2	An ordinance of the San Bernardino County Fire Protection
3	District, relating to the employee election worker program.
4	The Board of Directors of the San Bernardino County Fire Protection District,
5	County of San Bernardino, State of California, ordains as follows:
6	
7	SECTION 1. The following District Employee Election Worker Program is
8	adopted:
9	District Employee Election Worker Program.
10	(a) Employees, including but not limited to regular employees, Public
11 12	Service Employees (PSE), extra-help and recurrent employees, and contract
13	employees, who desire to volunteer their services as Election Workers will apply
14	through the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters and coordinate their intent to
15	serve through the Fire Chief or designee. Acceptance as an Election Worker is
16	conditional upon the approval of the Fire Chief or designee and the Registrar of
17	Voters. For time spent as an Election Worker, District employees will be
18	compensated in accordance with the applicable memorandum of understanding
19	and/or District ordinances, polices, and procedures. For purposes of compensation
20	under this section, time spent as an Election Worker, including time spent attending a training session during regular work hours or outside of regular work hours, shall be
21	considered as time actually worked under the applicable memorandum of
22	understanding and/or District ordinances, policies, and procedures.
23	(b) California Elections Law requires that election workers attend a training
24	session prior to each election. This training will be conducted by the Registrar of
25	Voters during and after regular work hours. District employees will be encouraged to
26	attend training during their regular work hours.
27	(c) Any additional equipment or supplies necessary to carry out Election
28	

1	Worker duties on Election Day will be provided by the Registrar of Voters. The
2	Registrar of Voters will keep the Fire Chief or designee informed of employees who
3	volunteer for service on Election Day in terms of their attendance.
4	(d) The Registrar of Voters will reimburse the District for the compensation
5	the employee receives while in election worker training. Regardless of whether the
6	hours worked as an Election Worker on or before Election Day count as overtime, the
7	Registrar of Voters will reimburse the District for any weekly overtime that the District
8	is liable for due to the employee working as an Election Worker on Election Day.
9	(e) This ordinance shall remain in effect until January 16, 2025, and as of
10	that date is repealed, unless a later ordinance that is enacted and effective before
11	January 16, 2025, deletes or extends that date.
12	
13	SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect 30 days from the date of
14	adoption.
