or
 9 permits waste matter to be illegally dumped is, shall be guilty of an infraction or a
 10 misdemeanor and such action shall be punishable as an infraction or a misdemeanor.

- (b) Any person who illegally dumps commercial quantities of waste matter, or
   causes, maintains and/or permits the illegal dumping of commercial quantities of waste
   matter, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- (c) Any person who litters, or causes, maintains, and/or permits littering in or
   upon public or private property shall be guilty an infraction or a misdemeanor and such
   action shall be punishable as an infraction or a misdemeanor.

(d) Any of the acts set forth in prohibited by this Ssection shall also be
 deemed to be a "Ppublic Nnuisance" subject to the enforcement and abatement
 procedures set forth in Chapter 3 of Division 3 of Title 3 of this Code.

(a) Any person convicted of an infraction in relation tofor littering or illegal
 dumping in violation of this Cchapter shall be punished by a fine of \$100.00 upon a first
 conviction, a fine of \$200.00 for a second conviction, and a fine of \$500.00 upon a third
 or subsequent conviction.

(b) <u>Any person convicted of a misdemeanor for littering or illegal dumping in</u>
 violation of this chapter shall be punished by a fine of up to \$1,000.00 upon a first
 <u>conviction, by a mandatory fine of not less than \$250 and up to \$1,500.00 for a second</u>
 <u>conviction, and by a mandatory fine of not less than \$500 and up to \$3,000.00 upon a</u>

third or subsequent conviction, or by imprisonment in the County jail for not more than
six months and by a fine.

(c) Any person convicted of a misdemeanor for illegal dumping of commercial
quantities of waste matter in relation to this Cchapter shall be punished by a mandatory
fine of not less than \$500.00 and not to exceed \$3,000.00 upon a first conviction, by a
mandatory fine of not less than \$500.00 and not to exceed \$6,000.00 upon a second
conviction, and a mandatory fine of not less than \$500.00 and not to exceed \$10,000.00
or imprisonment in the County jail for a period of not more than six months or by both
fine and imprisonment upon a third or subsequent conviction.

(ed) Each and every day that the <u>litter or waste matter illegally dumped in</u>
 violation of this <u>Cc</u>hapter remains in place and unabated (<u>i.e.,that</u> is, not properly
 removed and the area properly cleaned up) is a separate and distinct violation of this
 <u>Cc</u>hapter.

(de) In addition to any fine imposed upon a conviction of an infraction and/or
misdemeanor in relation tounder this Cchapter, the Ccourt shall require that the person
convicted under this Cchapter pay the reasonable cost of removing any litter or waste
matter that the convicted person dumped, and/or caused to be dumped and/or
maintained.

(f) The court may, in addition to the fine imposed upon a conviction, require
as a condition of probation, in addition to any other condition of probation, that any
person convicted of a violation of this section pick up litter or waste matter at a time and
place within the jurisdiction of the court for not less than eight hours.

An illegal dumping enforcement officer or code enforcement officer (as defined
 under § 37.0202) may exercise the powers of arrest granted to him or her-by, provided
 that all of the necessary provisions of Penal Code §section 830.7(j) have been met
 vesting them with the authority to arrest litterers or illegal dumpers.

All violations of this <u>Cc</u>hapter may be subject to enforcement through the initiation of a civil action in accordance with this section and in the same manner and under the same authority as provided at <u>Section</u> 11.0207 of the <u>San Bernardino</u> County Code.

6 37.020828.0808 Administrative Citations and Penalties.

As an alternative to the criminal or civil enforcement of this Cchapter, all
violations of this Cchapter may be subject to enforcement through the use of
administrative citations in accordance with Government Code §section 53069.4 and this
Section, and in the same manner and under the same authority as provided at §in
Section 11.0208 of the San Bernardino County Code. The remedies are cumulative
and discretionary, not exclusive.

## 13 37.020928.0809 Severability.

If any provision of this Cchapter is found to be invalid by a court of competent
 jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from the date of
adoption.
