# Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act – H.R. 3684

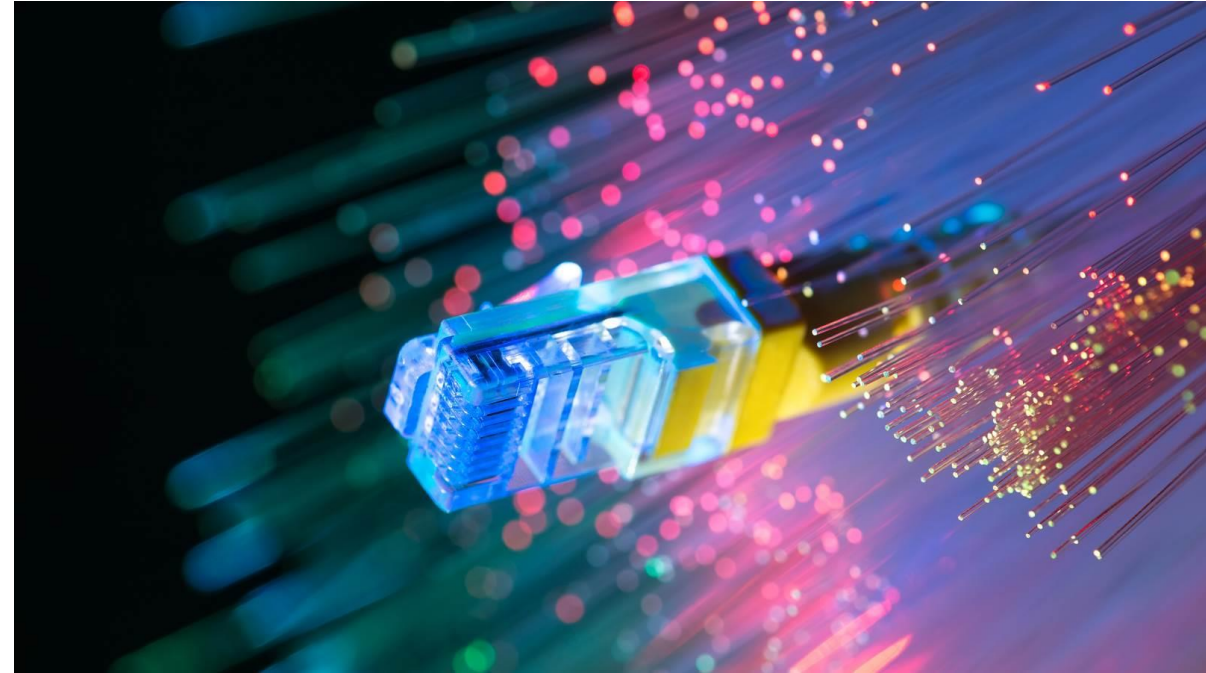
- H.R. 3684 passed the U.S. Senate on August 10<sup>th</sup> on a 69-30 vote
  - Sens. Feinstein, Padilla – AYE
- H.R. 3684 passed the U.S. House on Friday, Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> on a 228-206 vote
  - 13 Republicans voted for the bill
  - 6 Democrats opposed it
  - AYES:
    - Rep. Judy Chu (D-Monterey Park)
    - Rep. Pete Aguilar (D-Redlands)
    - Rep. Norma Torres (D-Pomona)
  - NAYS:
    - Rep. Young Kim (R-Fullerton)
    - Rep. Jay Obernolte (R-Victorville)
- 5-year reauthorization costing \$550 billion



- **Highways - \$145.74B:**
  - Surface Transportation Block Grants: \$72B
  - Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement: \$13.2B
  - Railway-Highway Grade Crossings: \$1.225B
  - National Highway Freight Program: \$7.15B
  - Formula Carbon Reduction Program: \$6.42B
  - Nationally Significant Freight and Highway Projects: \$8B
  - Congestion Relief Program: \$250M
  - Bridge Grant Program: \$3.265B
- **Rail, Freight and Safety Programs - \$78B:**
  - National Motor Vehicle Per-Mile User Fee Pilot Study
  - Transportation Workforce Development and Training
  - Railroad Crossing Elimination Program: \$3B
  - Safe Streets and Roads for All Grants: \$1B
- **Public Transit - \$72.8B:**
  - Local-Regional Project Assistance (RAISE) Grants: \$7.5B
  - Bridge Replacement, Rehabilitation: \$27.5B
- **Airports - \$25B:**
  - Airport Infrastructure Grants \$15B
  - New Terminal Competitive Grants: \$5B
- **Electric Vehicles - \$12.75B**
- **Water Infrastructure - \$35B:**
  - Drinking Water State Revolving Fund: \$11.6B
  - Clean Water State Revolving Fund: \$14.7B
  - Low Income Water Assistance Pilot Program
  - Western Water Infrastructure: \$8.3B
    - Colorado River Fish Species Recovery: \$50M
- **Energy - \$92B:**
  - Grid Infrastructure and Resiliency: \$65B
  - Supply Chains for Clean Energy Tech: \$7.2B
- **Resiliency (Army Corps of Engineers) - \$17B:**
  - Inland Flood Risk Management Projects: \$2.5B
  - Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities: \$1B
  - State and Local Cybersecurity Grants: \$1B
- **Environmental Remediation - \$4.7B:**
  - Hazardous Substance Superfund Remediation: \$3.5B
  - Competitive Brownfields Grants: \$1.2B

## **Broadband Infrastructure - \$65B:**

- Equity, Access and Deployment Program: \$42.5B in formula-based grants to states to competitively award grants for broadband infrastructure, mapping and adoption projects.
- Funding allocated based on number of unserved and high-cost locations in the state.
- All projects must meet a minimum download/upload standard of 100/20 megabits per second.
- States must submit a five-year Action Plan that requires collaboration with local and regional entities.
- States may competitively award subgrants for:
  - Unserved and underserved service projects.
  - Connecting eligible community anchor institutions.
  - Data collection, broadband mapping, and planning.
  - Installing internet and Wi-Fi or providing reduced-cost broadband within a multi-family residential building.
