### **AMENDMENT NO. 1**

The consideration to be paid to Contractor, as provided herein, shall be in full payment for all Contractor's services and expenses incurred in the performance hereof, including travel and per diem.

### SECTION VIII. TERM

Amend Section VIII to read as follows:

This Contract is effective as of October 28, 2020, and is extended from its original expiration date of February 28, 2022, to expire on February 28, 2025, but may be terminated earlier in accordance with provisions of Section IX of the Contract.
