ORDINANCE NO. FPD 21-01

An ordinance of the San Bernardino County Fire Protection District establishing fire service fees, fire suppression, emergency response and cost recovery fees, ambulance service and subscription fees, and repealing Ordinance No. FPD 20-02.

The Board of Directors of the San Bernardino County Fire Protection District, County of San Bernardino, State of California, ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. The Board of Directors of the San Bernardino County Fire Protection District hereby finds and determines that:

- (a) From and after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be in full force and effect within the San Bernardino County Fire Protection District.
- (b) Due to budgetary limitations and constraints, it is necessary to continue a uniform procedure and cost schedule to recover certain fire suppression and emergency response costs and to continue providing a minimum level of fire suppression and emergency response to areas within the San Bernardino County Fire Protection District within San Bernardino County.
- (c) The recovery of such costs is authorized under State law, including, but not limited to, the following statutes:
- (1) Health and Safety Code sections 13007-13009.1, 13916, and 25270 et seq.;
 - (2) Government Code sections 53150 et seq., 68096.1, and 68097.2;
 - (3) Evidence Code section 1563.
- (d) Such costs do not exceed the estimated actual cost of providing fire suppression and emergency response.
- (e) The collection and recovery of such costs is for the purpose of meeting the necessary operating expenses of the responding service areas and the adoption of

1	the said fees is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality
2	Act.
3	SECTION 2. There are hereby established and levied fire service fees, fire
4	suppression, emergency response and cost recovery fees, ambulance service and
5	subscription fees as set forth in Attachment A to this ordinance. The fees set forth in
6	Attachment A are effective July 1, 2021.

8	SECTION 3. Effective July 1, 2021, Ordinance No. FPD 20-02 is hereby
9	repealed in its entirety.

When ambulance staff transports to an airship and does not accompany the flight or when transport to a landing zone is one mile away or less, half the BLS and ALS base rate is applied.

Section M - Waiver/Refund of Fees:

- This section is effective the date the ordinance is effective. In the event of a disaster, or other good cause shown to serve a public purpose, the Fire Chief may defer payment of, waive, or refund any fee set forth in this Ordinance or any other fee levied by County Fire provided all of the following conditions are met:
 - a) Exigent conditions exist whereby obtaining Board approval of the fee waiver/refund/deferral would not be immediately feasible; and
 - b) County Fire receives concurrence from the Chief Executive Officer.
- 2) Except as otherwise provided by law, the Board of Directors, by Board action, can defer payment of, waive, or refund any fee set forth in this Ordinance or any other fee levied by County Fire provided one of the following conditions is met:
 - a) The service for which the fee was levied has not and will not be performed, or
 - b) The fee was collected in error, or
 - c) For other good cause shown, provided such waiver/refund would serve a public purpose.

Section N - Annual Increase:

All annual fees will be subject to an annual increase based on the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index, All Urban Consumers (All items), for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario, California area, with the Standard Reference Base (1982-84=100) as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The

"annual average" percentage published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics will be used to determine the maximum annual increase. This percentage, which is calculated at the end of each calendar year, is available in January following the end of the previous calendar year. However, no adjustment shall decrease any fee and no fee shall exceed the reasonable cost of providing services. If reasonable program costs exceed the maximum annual increase, an additional fee increase may be established by resolution of the Board of Directors. Fees will be rounded to the nearest whole dollar.

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
