Good morning my name is Josh Bourgeois and I'm with the Golden State Environmental Justice Alliance. We submitted a comment letter to the Draft Environmental Impact Report. Our letter identified several deficiencies with the EIR. The deficiencies include but are not limited to, EIR internal inconsistencies, environmental issues not analyzed in the Draft EIR, the project description, air quality, biological resources, greenhouse gases, land use and planning, and project alternatives.

The county's elected and appointed officials have the obligation to protect the citizens of this county from environmental and social injustice, to protect the environment we all share and live in, and to make environmentally responsible development decisions. We stand by our comment letter, and believe the EIR is flawed and must be redrafted and recirculated for public review.
