IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

AMENDMENT NO. 1:

It is hereby agreed to amend Contract No. 18-206, effective December 18, 2019, as follows:

SECTION II. CONTRACTOR SERVICE RESPONSIBILITIES

SUBSECTION TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES/DELIVERABLES

Amend Paragraph B, Subparagraphs 3 and 4 to read as follows:

3. Line Worker Core Training consisting of:
 - a. SOP Orientations, which include two (2) days of orientation and a one (1) hour eLearning training course. Contractor will provide:
 - 1) Seven (7) orientations for FY 2018-19,
 - 2) Five (5) orientations for FY 2019-20, and
 - 3) Six (6) orientations for FY 2020-21.
 - b. Two (2) Common Core 3.0 – 100 level classroom and eLearning trainings in FY 2018-19, one (1) in FY 2019-20, and two (2) in FY 2020-21, which includes:
 - 1) Nine (9) half-day classroom trainings,
 - 2) Eleven (11) full-day classroom trainings, and

- 3) Twenty-two (22) eLearning modules.
- c. Two (2) Common Core 3.0 - 200 level classroom and eLearning trainings in FY 2019-20 and one (1) in FY 2020-21, which include:
 - 1) Seven (7) full-day classroom trainings, and
 - 2) Two (2) eLearning modules.
- d. Exit evaluations of the orientations and trainings, which include:
 - 1) A minimum of 80% of all training participants rating the overall usefulness of each module, and
 - 2) Follow-up evaluations with a randomly selected group of participants that assess their transfer of learning.
4. Simulation Site Training consisting of:
 - a. Simulation training days with each Common Core 3.0 training as follows:
 - 1) Up to seven (7) simulations for FY 2018-19,
 - 2) Up to five (5) simulations for FY 2019-20, and
 - 3) Up to six (6) simulations for FY 2020-21.
 - b. Simulation coordination activities including, but not limited to:
 - 1) Costs of the simulation site training,
 - 2) Coaching/Field-Based Training,
 - 3) Facilitation,
 - 4) Props,
 - 5) Space, and
 - 6) Staffing.
 - c. Advanced simulation trainings on topics previously developed for CFS as follows:
 - 1) Six (6) advanced simulations for FY 2018-19 and FY 2020-21, and
 - 2) Five (5) advanced simulations for FY 2019-20.
 - d. Two (2) developments of a new advanced simulations topic to be determined in consultation with CFS.
 - e. Three (3) revised Advanced Simulation curriculums on topics previously developed for CFS will be delivered in FY 2018-19.
 - f. Evaluations for both Common Core 3.0 and Advanced Simulations that utilize CFS approved criteria. Evaluations will measure the impact on learning, and will include, but may not be limited to:
 - 1) Instrument development for data collection,
 - 2) Data analysis methodology, and
 - 3) Data reports developed in conjunction with CFS.

SECTION III. CONTRACTOR GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Amend Paragraph P to read as follows:

- P. Contractor shall obtain from the Department of Justice (DOJ) records of all convictions involving any sex crimes, drug crimes, or crimes of violence of a person who is offered employment or volunteers for all positions in which he or she would have contact with a minor, the aged, the blind,

the disabled or a domestic violence client, as provided for in Penal Code section 11105.3 prior to providing any services. This includes licensed personnel who are not able to provide documentation of prior DOJ clearance. The County must be immediately notified of any records showing a conviction. The County may instruct Contractor to take action to deny/terminate employment or terminate internship and/or volunteer services where the records show the person is unsuitable for employment, internship, or volunteer services.

In addition to the documentation of DOJ clearance, Contractor shall obtain clearance from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and Child Abuse Central Index (CACI), and records of all convictions involving any sex crimes, drug crimes, or crimes of violence of a person who is offered employment or volunteers for all positions in which he or she would have contact with a minor, the aged, the blind, the disabled or a domestic violence client, prior to providing any services. The County must be immediately notified of any records showing a conviction. The County may instruct Contractor to take action to deny/terminate employment or terminate internship and/or volunteer services where the records show the person is unsuitable for employment, internship, or volunteer services.

SECTION V. FISCAL PROVISIONS

Amend Paragraph A to read as follows:

- A. The maximum amount of payment under this Contract shall not exceed \$6,490,429, of which \$3,245,215 may be federally funded, and shall be subject to availability of funds to the County. The consideration to be paid to Contractor, as provided herein, shall be in full payment for all Contractor's services and expenses incurred in the performance hereof, including travel and per diem. Overtime and holiday make-up time will not be permitted.
