AMENDMENT NO. 1

It is hereby agreed to amend Contract No. 20-1179, effective July 27, 2021, as follows:

SECTION V. FISCAL PROVISIONS

Paragraph A is amended to read as follows:

A. The maximum amount of payment under this Contract shall not exceed \$1,459,629, of which \$1,459,629 may be federally funded, and shall be subject to availability of funds to the County.
