PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #1 - REGIONAL PARK SUMMARY

Glen Helen Regional Parks is 1340 acres. The Park currently has a playground, swim facility, two lakes, campground, walking trails, disc golf course, picnic shelters, and the following three concessions, Sheriff's Rodeo, Glen Helen Amphitheater, and Glen Helen Raceway. This project will improve the main playground at Glen Helen Regional Park, by adding new amenities to include themed playground amenities, picnic shelter, and accessible parking. These new amenities will transform this area of the park to a regional destination.

PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #2 - SIGNIFICANT REGIONAL ATTRACTION

New amenities for this playground will be accessible and unique to this park. The design includes large amenities that include technology as part of play activities. This unique design will attract youth and families who are users of video games. This design will help these users enjoy amenities that combine being outdoors with the technology that they love.

PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #3 - TYPE OF PROJECT

This is a renovation of a current recreation amenity and is estimated to cost \$3,000,000. The existing playground is not large enough to be considered a regional amenity. Adding new, updated amenities with a technology theme will provide a uniqueness that will attract new users and add the regional appeal to the amenity. In addition, adding the picnic shelter and accessible parking to this area of the facility will increase the availability of this part of the facility to more users as well as diversify the type of activities that can take place in this section of the park.

PROJECT SELECTION CRITERION #4 - DESIGN INPUT

Regional Parks conducted an online survey and a virtual community workshop on May 26, 2021. The Department received 72 responses to the survey and there were 10 participants in the virtual community workshop. These responses indicated that the community was in favor of moving forward with improving the main playground as planned. The responses also requested new restrooms, improved picnic shelters, new entry monument, improved campgrounds (landscaping/irrigation), and additional park amenities. The Department was allocated funding from the Prop 68 Per Capita grant. Funding from this grant will also address these responses. The Department will hold an additional community meeting to present design plans for community input once a funding decision has been made for this grant application.


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

We believe that all three of these projects provide opportunities for our agencies to partner, as well as increase the public's enjoyment of these parks.

Glen Helen Playground Expansion

This project will add new amenities to this playground which will be accessible and unique to this park. The design includes large amenities that include technology as part of play activities. This unique design will attract youth and families who are users of video games. This design will help these users enjoy amenities that combine being outdoors with the technology that they love.

Santa Ana River Trail Section IV-A—Final Design

The Santa Ana River Trail begins in Orange County and traverses through both Riverside and San Bernardino Counties, making it a current regional attraction. This project will lengthen the trail by 3.9 miles for bikers, hikers, and walkers to enjoy the biodiversity of the riparian flora and fauna along the Santa Ana River. Trail users will have also enjoy a first-hand view of the San Bernardino Mountains.

Yucaipa Swim Facility Renovation

The current swim facility already enjoys users from across the three-county region. Improving this facility by upgrading the infrastructure, improving the pool, and replacing waterslides will increase the appeal and ensure safe use of the facility for upcoming swim seasons.
