# Microenterprise Home Kitchen Operations (MEHKO)

A **MEHKO** <u>is</u> a restaurant that is operated by a resident in a private home.



- No more than one full-time employee (not including family or household members).
- Food Safety Manager Certification and food handler cards required.
- Food is prepared, cooked and served on the <u>same day</u>.
- Operation is limited to 30 meals per day or 60 meals per week for dine-in, pick-up or delivery.
- No more than \$50,000 in gross annual sales.
- A MEHKO is <u>not</u> a sidewalk vendor, a temporary food facility, a caterer or a cottage food operation.



Authorization by ordinance or resolution would apply to **ALL** areas within the county, including incorporated cities.



Riverside, Imperial, Solano, Lake and Santa Barbara Counties and the City of Berkeley have "opted-in".



El Dorado and Siskiyou counties have "opted-out".

There are 58 Counties and 4 Cities with their own Health Departments that can authorize MEHKOs. It is a multi-year process for a city to become its own health department.

#### **Riverside County**

Adopted ordinance May 2019 Effective June 2019 108 MEHKOs permitted

#### **Imperial County**

Adopted resolution December 2019 Effective January 01, 2020 17 MEHKOs permitted

#### **Lake County**

Adopted ordinance December 2020 Trial program effective January 01, 2021 – June 30, 2021

## Pending Implementation of MEHKO Program

#### **Solano County**

Adopted resolution December 2019
Postponed implementation due to COVID-19

#### **City of Berkeley**

Adopted ordinance December 2020. Implementation anticipated Summer 2021

#### **Santa Barbara County**

Adopted ordinance March 2021 Implementation anticipated April 2021

#### **Imperial County**

- 17 MEHKOs Permitted
- O Complaints Received
- Foodborne Illnesses Reported



#### **Riverside County**

- 108 MEKHOs Permitted
- 2 Complaints Received
- Foodborne Illnesses Reported



#### **Lake County**

- 2 MEHKOs Permitted
- Complaints Received
- Foodborne Illnesses Reported



Foodborne illness complaints are reported to the jurisdiction's Environmental Health Department, and non-food related complaints (i.e. noise, parking, etc.) are reported to the jurisdiction's Code Enforcement Department.

6 out of 62 jurisdictions have OPTED-In
