COVID-19 Response



Public Health Order

San Bernardino County issued a Health Order on June 15, 2021 to help control spread of the Novel Coronavirus and to align the County with the California Department of Public Health to ensure the County is not more restrictive than the State.

Pursuant to the County Charter, all Health Orders issued and addressed to the public at large shall be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors at a public meeting within 30 days of issuance.



Elements of the Health Order

- Screenings
 - Individuals must be <u>screened</u> prior to entering hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, dialysis clinics, community clinics, surgery and urgent care centers and other health care settings.
- Self-Evaluations
 - Prior to entering certain facilities, individuals must conduct a <u>self-evaluation</u> for the following symptoms: Sore throat, runny nose, fever, chills, sneezing, coughing, or gastrointestinal issues such as stomach cramps.



Masking and Self-Attestation

- Per State health orders, individuals who are <u>vaccinated</u> do not need to wear masks <u>except</u> where outlined by the California Department of Public Health
- Per State health orders, <u>unvaccinated</u> individuals need to wear masks in these settings:
 - In indoor public settings and businesses (examples: retail, restaurants, theaters, family entertainment centers, meetings, state and local government offices serving the public).
