#### ORDINANCE NO.

An ordinance of the County of San Bernardino, State of California, adding Chapter 48 to Division 2 of Title 1 of the San Bernardino County Code, relating to the establishment of an Advisory Redistricting Commission.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Bernardino, State of California, ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. The Board of Supervisors finds that:

- (a) Article 1, section 2 of the United States Constitution requires that the federal government conduct a census every 10 years. Under California Elections Code section 21500, following each federal decennial census, the Board of Supervisors must adopt boundaries for all of the Supervisorial Districts, based on such census, so that the districts are substantially equal in population as required by the United States Constitution and comply with the California Constitution and the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 (52 U.S.C. sec. 10301 et seq.).
- (b) California Elections Code section 21500 et seq. was significantly amended by Assembly Bill No. 849, the Fair and Inclusive Redistricting for Municipalities and Political Subdivisions Act (Fair Maps Act), signed into law on October 8, 2019, and Assembly Bill No, 1276, signed into law on September 18, 2020. AB 849 and AB 1276 establish extensive and specific criteria for the redrawing of district boundaries.
- (c) Senate Bill No. 1108 (2016) and Senate Bill 1018 (2018), both signed into law, provide that a county board of supervisors may, but is not required to, establish by resolution, ordinance, or charter amendment an independent redistricting commission, a hybrid redistricting commission, or an advisory redistricting commission.
- (d) Section 606 of the new County Charter, approved by the voters in the November 2020 election (as "Measure J"), requires the Board of Supervisors to adopt an ordinance to establish a redistricting commission. Section 606 provides: "The Board

of Supervisors shall establish by ordinance a redistricting commission. The commission shall be either advisory or independent. The commission shall ensure that, when Supervisor district boundaries are redrawn, public input is effectively solicited and considered, the Voting Rights Act and other laws are complied with, neighborhood and community interests are considered, the interests of stakeholders are considered, and the process is transparent."

SECTION 2. Chapter 48 is added to Division 2 of Title 1 of the San Bernardino County Code, to read:

Establishment.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 606 of the County of San Bernardino Charter and Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 23000) of Division 21 of the California Elections Code, there is established an Advisory Redistricting Commission of the County of San Bernardino.

 The Advisory Redistricting Commission shall consist of seven members and five alternate members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member for each supervisorial district, who has been recommended and nominated by the Supervisor from that district. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint one alternate member for each supervisorial district, who has been recommended and nominated by the Supervisor from that district. Each appointment shall be approved by majority vote of the Board of Supervisors.

Two members of the Advisory Redistricting Commission shall be appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino. These two members may be retired judges from either the California courts or federal courts located in California or other qualified individuals who meets the qualifications of Section 12.4804. One of the two members appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino shall serve as Chair of the Advisory Redistricting Commission. Should one or more of the two members appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino be unable to serve on the Advisory Redistricting Commission, the Presiding Judge shall appoint an alternate member.

### 12.4803 Term of Office.

The term of office for a member of the Advisory Redistricting Commission shall end when the Board of Supervisors adopts a final redistricting plan and any legal or administrative challenges to the Board of Supervisors adopted final redistricting plan are resolved.

A new Advisory Redistricting Commission shall be appointed whenever the supervisorial district boundaries must be redrawn by the Board of Supervisors.

### 12.4804 Qualifications of Members.

(a) A person shall not be appointed to serve on the Advisory Redistricting Commission if the person is an elected County official or a family member, staff member, or paid campaign staff of an elected County official. Family member means a

spouse, parent, sibling, child, or in-law. Spouse means a spouse or registered domestic partner.

- (b) Except for the retired judges, a member of the Advisory Redistricting Commission must be a registered voter of the County.
- (c) Except for the retired judges, a person shall not be appointed to serve on the Advisory Redistricting Commission if any of the following applies:
- (1) The person has served as a staff member of an elected official in the past four years.
- (2) The person has served in an elected office or campaigned for an elected office in the past four years.
- (3) The person has served as a member of a political party central committee in the past four years.
- (4) The person has contributed over \$500 per year to any candidate for elective office in the past four years.

### 12.4805 Officers.

The officers of the Advisory Redistricting Commission shall be a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson. The Chairperson shall be one of the two individuals on the Advisory Redistricting Commission selected by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino. The Vice-Chairperson shall be elected by the members of the Advisory Redistricting Commission.

# 12.4806 Stipend and Expenses.

- (a) Members and alternates of the Advisory Redistricting Commission shall receive a stipend of \$100.00 per meeting attended.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided by federal, state or local regulations, members of the Advisory Redistricting Commission members and alternates shall be reimbursed for private automobile mileage incurred in attending all meetings at the Internal Revenue Service allowable mileage reimbursement rate. All travel that is 20 miles or less round trip from a member's home shall not be reimbursed. If the round trip

exceeds 20 miles, then all mileage is reimbursable as provided herein.

## **12.4807 Meetings.**

The Advisory Redistricting Commission shall hold its first meeting in May 2021. The meetings of the Advisory Redistricting Commission shall be public meetings. The meetings may be held in a virtual format, in person, or a combination of virtual and in person, as allowed by the Ralph M. Brown Act and state law.

Alternate members of the Advisory Redistricting Commission shall attend all meetings of the Advisory Redistricting Commission unless excused for good cause.

### 12.4808 Requirements of the Redistricting Advisory Commission.

- (a) Each member of the Advisory Redistricting Commission shall be a designated individual in the County's Conflict of Interest Code for the Advisory Redistricting Commission pursuant to Article 3 (commencing with Section 87300) of Chapter 7 of Title 9 of the Government Code.
- (b) The Advisory Redistricting Commission is subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act (Government Code sections 54950, et seq.) and the California Public Records Act (Government Code sections 6250, et seq.).

# 12.4809 Duty and Authority of the Advisory Redistricting Commission.

- (a) The Advisory Redistricting Commission shall complete all of its duties in compliance with all State deadlines and in sufficient time for the Board of Supervisors to meet all State deadlines.
- (b) The Advisory Redistricting Commission shall recommend to the Board of Supervisors a minimum of two possible maps containing the boundaries for all of the supervisorial districts.
- (c) The Advisory Redistricting Commission shall follow all criteria set forth in State law.
- (d) The recommended supervisorial district boundaries shall comply with the United States Constitution, the California Constitution, the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 and California law.
