BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The recommended non-financial Agreement with California State University, Dominguez Hills (CSUDH) will provide opportunities for students to receive supervised field experience within Children and Family Services (CFS) in preparation for professional social work practice. Through this agreement, CFS will provide learning experiences that will help students receive the skills they need to prosper in the 21st century economy, which aligns with the San Bernardino Countywide Vision2Succeed initiative. Field experience provides opportunities for students to apply and integrate the knowledge, theories, and concepts of social work practice learned throughout their social work curriculum. Field experience is an essential element of CSUDH's educational process for professional social work practice.

Under this recommended agreement, CFS will work with CSUDH to provide support to students as they engage in field experience. Integration of classroom learning with agency-based practice allows social work students to observe and participate in CFS programs and activities to gain understanding about the benefits and challenges of the organization and its diverse client populations. CFS will designate a qualified individual (Field Instructor) to coordinate each student's learning experience and supervise him or her throughout the program. The Field Instructor will use this program as an opportunity to lead students to a personal

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understanding of the responsibilities and rewards of professional social work practice.
